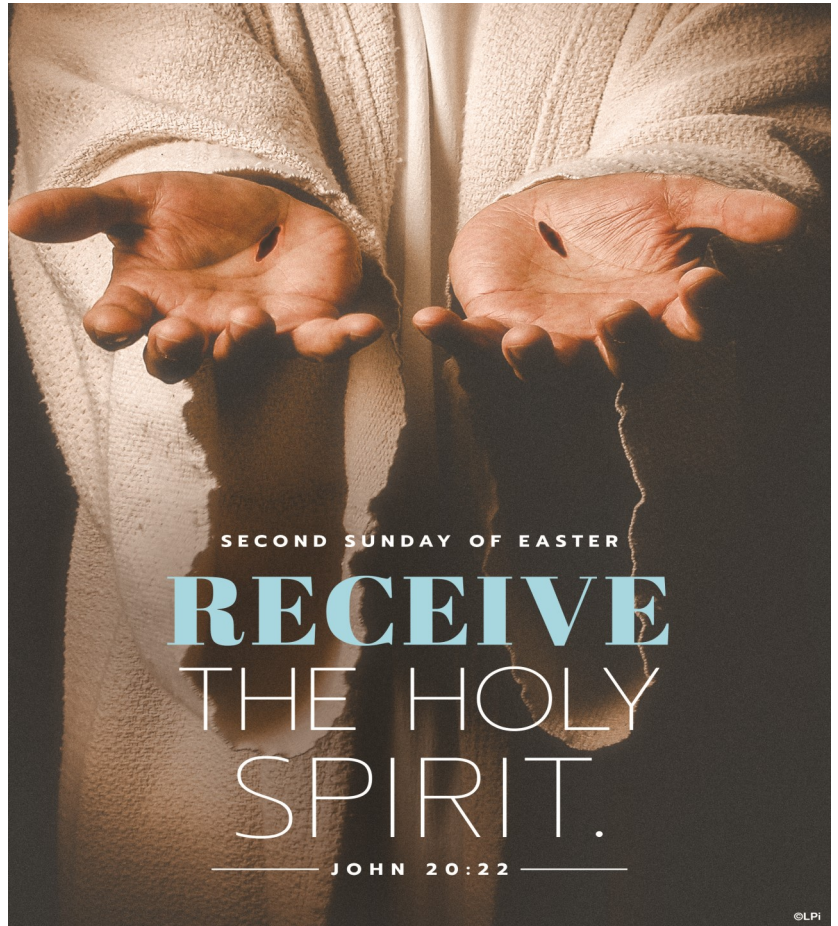

## MYSTERIUM FIDEI ENCYCLICAL OF POPE PAUL VI ON THE HOLY EUCHARIST

SEPTEMBER 3, 1965

### ON THE WORSHIP OF Latria

56. The Catholic Church has always displayed and still displays this latria that ought to be paid to the Sacrament of the Eucharist, both during Mass and outside of it, by taking the greatest possible care of consecrated Hosts, by exposing them to the solemn veneration of the faithful, and by carrying them about in processions to the joy of great numbers of the people.

57. The ancient documents of the Church offer many evidences of this veneration. The bishops of the Church always urged the faithful to take the greatest possible care of the Eucharist that they had in their homes. "The Body of Christ is meant to be eaten by the faithful, not to be treated with irreverence," is the serious warning of St. Hippolytus. (61)

58. In fact, the faithful regarded themselves as guilty, and rightly so as Origen recalls, if, after they had received the body of the Lord and kept it with all reverence and caution, some part of it were to fall to the ground through negligence. (62)

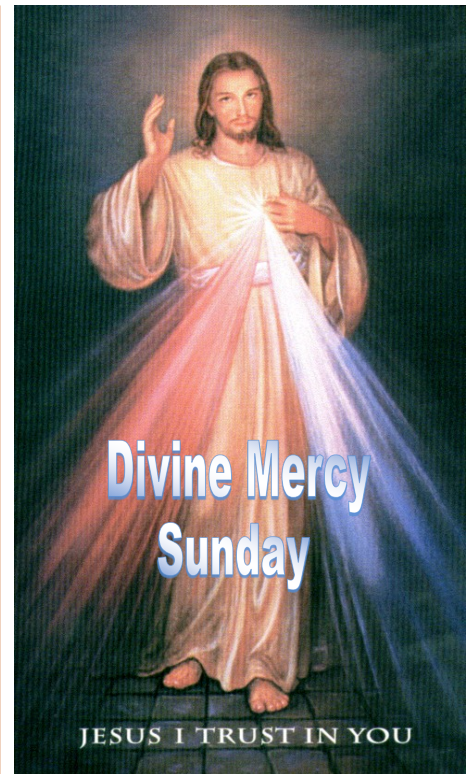

In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun, [St. Faustina Kowalska] began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world. Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come.”

### **URBI ET ORBI MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS EASTER 2024**

*Dear brothers and sisters, Happy Easter!*

Today throughout the world there resounds the message proclaimed two thousand years ago from Jerusalem: "Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified, has been raised!" (*Mk 16:6*).

The Church relives the amazement of the women who went to the tomb at dawn on the first day of the week. The tomb of Jesus had been sealed with a great stone. Today too, great stones, heavy stones, block the hopes of humanity: the stone of war, the stone of humanitarian crises, the stone of human rights violations, the stone of human trafficking, and other stones as well. Like the women disciples of Jesus, we ask one another: "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" (cf. *Mk 16:3*).

This is the amazing discovery of that Easter morning: the stone, the immense stone, was rolled away. The astonishment of the women is our astonishment as well: the tomb of Jesus is open and it is empty! From this, everything begins anew! A new path leads through that empty tomb: the path that none of us, but God alone, could open: the path of life in the midst of death, the path of peace in the midst of war, the path of reconciliation in the midst of hatred, the path of fraternity in the midst of hostility.

Brothers and sisters, Jesus Christ is risen! He alone has the power to roll away the stones that block the path to life. He, the living One, is himself that path. He is the Way: the way that leads to life, the way of peace, reconciliation and fraternity. He opens that path, humanly impossible, because he alone takes away the sin of the world and forgives us our sins.

Jesus alone opens up before us the doors of life, those doors that continually we shut with the wars spreading throughout the world. Today we want, first and foremost, to turn our eyes to the Holy City of Jerusalem, that witnessed the mystery of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, and to all the Christian communities of the Holy Land.

My thoughts go especially to the victims of the many conflicts worldwide, beginning with those in Israel and Palestine, and in Ukraine. May the risen Christ open a path of peace for the war-torn peoples of those regions. In calling for respect for the principles of international law, I express my hope for a general exchange of all prisoners between Russia and Ukraine: all for the sake of all!

I appeal once again that access to humanitarian aid be ensured to Gaza, and call once more for the prompt release of the hostages seized on 7 October last and for an immediate cease-fire in the Strip.

Brothers and sisters, on the day when Christ has set us free from the slavery of death, I appeal to all who have political responsibilities to spare no efforts in combatting the scourge of human trafficking, by working tirelessly to dismantle the networks of exploitation and to bring freedom to those who are their victims. May the Lord comfort their families, above all those who anxiously await news of their loved ones, and ensure them comfort and hope.

May the light of the resurrection illumine our minds and convert our hearts, and make us aware of the value of every human life, which must be welcomed, protected and loved.

## Domingo de la Divina Misericordia

7 de Abril, 2024

### MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Jn 20, 19-31

¿Sabías qué? el segundo domingo del Tiempo Pascual fue designado “Domingo de la Divina Misericordia” por el Papa Juan Pablo II, en el año 2,000 durante la canonización de santa Faustina Kowalska. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en su número 1225, ilumina y catequiza lo que el Papa y santa Faustina nos transmitieron al experimentar la misericordia divina en sus vidas. “En su Pascua, Cristo abrió a todos los hombres las fuentes del Bautismo. En efecto, había hablado ya de su pasión que iba a sufrir en Jerusalén como de un Bautismo con que debía ser bautizado. La sangre y el agua que brotaron del costado traspasado de Jesús crucificado son figuras del Bautismo y de la Eucaristía, sacramentos de la vida nueva: desde entonces, es posible nacer del agua y del Espíritu para entrar en el Reino de Dios”. Santa Faustina al pintar el retrato del Señor de la Misericordia nos muestra esta imagen de la misericordia de Cristo Crucificado dada a nosotros por el Bautismo y la Eucaristía.

El Papa Francisco, también, nos lo explica de la siguiente manera: “La misericordia a la luz de la Pascua se deja percibir como una verdadera forma de conocimiento. Se conoce a través de los sentidos, se conoce a través de la intuición, a través de la razón y aún de otras formas. Bien, se puede conocer también a través de la experiencia de la misericordia, porque la misericordia abre la puerta de la mente para comprender mejor el misterio de Dios y de nuestra experiencia personal (16 de abril del 2023).

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**MENSAJE URBI ET ORBI  
DEL SANTO PADRE FRANCISCO  
PASCUA 2024**

Queridos hermanos y hermanas: ¡Feliz Pascua!

Hoy resuena en todo el mundo el anuncio que salió hace dos mil años desde Jerusalén: “Jesús Nazareno, el Crucificado, ha resucitado” (cf. Mc 16,6).

La Iglesia revive el asombro de las mujeres que fueron al sepulcro al amanecer del primer día de la semana. La tumba de Jesús había sido cerrada con una gran piedra; y así también hoy hay rocas pesadas, demasiado pesadas, que cierran las esperanzas de la humanidad: la roca de la guerra, la roca de las crisis humanitarias, la roca de las violaciones de los derechos humanos, la roca del tráfico de personas, y otras más. También nosotros, como las mujeres discípulas de Jesús, nos preguntamos unos a otros: “¿Quién nos correrá estas piedras?” (cf. Mc 16,3).

Hermanos y hermanas, Jesucristo ha resucitado, y sólo Él es capaz de quitar las piedras que cierran el camino hacia la vida. Más aún, Él mismo, el Viviente, es el Camino; el Camino de la vida, de la paz, de la reconciliación, de la fraternidad. Que el Señor consuele a sus familias, sobre todo a las que esperan ansiosamente noticias de sus seres queridos, asegurándoles conforto y esperanza. Que la luz de la resurrección ilumine nuestras mentes y convierta nuestros corazones, haciéndonos conscientes del valor de toda vida humana, que debe ser acogida, protegida y amada.

**El memorial sacrificial de Cristo y de su Cuerpo, que es la Iglesia**

**1364** El memorial recibe un sentido nuevo en el Nuevo Testamento. Cuando la Iglesia celebra la Eucaristía, hace memoria de la Pascua de Cristo y ésta se hace presente: el sacrificio que Cristo ofreció de una vez para siempre en la cruz, permanece siempre actual (cf *Hb 7,25-27*): «Cuántas veces se renueva en el altar el sacrificio de la cruz, en el que "Cristo, nuestra Pascua, fue inmolado" (*1Co 5, 7*), se realiza la obra de nuestra redención» (LG 3).
