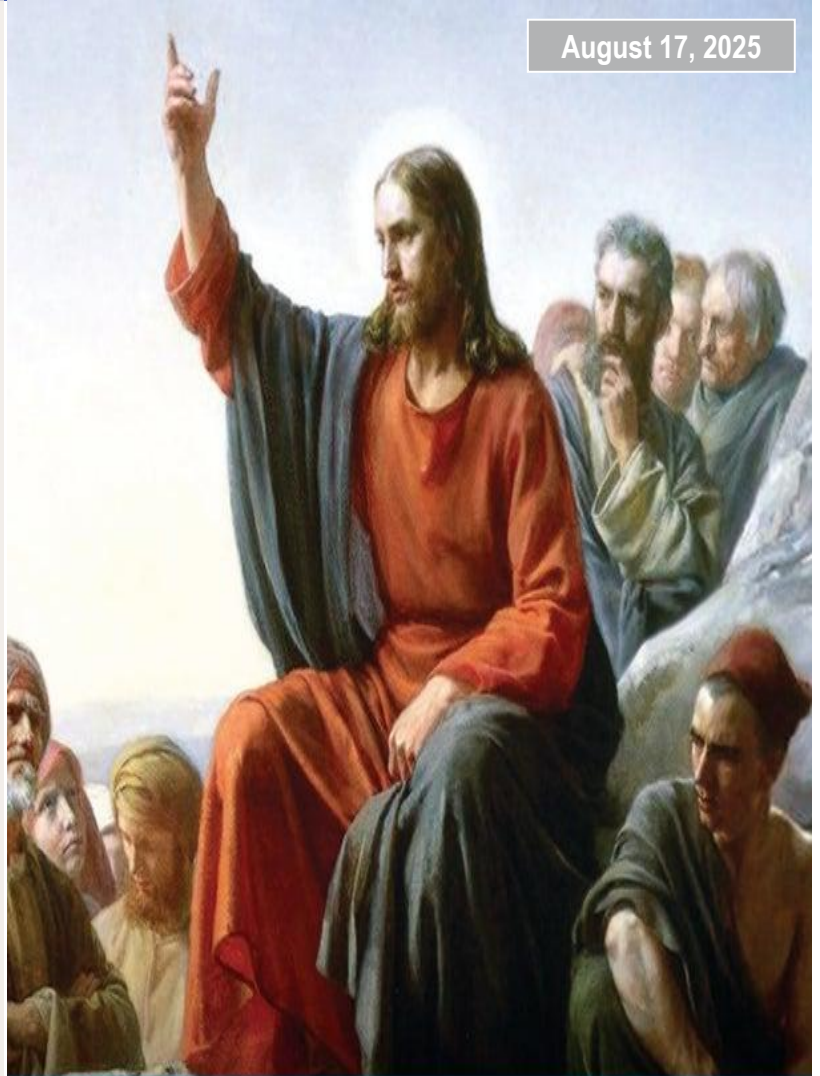

## ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

This past Friday, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary. This is one of those super Catholic things. We believe that Mary did not experience the usual corruption of her body that normally begins at the point when a person dies. Instead, at that moment, she was taken up to Heaven and immediately began her life in a glorified body.

Another super Catholic thing about this past Friday is that it was one of those “Holy Days of Obligation.” All Catholics are required to attend Mass for the Solemnity of the Assumption, and on all Sundays and other Holy Days of obligation, unless they have a serious reason preventing them from doing so. Serious reasons would include things like a bad illness, a lack of transportation or dangerous driving conditions, and, at times, unavoidable work requirements (though, due to more recent sensitivities towards religious beliefs in our country, one can often obtain permission to miss work for days like this even when working at a secular institution).

Believe it or not, there is no other Christian church that “requires” its members to attend services on one or another day. Just us Catholics do that sort of thing. Why so? Well, it is similar to the reason why good parents require their children to eat their vegetables, do their homework, finish their chores before they get to play video games, and pick their dirty socks up off of their bedroom floor. When it comes to the good things that we all should do, it is very helpful to have someone “obligating” us to do them as we grow up because we are, at least at times, far too weak to motivate ourselves.

For example, this past week, I was so blessed to have a young adult shadowing me. He is discerning the priesthood and decided to spend the week with me just to get a better idea of what priests do on a daily basis. I told him that we would start each morning with an hour of Adoration in the church followed by roughly an hour of exercise at the gym. Of course, I did not tell him that, on an average day, I myself do not succeed in getting up on time to pray at 6:45AM and then make it to the gym right afterwards! However, since I had the obligation to make sure that Adoration was ready at 6:45AM for both him and I, I made it to Adoration and the gym every day this week without fail! Obligations are very good for us!

As God’s children, He has the right to obligate us to do certain things. We have to pray, to follow His commandments, and, yes, we even have to come to Church on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. Although these things seem like limits to our freedom, they are actually the means by which we learn how to be truly free by choosing what is actually good for us. As we grow more spiritually mature, the obligations become less important because we find ourselves naturally willing to go above and beyond the simple obligations he gives us. However, they are essential while we are young in our faith.

So, perhaps you don’t like eating your vegetables, doing your homework, finishing your chores before you play video games or picking up your dirty socks. Welcome to the club! We are weak and we need good obligations from loving parents if we ever hope to be holy. The same goes for our faith. Let God make you into a Saint with His perfect obligations!

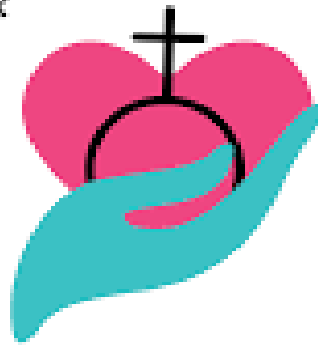
