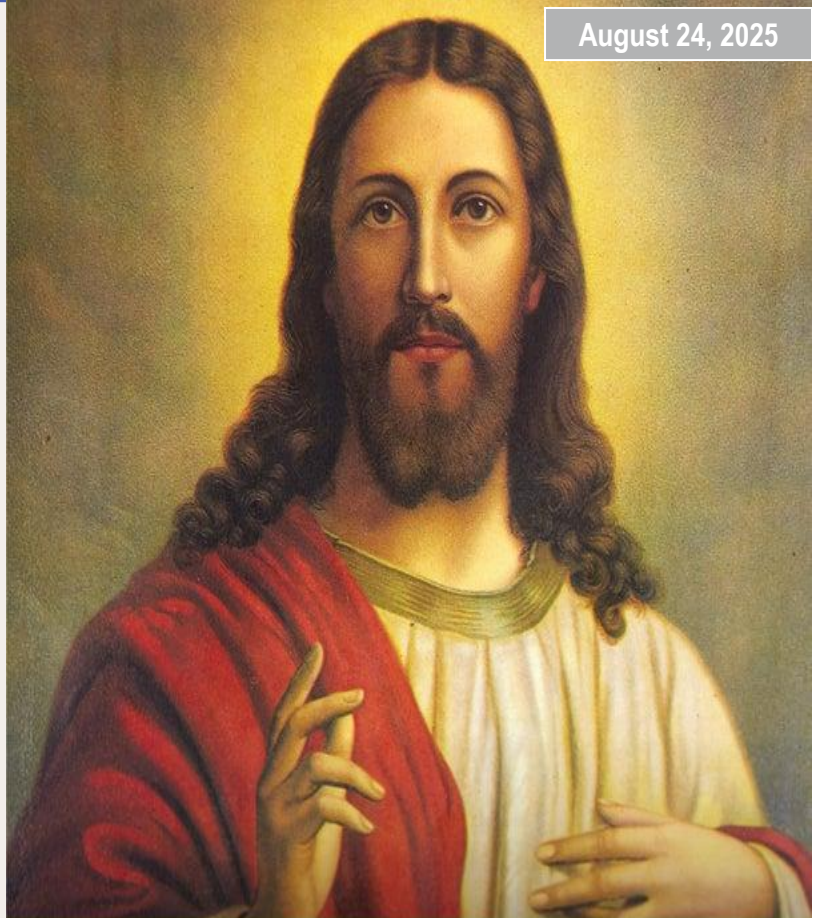

ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

I am writing to you on Wednesday, Aug. 20th, the Feast Day of St. Bernard of Clairvaux (pronounced clare-vough). He was a twelfth-century Cistercian monk. On the Feast Days of Saints, priests will often read a short selection from one of the Saint's writings as a part of our morning prayer time to help us get into the spirit of the day and, for me, today's selection from St. Bernard's writings was quite moving.

We read a bit of a sermon he gave on the virtue of love. After describing how great God's love is for us, he points out that we may feel bad because our love for God is so much less than His love for us. St. Bernard says, "It is true that the creature loves less because she is less. But if she loves with her whole being, nothing is lacking where everything is given."

That line is so powerful and so encouraging for weak sinners like me who are trying to serve God, but so often find ourselves being unfaithful or at least accomplishing far less than we would have hoped. "Nothing is lacking where everything is given," he says because, although we can never match God's love, or even come close, we can, even in our weakness, give God everything we have at this present moment in time. When we give Him everything, though it be so little, we can truly say that there is nothing lacking in our love for God.

Thankfully, this is all God asks of us. He just wants everything that we can give Him right now. Maybe we are having a bad day and even the little we usually have is gone so that all we can do is cry out to him in our anger and frustration. This is one way that we can give "everything" to God even in our worse moments. On other days, we might feel like we are just going through the motions. Giving everything to God on these days might mean doing our best to make it through, and being honest with Him about how tired we are. And yet, on other days, we might be feeling stronger than usual, but nothing we do turns out the way we would like. Giving everything to God on these days might mean trusting Him regardless of how things appear on the outside.

So, do you feel like you don't have much to offer or like your offering is not as good as it should be? Maybe it is all you can do to make it out of bed, say a Rosary, and call a family member or two before you run out of energy with the other duties you must attend to. Good job! You are giving everything to God and He will bring good out of even the little you offer! Or maybe your plans keep falling apart and nothing seems to be as successful as you want even though you are doing everything you can. Good job! You too are giving everything to God and He will surely bring good out of even the most seemingly unsuccessful things you do!

There are, of course, times when our troubles are due to our selfishness or laziness. In these cases, we must be firm with ourselves. We must go to Confession and Communion regularly to strengthen ourselves against these and other vices. However, at other times, we might very well be giving God everything we can. When this is the case, don't lose hope! Your love might not be as great as you would like it to be, but it is as great as you are capable of now and God is very pleased by it. If we all persevere in giving God everything we have, then "there is nothing lacking in our love for God" as St. Bernard tells us!

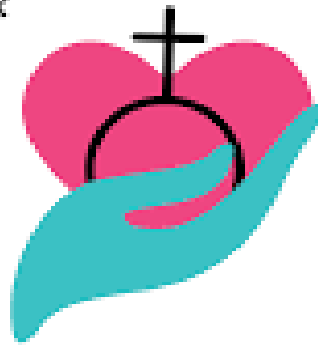
