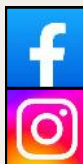

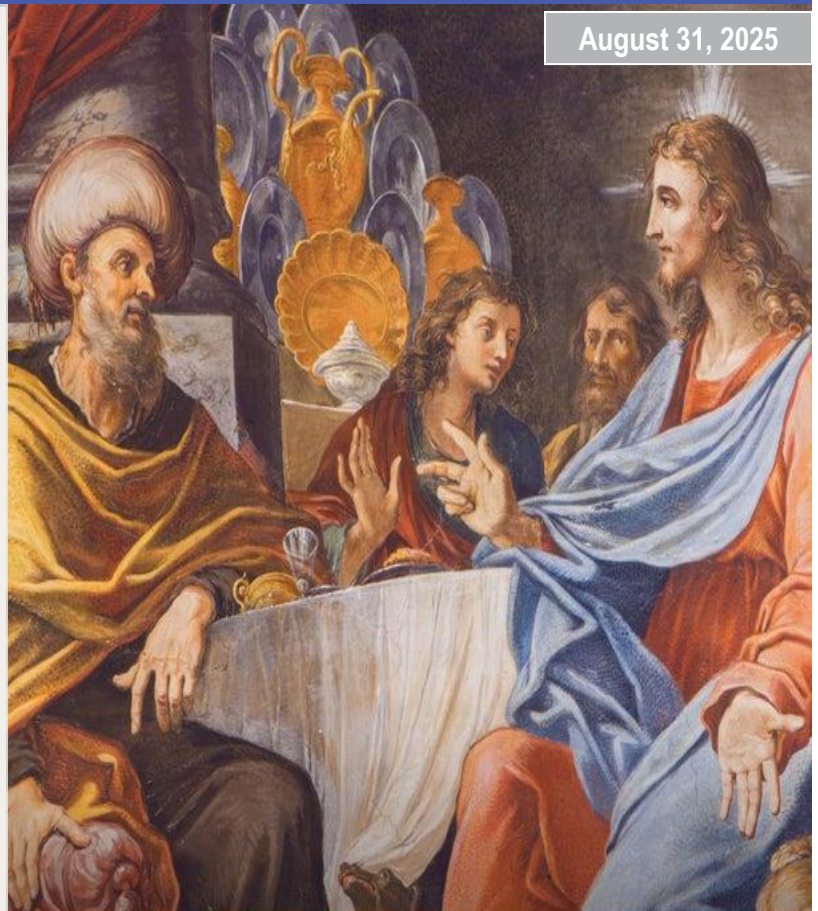

ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

A letter from our new Director of Religious Education, Caleb Kobman,



Dear St. Agnes,

I would like to thank you for welcoming me to the parish last weekend. It truly is a blessing to be in a community so dedicated to Christ. That dedication is shown not only in the beautiful liturgy at St. Agnes and her various ministries I continue to learn about, but most importantly in the Christian charity shown in the lives of you—her parishioners.

As I will be out of town this weekend, Father Szabo has asked me to further introduce myself in place of his usual letter to the parish. I hope that this letter will suffice until I am blessed to further get to know the parish of St. Agnes.

Born to a Catholic military family in Northern Kentucky, two things could always be counted on: we would move every few years and we went to Mass on Sundays. Though I can count on my hands the number of times I missed Sunday Mass, I didn't truly embrace my faith until my sophomore year of high school. By then, I was the oldest of six and struggling with the isolation caused by the lockdowns of the Covid-19 pandemic. While I never rejected Christ and His Church, I had no intention of knowing Him or following the path He set for me. Luckily for me, when I returned to school I met a new group of extremely faithful friends. They showed me the fruit which comes from fully living a Catholic life in community.

With this strong base of friends, I began to take on leadership roles both in and outside of school. In junior and senior year, I led the campus ministry club as well as assisted in the leadership of a parish youth group and diocesan wide retreat team. I also was blessed to help as a substitute teacher for some of the middle school classes during my free periods. Through these experiences, I discovered what I still believe is a calling toward what Pope St. John Paul II the Great called the New (or Lay) Evangelization.

Hopeful to continue this pursuit, I went to Christendom College after graduation to study Theology and Philosophy. Though I loved the education and faith-forming culture of the school, I realized that I needed to be more involved in education and evangelization than college life permitted. Hoping to further understand this call, I served as a counselor at Camp Carlo this summer. I was able to experience the devotion and overall sense of life in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston while being extremely joyful to be able to serve the next generation of West Virginia Catholics. At Camp Carlo, I was also blessed to meet Father Szabo and, when I heard that he was hiring a DRE, I felt called to apply for and then accept the position.

I ask that you pray for me as I embark upon this new leg in my journey and know that I will be praying for the continued growth and Christ-centeredness of my new parish.

FIRST COMMUNION, CONFIRMATION & OCIA

If you know anyone who is at least 6 years old and has not received their First Holy Communion, please encourage them to sign up for the First Communion Class. Anyone in 8th grade or above who has not yet been confirmed, encourage them to sign up for the Confirmation Class. Lastly, for anyone interested in becoming Catholic, or who just wants to learn more about the faith, check out our OCIA classes. Classes all start on Sunday, September 7th at 9:15AM and continue weekly at the same time. First Communion class is held in the church in the Atrium room (to the left of the altar). Confirmation and OCIA are down in the parish office. Sign-up sheets are in the main narthex, or you can email the parish office. Thank you!

ST. AGNES TO-DO LIST

Perhaps you have wondered before, “What can I do to help around the church?” Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can’t say that I’ll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me (pszabo@dwc.org) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!

Bulletin Advertisements: We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

Weed Trimming: If you know how to run a trimmer (or as we call them back home a “weed-wacker”) we would love your help with the trimming around the church. We have a generous parishioner who is cutting the lawn each week, but it is just too much for him to also go around the buildings, fences, trees, etc. and trim along the edges of things. Let us know if you can help with this!

Stick Collection: Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

Garden Maintenance: The gardens around the church, rectory, and office are improving with the TLC being received. If you have a green thumb, or can at least distinguish between weeds and flowers, please feel free to come by for any amount of time to help maintain the many gardens that we have around the parish!

Plumbing: A number of faucets are leaking in one way or another, or doing things really old plumbing does. If you know how to do this sort of thing, let me know! We could use a hand replacing a number of old faucets!

Lighting: One of our parking lot street lamps is out as well as one of the smaller lamps that lights up the walkway over from the parking lot the church. If you are good at changing light bulbs in these very unusual locations, please let us know!

FR. SZABO’S WISH LIST

Holy Water Fonts (2 at \$500 each): I’ve noticed that not many people take the time to dip their hands into our large holy water font and cross themselves as they enter and exit the church. Part of this may be because the habit has never formed, but I can also see that part of the reason is because it is inconvenient. If you are leaving with the crowd after Mass, it can sometimes be challenging to get close enough to it as everyone from the center aisle moves around it. Also, if you are used to entering or exiting the side aisles, your walking path never takes you close enough to the font to reach it. Therefore, I would like to get a nice set of marble, wall-mounted holy water fonts that can be placed on the wall by the doors that go from the vestibule into the sanctuary. Most churches have holy water fonts in these locations anyway for easier access. I found the pictured antique fonts on Ebay. They are 18 1/4 inches tall and 15 inches wide which is plenty large for the number of folks that can fit into St. Agnes. If you would be interested in donating these to the church, let us know!



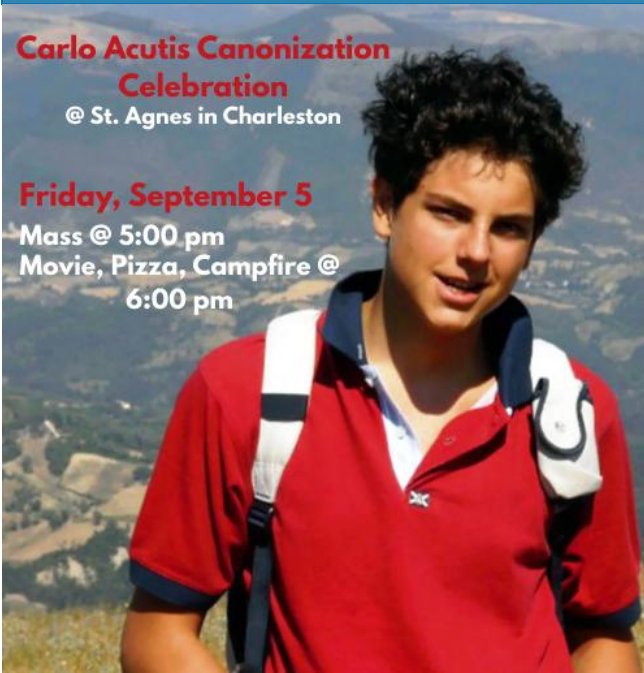
Door Closers (\$1532.60): The side doors in the vestibule of the church are fully functional again thanks to John’s Lock and Key who did the work of installing them. However, I realize now that I forgot something rather important. They don’t have door closers on them! They swing open and closed nicely, but they do NOT automatically close like they should as a high traffic church door. If you would like to contribute toward the cost of installing door closers, your gift would be most appreciated!
