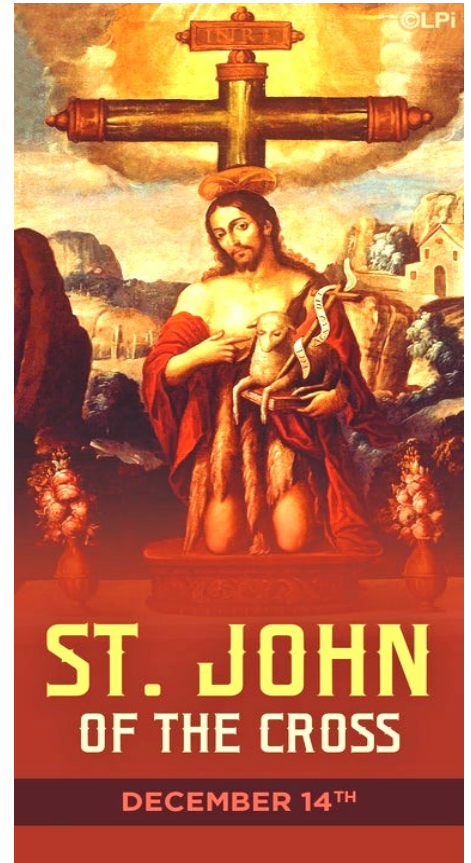

Re-enactment at Heart of Doctrine

28. just as Moses made the Old Testament sacred with the blood of calves, (13) so too Christ the Lord took the New Testament, of which He is the Mediator, and made it sacred through His own blood, in instituting the mystery of the Eucharist. For, as the Evangelists narrate, at the Last Supper "he took bread, and blessed and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, This is my body, given for you; do this for a commemoration of me. And so with the cup, when supper was ended, This cup, he said, is the new testament, in my Blood which is to be shed for you." (14) And by bidding the Apostles to do this in memory of Him, He made clear that He wanted it to be forever repeated. This intention of Christ was faithfully carried out by the primitive Church through her adherence to the teaching of the Apostles and through her gatherings to celebrate the Eucharistic Sacrifice. As St. Luke is careful to point out, "They occupied themselves continually with the Apostles' teaching, their fellowship in the breaking of bread, and the fixed times of prayer." (15) The faithful used to derive such spiritual fervor from this practice that it was said of them that "there was one heart and soul in all the company of the believers." (16)

Dec. 14 is the liturgical memorial of Saint John of the Cross. He is honored as a Doctor of the Church. The youngest child of parents in the silk-weaving trade, John de Yepes was born in 1542 near the Spanish city of Avila. His father Gonzalo died at a relatively young age, and his mother Catalina struggled to provide for the family. After discerning a calling to monastic life, John entered the Carmelite Order in 1563. John received ordination as a priest in 1567. He spent five years as the confessor at a monastery in Avila led by St. Teresa. He died in the early hours of Dec. 14, 1591, nine years after St. Teresa of Avila's death. Only near the end of his life had St. John's monastic superior recognized his wisdom and holiness. He was beatified in 1675, canonized in 1726, and named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XI.

We like to think we are totally free, but the bitter truth is we simply are not. Or better put, our freedom is limited on every side — by governments, corporate giants, physical and mental frailties, genetic shortcomings, and even the boundaries of time and space, and above all, the burden of our sins and pending deaths. In our day, we are perhaps particularly aware that we are not free to disconnect from the technocratic rulers of the air. If you doubt me, try not paying your internet bill and see what happens. We are not totally free. It's nothing new, of course. In Jesus' day, everyone felt the crushing weight of the Roman Empire. You can say you're free all you want. But try not paying your taxes to Rome and see what happens. Once we feel this burden in our own lives — however it comes — we are ready to hear the stunning announcement that commences Mark's gospel, "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." The word "gospel" was a political, even military, term. It meant: a great victory has been won and a new king is in charge. This Jesus — not the Roman emperor — is God's son, and he has defeated all that crushes human freedom. It's time to follow him and be truly free. This week let's refuse to submit our freedom to false rulers — especially that of sin. And let's rejoice that Christ is coming to make us perfectly free from all our oppressors.

IN BRIEF

1277 Baptism is birth into the new life in Christ. In accordance with the Lord's will, it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter by Baptism.

1278 The essential rite of Baptism consists in immersing the candidate in water or pouring water on his head, while pronouncing the invocation of the Most Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

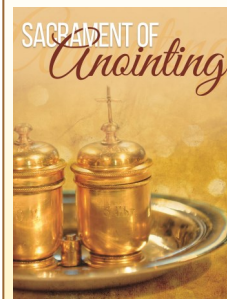

enderecen sus senderos” –Mc 1, 3

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mc 1, 1-8

El evangelista Marcos inicia su Evangelio con una exigencia de preparación, del cumplimiento de la Sagrada Escritura en Jesús y la invitación de Juan Bautista a la conversión: “Mira, te voy a enviar a mi mensajero delante de ti para que te prepare el camino. Escuchen ese grito en el desierto: *Preparen el camino del Señor, enderecen sus senderos*” (Marcos 1,2-3). Sin embargo, esa llegada suya requiere de nosotros una conversión verdadera desde el fondo del corazón. Salir en busca de lo novedoso, como el pueblo que seguía a Juan Bautista, implica movimiento y apertura. ¿Qué pide este pasaje del Evangelio de nuestra parte? ¿Qué cambios haré en este Adviento que ayude a mejorar mi relación con los que me rodean?

Otro elemento importante, en este segundo Domingo de Adviento, es lo que el Profeta Isaías nos indica con referencia a consolar a los que sufren. El deber de consolar lo experimentamos muy fuerte en el tiempo de la pandemia. ¿Lo recuerdas? El sufrimiento obliga a estar cerca del otro y anima a tener esperanza y a vivir más conscientes de las necesidades de nuestro prójimo. “*Consuelen, dice Yavé, tu Dios, consuelen a mi pueblo*” (Isaías 40,1). Entonces, comencemos, no esperemos sentados, llevemos consuelo y esperanza a nuestro alrededor. Enderecemos los caminos, las curvas que evitan llegar al Señor, para que su ternura baje del cielo y se pose en cada persona y así germine la justicia y la fidelidad. ¡Ven Señor!

CAPÍTULO IV A MÍ ME LO HICISTEIS POR UNA NUEVA CULTURA DE LA VIDA HUMANA

« Vosotros sois el pueblo adquirido por Dios para anunciar sus alabanzas » (cf. 1 P 2, 9): el pueblo de la vida y para la vida.

79. Somos el pueblo de la vida porque Dios, en su amor gratuito, nos ha dado el Evangelio de la vida y hemos sido transformados y salvados por este mismo Evangelio. Hemos sido redimidos por el « autor de la vida » (Hch 3, 15) a precio de su preciosa sangre (cf. 1 Cor 6, 20; 7, 23; 1 P 1, 19) y mediante el baño bautismal hemos sido injertados en El (cf. Rm 6, 4-5; Col 2, 12), como ramas que reciben savia y fecundidad del árbol único (cf. Jn 15, 5). Renovados interiormente por la gracia del Espíritu, « que es Señor y da la vida », hemos llegado a ser un pueblo para la vida y estamos llamados a comportarnos como tal.
