The Presentation of the Lord, (40 days after Christmas), commemorates Mary & Joseph presenting Jesus at the Temple in Jerusalem, fulfilling Jewish law for purification & dedicating the firstborn son to God, marking the first time the infant Christ was revealed to the world & is also known as Candlemas, featuring blessed candles.

Ash Wednesday - March 18, 2026

Mass at 7:00am, 12:00pm & 5:00pm
Ashes distributed during Mass.

Ash Wednesday is observed by fasting, abstinence from meat, which begins at age 14 according to canon law 1252, & repentance. On Ash Wednesday & Good Friday, Roman Catholics between 18 - 59 (whose health enables them to fast) are permitted to consume one full meal, along with two smaller meals, which together should not equal the full meal. Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are also days of abstinence from meat (mammals & fowl), as are all Fridays during Lent. .

ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

Since the storm kept so many from attending Mass this past weekend, I am sharing the same bulletin article this week because of how important this message is. For the few who already read it, enjoy the week off from reading my article!

Dear St. Agnes, two weeks ago, I was blessed to gather together with people from across our nation to march through the streets of our capital on behalf of the countless women and unborn children who are denied the basic love and support needed for life. Innumerable women today are suffering silently beneath the weight of a male-dominated, money-driven culture, that all but forces them to measure their beauty and worth according to hedonistic and materialistic values. Abortion rights are just one side effect of this, but it's the worst by far.

One might rightly wonder, "But, don't women want abortion rights? And, what about young girls who are abused?" These are excellent questions, but ones that often do not seriously consider the woman and child involved. Consider, for example, a young girl who is abused and becomes pregnant. Our hearts are rightly broken as we bear this suffering with her, but encouraging or enabling her to get an abortion fails to consider the future desires of this young lady, and completely ignores the interests of the unborn child. How many young women end up regretting their abortions later in life? This number, of course, will never be known because of how sensitive this subject is, but would it not be at least close to the number of women who, in their later years, wish that they had been blessed with more children to care for them and grandchildren to play with? The numerous testimonies of regretful women found in books and recorded on YouTube seem to suggest that this inference is not far-fetched. Read or watch one of these testimonies if you haven't before and you will see what I mean.

Now, let us consider the interests of the unborn child. How many children conceived in violence are sorry that they were given the chance to live? This number indeed can be known more easily. A simple search on YouTube will reveal that nobody conceived in violence wishes that he or she had not been given the chance to live. In fact, they, along with women who regret their abortions, are working harder than anyone else to advocate on behalf of those who still have the chance to avoid the grave mistake of aborting their child.

The Catholic Church's stance on abortion is yet another reason why I am so proud to be Catholic. The Catechism tells us, "From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person – among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life" (CCC 2270). As Catholics, our belief on this issue is as clear as day. We must be Pro-Life, and this means taking care of mothers, children, and families at all stages of life. We must help them make the right decision when an unexpected pregnancy occurs AND we must help them raise their children to be holy men and women who can help us create a world where abortion is no longer even thinkable.

This is why family ministries are so important to me as the administrator of St. Agnes parish. We need to create an environment here that is truly Pro-Life in every way. Thanks to all of you who help make this possible! I am hopeful for the future that our parish will be able to support more and more of the needy women and children right here in our community.

Vitals & Virtues

Hello Dear Fellow Parishioners!

My name is Daniel and I'm an RN. Father has asked me to chime in here regularly to offer useful healthcare advice to our parish members. Over the next few weeks, I am going to address subjects related to the present flu season, a dangerous one. The flu going around, Influenza A (H3N2) is not fully covered by the current vaccination. The associated hospitalization and death rates are significantly above average. Most at risk are the very young, the elderly and those with chronic health problems such as diabetes, asthma and COPD. Those with compromised immune systems are also at higher risk. In this category are patients under-

going cancer treatment, with HIV infection or taking an immune modulator. Here I'll be talking about correct use of hand gel, masks and other pertinent topics. For now, I'll only say that if you haven't received a flu shot, please consult with your healthcare provider as to its advisability for you.

ST. AGNES TO-DO LIST

Perhaps you have wondered before, “What can I do to help around the church?” Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can’t say that I’ll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me (pszabo@dwc.org) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!

Routine Kneeler Maintenance: Perhaps you have wobbled around a little more than you would like when kneeling down at Mass here at St. Agnes. I certainly have! Almost all of the kneelers need to have their screws tightened down, or replaced altogether. If you have some basic carpentry skills, an impact drill, and you don't mind measuring carefully to make sure that the screws you use don't poke up through the kneeler pads, then please reach out to me! I'm currently working on fixing the pew seats that are slowly coming apart, and I'd be very glad to hear that someone had already fixed the kneelers by the time I finish! Thank you! Fr. Szabo

Bulletin Advertisements: We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

Stick Collection: Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

Painting Stairs by Old Convent: The metal stairway leading up to the lower entrance into the old convent is in rough shape. You can tell that it was last painted black, but the green, and other colored paints from the past, are showing through. This will take some time to scrape and repaint. Let us know if you can help.

Phone Call Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a phone call ministry to homebound parishioners. This person would help connect interested volunteers with homebound parishioners who would appreciate a phone call on a regular basis. This ministry would also reach out occasionally to people who are listed as our parishioners, but no longer attend Mass to see if they are in need of any help. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry.

Rides to Mass Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a group that is willing to help bring people to and from Mass that are unable to drive themselves, or who do not have a car. At times, these volunteers may also help people get to and from doctors appointments and other places that they cannot usually get to themselves. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry!
