The Solemnity of St. Agnes, celebrated on **January 21st**, honors St. Agnes of Rome, a young, early Christian virgin martyr known for her profound faith, chastity, and courage in refusing to renounce Christ, even unto death around 304 AD. She is the patron saint of young girls, chastity, and rape survivors, often depicted with a lamb (symbolizing her purity, as *agnus* means lamb in Latin) and a palm branch (symbolizing martyrdom). A unique tradition involves the Pope blessing two lambs on her feast day, whose wool is then woven into the palliums given to archbishops.

## ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

Last week, we celebrated the funeral of Maria Roberts, a beloved parishioner of St. Agnes for many years. Before her funeral, I was greatly blessed to be given an old Rosary of hers that is very well worn with age and use, and it's even missing some beads. I was told that she used to pray the Rosary every day; a fact that was very easy to believe considering the condition of the Rosary, but also because of the ease with which Maria said her prayers each time we came to visit her. Even on her worst days, when she couldn't seem to hear us or didn't seem to have the strength to respond, her lips would always start moving when we began to pray the Our Father or the Hail Mary, and you could hear her faint voice following along with us. These prayers were so familiar to her that she could say them with us even when other forms of communication had become impossible. What an incredible witness to the power of prayer!

This brings me to the point of my article this week. The Rosary is a vocal prayer that, when mastered, does not require any mental effort at all. Sometimes folks make fun of the Rosary saying that it is nothing more than the "vain repetitions" that Jesus warns us about in Matthew's Gospel (6:7). However, while it is certainly problematic to say that God values our prayers more when we use more words, it is also problematic to say that repeating short and simple phrases from Scripture over and over again has no value to it. After all, as a good Jew, our Lord Jesus Himself would have recited the Psalms over and over again during his weekly prayers. God values our faithfulness, not our creativity.

There is also something else that happens when we get to the point where we are so familiar with the prayers of the Rosary that they no longer require any mental effort to say them, and it is something even more fascinating than my story about Maria. Repeating the same prayers over and over again can bring our minds and hearts into a place where vocal prayer gives way to mental prayer. The slow, rhythmic repetition of the Our Fathers, Hail Mary's, and Glory Be prayers during the Rosary helps our minds to focus more on the particular mystery we are meditating upon, the issues we are trying to work through with Jesus, or the people we are praying for. Many of you reading this probably know what I am talking about. The Rosary is the Christian version of a mantra prayer.

However, some of you may not have experienced this phenomenon yet, and so I hope that I have piqued your interest. As boring as the Rosary seems sometimes (and believe me, I've been there before!), the Rosary is worth saying every day until it becomes second nature. Not only does this help us give time to God every day, but it prepares our hearts for meditation, and it can even keep us focused on God up until the last moments of our life when all our other faculties have failed us. And so I encourage you, as Mary always tells us in her apparitions, "Pray the Rosary!"

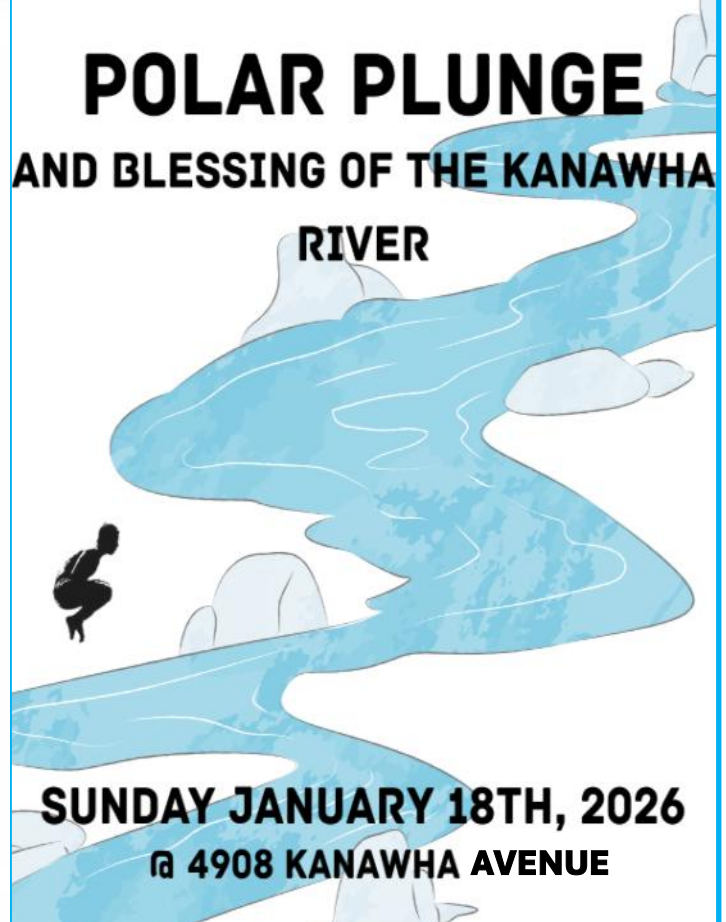

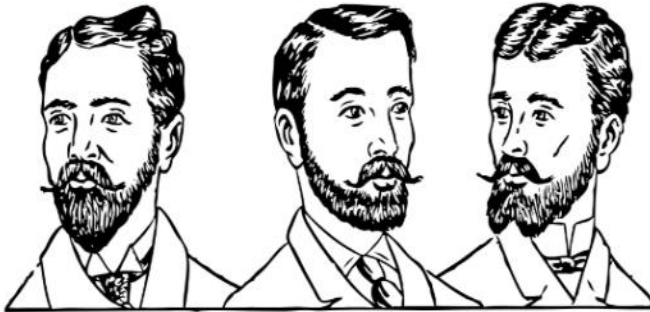

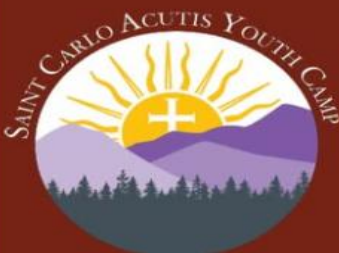

## ST. AGNES TO-DO LIST

*Perhaps you have wondered before, "What can I do to help around the church?" Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can't say that I'll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me ([pszabo@dwc.org](mailto:pszabo@dwc.org)) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!*

**Routine Kneeler Maintenance:** Perhaps you have wobbled around a little more than you would like when kneeling down at Mass here at St. Agnes. I certainly have! Almost all of the kneelers need to have their screws tightened down, or replaced altogether. If you have some basic carpentry skills, an impact drill, and you don't mind measuring carefully to make sure that the screws you use don't poke up through the kneeler pads, then please reach out to me! I'm currently working on fixing the pew seats that are slowly coming apart, and I'd be very glad to hear that someone had already fixed the kneelers by the time I finish! Thank you! Fr. Szabo

**Bulletin Advertisements:** We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

**Stick Collection:** Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

**Painting Stairs by Old Convent:** The metal stairway leading up to the lower entrance into the old convent is in rough shape. You can tell that it was last painted black, but the green, and other colored paints from the past, are showing through. This will take some time to scrape and repaint. Let us know if you can help.

**Phone Call Ministry:** We are looking for a volunteer to organize a phone call ministry to homebound parishioners. This person would help connect interested volunteers with homebound parishioners who would appreciate a phone call on a regular basis. This ministry would also reach out occasionally to people who are listed as our parishioners, but no longer attend Mass to see if they are in need of any help. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry.

**Rides to Mass Ministry:** We are looking for a volunteer to organize a group that is willing to help bring people to and from Mass that are unable to drive themselves, or who do not have a car. At times, these volunteers may also help people get to and from doctors appointments and other places that they cannot usually get to themselves. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry!

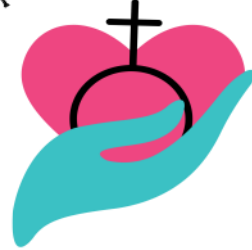

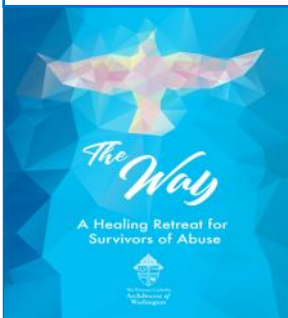
