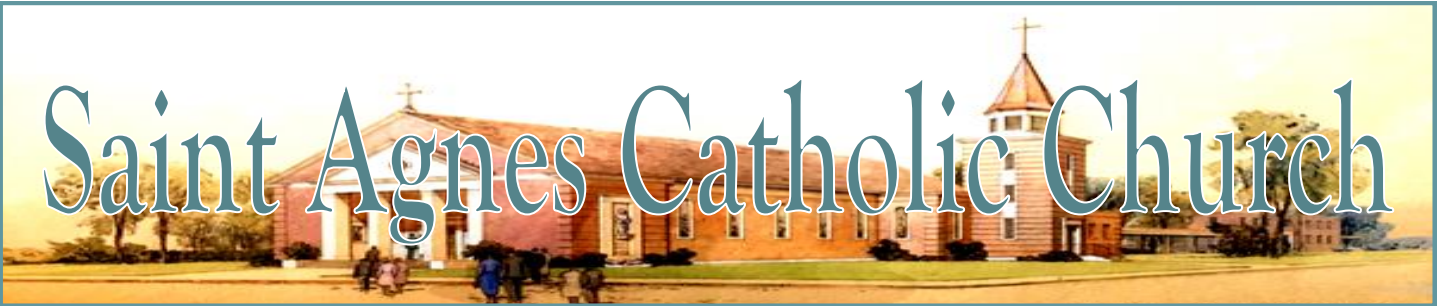

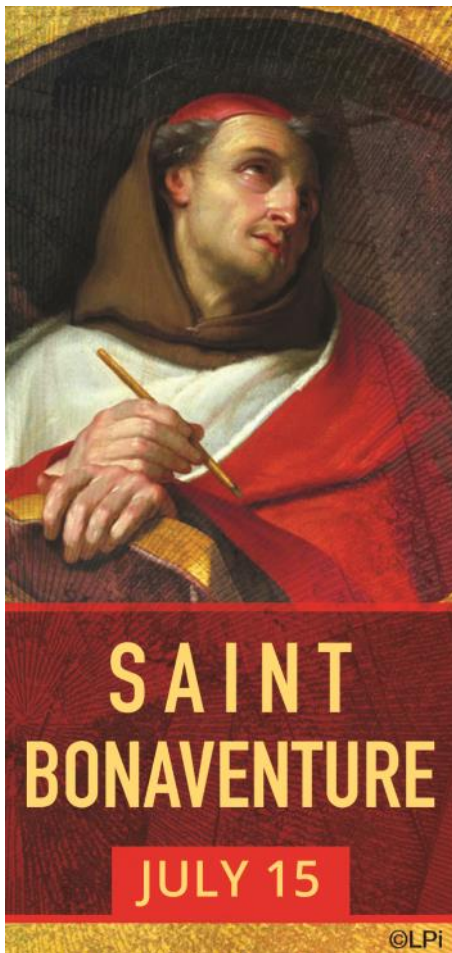

Bonaventure joined the Franciscan Order almost two decades after the passing of St. Francis. Initially, the young man's theological insights earned him a prime faculty position at the University of Paris. More than his academic skill, however, he was known for his deep devotion to Christ. He was elected the General Minister of the Franciscan Order, right in the thick of controversies. Some friars had conflicting views of how to interpret St. Francis' poverty as the order grew. Others started a new heresy, saying that the Franciscan Order began a new era of the Holy Spirit, replacing the era of Jesus and the authority of the Church. St. Bonaventure weathered these crises with grace, restructuring the order when necessary and offering a more organized perspective on the insights of St. Francis.

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## ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF POPE JOHN PAUL II

APRIL 17, 2003

### INTRODUCTION

5. *"Mysterium fidei! - The Mystery of Faith!"*. When the priest recites or chants these words, all present acclaim: "We announce your death, O Lord, and we proclaim your resurrection, until you come in glory". In these or similar words the Church, while pointing to Christ in the mystery of his passion, also reveals her own mystery: Ecclesia de Eucharistia. By the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost the Church was born and set out upon the pathways of the world, yet a decisive moment in her taking shape was certainly the institution of the Eucharist in the Upper Room. Her foundation and wellspring is the whole Triduum paschale, but this is as it were gathered up, foreshadowed and "concentrated" for ever in the gift of the Eucharist. In this gift Jesus Christ entrusted to his Church the perennial making present of the paschal mystery. With it he brought about a mysterious "oneness in time" between that Triduum and the passage of the centuries. The thought of this leads us to profound amazement and gratitude. In the paschal event and the Eucharist which makes it present throughout the centuries, there is a truly enormous "capacity" which embraces all of history as the recipient of the grace of the redemption. This amazement should always fill the Church assembled for the celebration of the Eucharist. But in a special way it should fill the minister of the Eucharist. For it is he who, by the authority given him in the sacrament of priestly ordination, effects the consecration. It is he who says with the power coming to him from Christ in the Upper Room: "This is my body which will be given up for you This is the cup of my blood, poured out for you...". The priest says these words, or rather he puts his voice at the disposal of the One who spoke these words in the Upper Room and who desires that they should be repeated in every generation by all those who in the Church ministerially share in his priesthood.

### WHAT WE CARRY FROM TOWN TO TOWN

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don't. People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave. This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters. What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.

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### 15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### – Meditation –

Once I asked a fallen-away Catholic friend of mine what he remembered about the parish priest from his youth. He said, "He was a gentle, nice guy. Kind of vanilla. Kept to himself." It struck me that he, perhaps like many, perceive Catholic priests as the following: lonely, harmless, and self-sufficient. As a challenge both to this perception (accurate or not) and to us priests who perhaps feel a pull in that uninspiring direction, stands the mighty image of what we see in the Gospel this Sunday. Jesus sent out his apostles, "two-by-two, with power over demons, and without money belts." Two-by-two: they enjoyed deep fellowship and brotherhood. Power over demons: they were anything but harmless. These men wielded enormous power against evil. Without money belts: they were not self-sufficient. They needed others to help them. Not lonely, but in community. Not harmless but armed with massive spiritual energy. Not self-sufficient, but poor and in need of help. This is a challenge to me, and perhaps to all of us, living in a rich, secularized, and individualized culture. Do I embrace my priestly ministry in deep fellowship with other priests? Do I speak and act boldly to drive out evil where it is found? Do I live poorly and simply, trusting in the help of those around me even for basic needs? The fruitfulness of priestly ministry largely depends on these three traits. Let's pray for all priests — and, by extension, all of us Christians — to live more like Jesus' communal, poor, and powerful apostles.

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## CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION

### Article 2 THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

#### V. The Minister of Confirmation

**1312** The original minister of Confirmation is the bishop.<sup>128</sup> In the East, ordinarily the priest who baptizes also immediately confers Confirmation in one and the same celebration. But he does so with sacred chrism consecrated by the patriarch or the bishop, thus expressing the apostolic unity of the Church whose bonds are strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation. In the Latin Church, the same discipline applies to the Baptism of adults or to the reception into full communion with the Church of a person baptized in another Christian community that does not have valid Confirmation.<sup>129</sup>

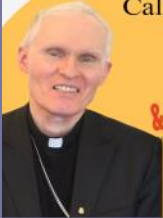

## MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mc 6,7-13

Con frecuencia escuchamos de los sacerdotes de nuestras parroquias o de nuestros padres e inclusive de amigos la siguiente frase: “Confiar siempre en Dios”. Claro que confiamos, cuando nos va bien, cuando tenemos bonanza en nuestra vida. Pero, si llega una enfermedad, si nos quedamos sin trabajo, si muere un ser querido. ¿Confiamos? La respuesta va de acuerdo a nuestra relación personal con Dios, a nuestra fe y confianza que hemos desarrollado en nuestra vida [con] él. Ser fiel y confiar en Dios es contemplar su rostro en cada circunstancia, en cada trago amargo que pasamos y también en las cosas gratas de la familia y comunidad. En el Evangelio de hoy, vemos cómo Jesús envía a sus apóstoles a misión para continuar su obra misionera. **CAPÍTULO IV: A MÍ ME LO HICISTEIS**

« *Te doy gracias por tantas maravillas: prodigio soy* »  
(Sal 139 138, 14): *celebrar el Evangelio de la vida.*

En el servicio de la caridad, hay una actitud que debe animarnos y distinguírnos: hemos de hacernos cargo del otro como persona confiada por Dios a nuestra responsabilidad. Como discípulos de Jesús, estamos llamados a hacernos prójimos de cada hombre (cf. Lc 10, 29-37), teniendo una preferencia especial por quien es más pobre, está sólo y necesitado. Precisamente mediante la ayuda al hambriento, al sediento, al forastero, al desnudo, al enfermo, al encarcelado —como también al niño aún no nacido, al anciano que sufre o cercano a la muerte— tenemos la posibilidad de servir a Jesús, como El mismo dijo: « Cuanto hicisteis a unos de estos hermanos míos más pequeños, a mí me lo hicisteis » (Mt 25, 40). Por eso, nos sentimos interpelados y juzgados por las palabras siempre actuales de san Juan Crisóstomo: « ¿Queréis de verdad honrar el cuerpo de Cristo? No consentáis que esté desnudo. No le honréis aquí en el templo con vestidos de seda y fuera le dejéis perecer de frío y desnudez ». <sup>113</sup>
