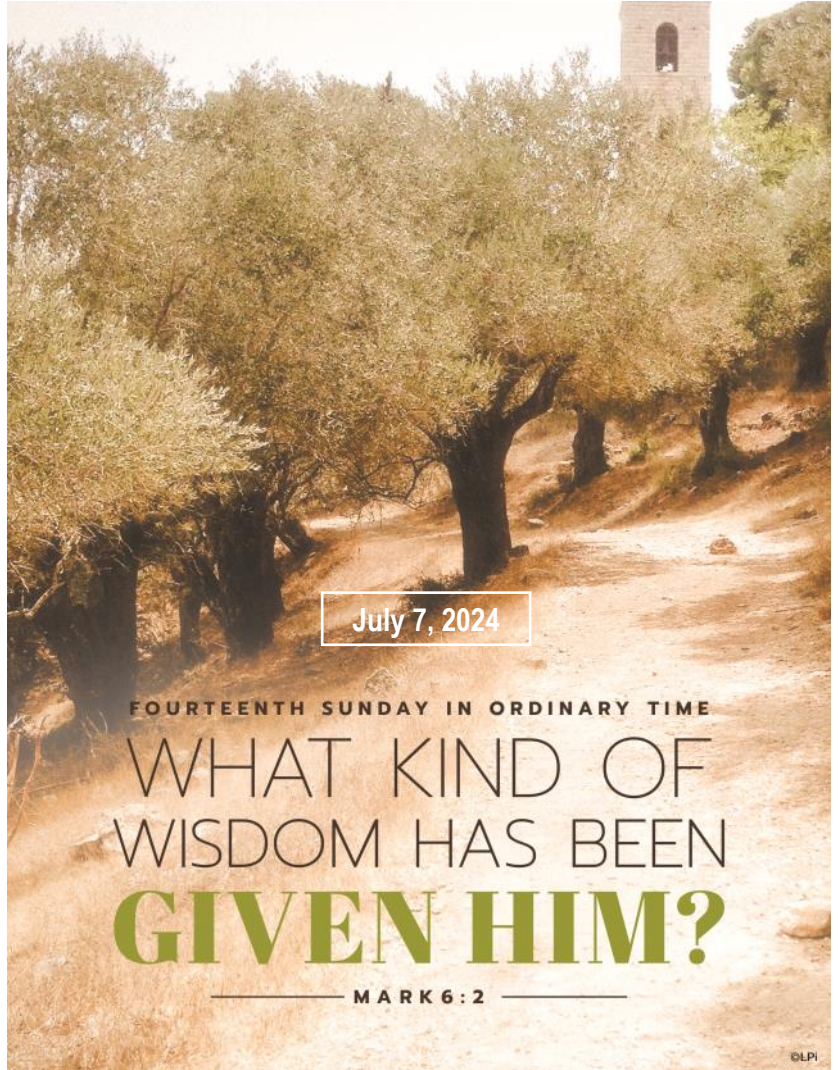

ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF POPE JOHN PAUL II

APRIL 17, 2003

INTRODUCTION

4. *The hour of our redemption.* Although deeply troubled, Jesus does not flee before his “hour”. “And what shall I say? ‘Father, save me from this hour?’ No, for this purpose I have come to this hour” (Jn 12:27). He wanted his disciples to keep him company, yet he had to experience loneliness and abandonment: “So, could you not watch with me one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation” (Mt 26:40- 41). Only John would remain at the foot of the Cross, at the side of Mary and the faithful women. The agony in Gethsemane was the introduction to the agony of the Cross on Good Friday. *The holy hour*, the hour of the redemption of the world. Whenever the Eucharist is celebrated at the tomb of Jesus in Jerusalem, there is an almost tangible return to his “hour”, the hour of his Cross and glorification. Every priest who celebrates Holy Mass, together with the Christian community which takes part in it, is led back in spirit to that place and that hour.

He was crucified, he suffered death and was buried; he descended to the dead; on the third day he rose again”. The words of the profession of faith are echoed by the words of contemplation and proclamation: “*This is the wood of the Cross, on which hung the Saviour of the world. Come, let us worship*”. This is the invitation which the Church extends to all in the afternoon hours of Good Friday. She then takes up her song during the Easter season in order to proclaim: “*The Lord is risen from the tomb; for our sake he hung on the Cross, Alleluia*”.

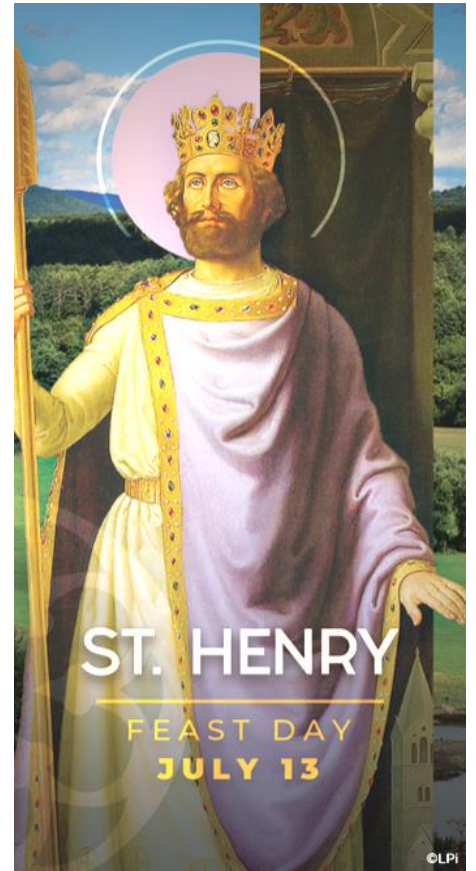

On July 13, the Catholic Church celebrates the memory of St. Henry II, a German king who led and defended Europe's Holy Roman Empire at the beginning of the first millennium. St. Henry was born in 972 to Duke Henry of Bavaria and Princess Gisela of Burgundy. During his youth, Henry received both an education and spiritual guidance from a bishop who was himself canonized, St. Wolfgang of Regensburg. As king, Henry encouraged the German bishops to reform the practices of the Church in accordance with canon law. In 1014, the German king journeyed to Rome where Pope Benedict VIII formally crowned him as head of the Holy Roman Empire. After several years of illness, St. Henry II died in July of 1024. The public mourned for the monarch who had led his earthly kingdom so responsibly without losing sight of the Kingdom of God. Pope Eugene III canonized him in 1146.

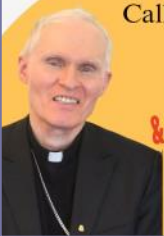

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mc 6, 1-6

Todos, en algún momento de nuestra vida, somos testarudos y obstinados, nos encaprichamos en nuestras ideas y nada ni nadie nos hace cambiar de opinión. Nos volvemos irrazonables y no escuchamos consejo alguno. Creemos que el mundo está a nuestros pies y que lo podemos controlar todo. Sin embargo, no es así. Lo podemos ver en la primera lectura de hoy. El pueblo israelita era rebelde e infiel a sus creencias. Por eso Dios dijo al profeta lo siguiente: *“Te envío donde esa raza de cabezas duras y de corazones obstinados para que les digas: ¡Esta es la palabra de Yavé...!”* (Ezequiel 2:4). ¿Me he rebelado contra Dios? ¿Soy obstinado en mis ideas? El mundo, la sociedad y todos nosotros necesitamos la misericordia de Dios para ser mejores, para que el corazón obstinado y rebelde se abra a la gracia de Dios tan necesaria en nuestra vida. El poder de Dios se manifiesta en nuestra debilidad. Eso es precisamente lo que el Evangelio de hoy nos manifiesta. Aparentemente, los que escuchaban a Jesús en la sinagoga no lo creían capaz de ser sabio y mucho menos ser el Hijo de Dios. Por eso se preguntaban atónitos: *“¿De dónde le viene todo esto? ¿Y qué pensar de la sabiduría que ha recibido, con esos milagros que salen de sus manos?”* (Marcos 5:2). Cómo era posible que un perfecto desconocido hablara con sabiduría e hiciera milagros como Dios. Además, era hijo de María y de un carpintero insignificante. ¿Cuál es la enseñanza de Jesús para nosotros hoy? No olvidemos, con su gracia nos basta.
