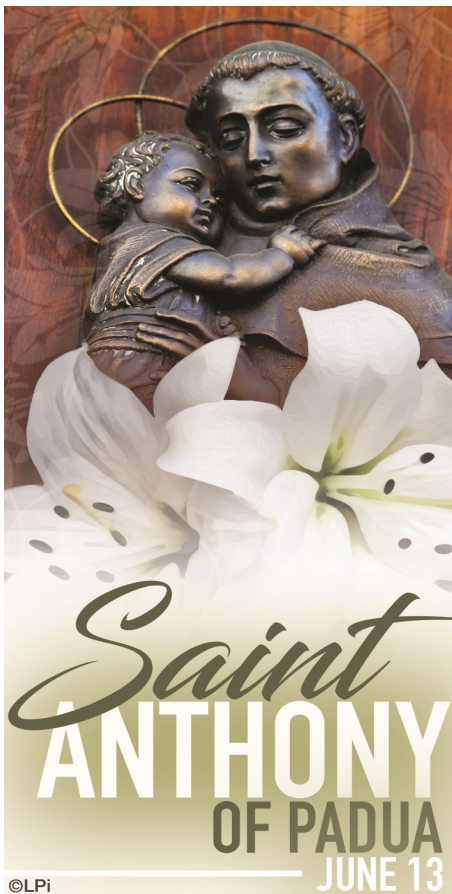
POPE FRANCIS' PRAYER INTENTION FOR JUNE 2024 For Migrants Fleeing their Homes

The saint known to the Church as Anthony of Padua was not born in the Italian city of Padua, nor was he originally named Anthony. He was born as Ferdinand in Lisbon, Portugal during 1195. In 1220, Ferdinand learned the news about five Franciscan friars who had recently died for their faith in Morocco. [He] wanted to imitate the Franciscan martyrs who had died trying to convert the Muslims of Morocco. He traveled on a ship to Africa for this purpose, but became seriously ill and could not carry out his intention. The ship that was supposed to take him to Spain was blown off course, and ended up in Italy. His eloquence stunned the crowd, and St. Francis of Assisi himself. In 1224 he gave Anthony permission to teach theology in the Franciscan order. After Lent in 1231, Anthony's health was in decline. [He] died on June 13 at the age of 36. St. Anthony's well-established holiness, combined with the many miracles he had worked during his lifetime, moved Pope Gregory IX – who knew the saint personally – to canonize him one year after his death.

SEPTEMBER 3, 1965

A Final Prayer



75. May the most blessed Virgin Mary, from whom Christ the Lord took the flesh that "is contained, offered, received" (81) in this Sacrament under the appearances of bread and wine, and may all the saints of God and especially those who were more inflamed with ardent devotion toward the divine Eucharist, intercede with the Father of mercies so that this common belief in the Eucharist and devotion to it may give rise among all Christians to a perfect unity of communion that will continue to flourish. Linger in Our mind are the words of the holy martyr Ignatius warning the Philadelphians against the evil of divisions and schisms, the remedy for which is to be found in the Eucharist. "Strive then," he says, "to make use of one single thanksgiving. For there is only one flesh of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and only one chalice unto the union of His blood, only one altar, only one bishop . . ." (82)

76. Fortified by the most consoling hope of blessings that will accrue to the whole Church and to the whole world from an increase in devotion to the Eucharist, as a pledge of heavenly blessings We lovingly impart Our apostolic blessings to you, Venerable Brothers, and to the priests, religious and all who are helping you, as well as to all the faithful entrusted to your care.

Given at St. Peter's, Rome, on the third day of September, the feast of Pope St. Pius X, in the year 1965, the third of Our Pontificate.

ONE BODY WORKING FOR CHRIST

I have coached all three of my children in soccer at some time in their lives. I loved teaching them and their teammates the importance of functioning as one unit. If we were not all moving together toward victory, we would all find ourselves together in defeat. We used to go through one drill I called the "human foosball." We would scrimmage with players in lines like on a foosball table. If you ever got too far behind or too far ahead of those in your line, play would stop and the ball would go to the other team. The goal was to help build an awareness of where your teammates were on the pitch and to teach the lesson that no one player is a team onto themselves. As disciples and stewards, we sometimes find ourselves far behind or maybe even too far ahead. As a consequence, our actions either hinder the ability of the Body of Christ to evangelize and pass on the faith to a new generation or present the Church as an entity that sees itself as judgmental or too holy to be in the world. We are called to community, and in that community, we must be aware of our brothers and sisters in the faith. At times, we need to help them grow in their faith. Other times, we need to slow down and realize that we cannot change the world on our own. We all have unique gifts we are called to share, and we can only bear true witness to the power of the Body of Christ when we are all moving together and making each other strong.

10TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

– Meditation –

Jesus asks us a stunning question this week: "How can Satan cast out Satan?" To enter into this question opens up the often-hidden dynamics of what Jesus has done and is constantly doing. If we're honest, our response to some degree is: "How else can we cast him out? Satan is precisely how we cast out Satan!" But Jesus wants us to see this finally does not work. Here's what I mean. Satan names the demonic mechanism by which we render wholeness through accusation. When we face a threat, we seek something to protect us (e.g., more money, social status, security, power, etc.). Rivals inevitably arise for these things and so do tensions. Accusation presents itself. "I'll never be successful unless I get ahead of that guy." "She's already trying to get ahead of me." "That group of immigrants is trying to take our jobs." And so on. The accusation grows into a fear-inducing threat — things will break apart — no, they already are! Hurry! We inflict violence on the victim and — as if by magic — peace ensues. For a time. Soon fresh accusations are required to hold new chaos at bay, until there is no community left at all. This is essentially humankind's sad history in a nutshell. Jesus' cross and resurrection unmasks this broken system of "casting out Satan by Satan" and ushers in a new one he calls "the Kingdom of God." He reveals that the dynamic of accusation is nothing compared to his power of divine mercy and love. The cross (and not Satan) is the real power to tear down strongholds of sin and cast out Satan. This is why he describes himself as the "stronger man who ties up the strong man to plunder his house." This week let's notice the ways we "cast out Satan by Satan," and then refuse to do it anymore. Because in the long run, that divided house cannot stand.

III. The Effects of Confirmation

1305 This "character" perfects the common priesthood of the faithful, received in Baptism, and "the confirmed person receives the power to profess faith in Christ publicly and as it were officially (quasi ex officio)."¹²⁰

IV. Who can Receive This Sacrament?

1306 Every baptized person not yet confirmed can and should receive the sacrament of Confirmation.¹²¹ Since Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist form a unity, it follows that "the faithful are obliged to receive this sacrament at the appropriate time,"¹²² for without Confirmation and Eucharist, Baptism is certainly valid and efficacious, but Christian initiation remains incomplete.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mc 3, 20-35

Si alguien no piensa como nosotros, lo descalificamos; si no seguimos las reglas del juego nos sacan del equipo. Y así, sucesivamente, nos mueve la sociedad para seguir su corriente. En tiempos de Jesús pasaba lo mismo. Como Jesús estaba haciendo cosas fuera de lo normal, tuvo tensiones con su familia y con los escribas. *“Al enterarse sus parientes de todo lo anterior, fueron a buscarlo para llevárselo, pues decían: Se ha vuelto loco. Mientras tanto, unos maestros de la ley que habían venido de Jerusalén decían: Está poseído por Beelzebul, jefe de los demonios, y con su ayuda expulsa a los demonios”* (Marcos 3:21-22). Tal parece que hacer el bien no es del buen parecer de todos. Cumplir cabalmente con la voluntad de Dios trae problemas serios, en la familia, en la sociedad y en el mundo. ¿Qué nos anima actualmente para hacer el bien? ¿Dónde están los que necesitan nuestro aliento y esperanza?

CAPÍTULO IV A MÍ ME LO HICISTEIS

« *Te doy gracias por tantas maravillas: prodigio soy* » (Sal 139 138, 14): *celebrar el Evangelio de la vida.*

86. Respecto al culto espiritual agradable a Dios (cf. Rm 12, 1), la celebración del Evangelio de la vida debe realizarse sobre todo en la existencia cotidiana, vivida en el amor por los demás y en la entrega de uno mismo. Así, toda nuestra existencia se hará acogida auténtica y responsable del don de la vida y alabanza sincera y reconocida a Dios que nos ha hecho este don. Es lo que ya sucede en tantísimos gestos de entrega, con frecuencia humilde y escondida, realizados por hombres y mujeres, niños y adultos, jóvenes y ancianos, sanos y enfermos.

En este contexto, rico en humanidad y amor, es donde surgen también los gestos heroicos. Estos son la celebración más solemne del Evangelio de la vida, porque lo proclaman con la entrega total de sí mismos; son la elocuente manifestación del grado más elevado del amor, que es dar la vida por la persona amada (cf. Jn 15, 13); son la participación en el misterio de la Cruz, en la que Jesús revela cuánto vale para Él la vida de cada hombre y cómo ésta se realiza plenamente en la entrega sincera de sí mismo.
