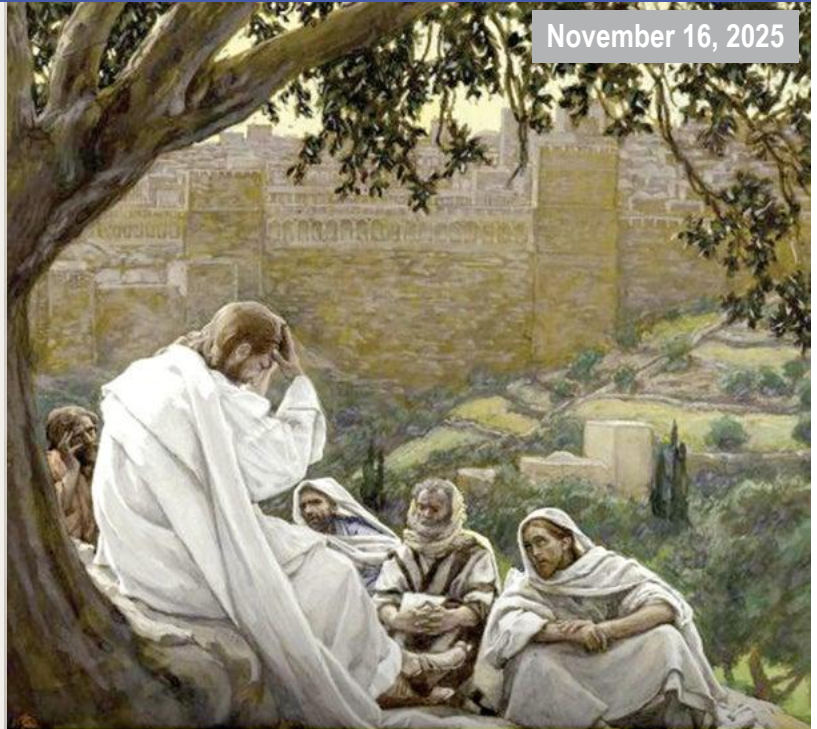

## ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

Have you ever heard of something called a “Bug Out Bag”? This is a bag of survival essentials that you keep in your home just in case you ever find yourself in a dangerous situation where you need to “bug out,” which is to say, flee immediately due to the threat of imminent danger.

From what I have read, it is becoming more common for folks to have a Bug Out Bag in their homes just in case some kind of disaster would strike. At first, I thought that this was a little extreme, but I must admit that it does make sense to have something like this at hand. Even if we never find ourselves fleeing a natural disaster, war, or some other tragic event, it would be a good idea for a family to have some basic survival necessities at hand, to know how to use them, and to have them all organized in a place where they can easily access them at a moment’s notice. I might organize one of these myself in the near future.

However, one of my hopes is that the growing awareness of the dangers looming just over the horizon at all times will lead people to not only improve their physical preparedness, but also to improve their spiritual preparedness.

Just think about it. Isn’t it funny how much time and energy we put into ensuring our physical safety by doing things like updating our locks and home security system, keeping a close eye on our kids everyday with Life 360, learning how to effectively use a firearm, and getting our Bug Out Bags in order? These are all good things that families often do to protect themselves from physical dangers, but what about the infinitely greater spiritual dangers that surround us? Do we have at least the same, if not greater interest in preparing for attacks against our eternal soul?

Thankfully, as Catholics, diagnosing our spiritual preparedness is easy. We don’t have to depend on our personal view, our feelings, or even on the advice of a minister. All we have to do is look at the teachings of the Church which have remained constant from the time of our Lord until now.

A Catholic spiritual “Bug Out Bag,” so to speak, would include just three simple things: daily prayer, weekly Sunday Mass (plus the occasional Holy Day of Obligation), and Confession roughly every month. For a baptized Catholic, this is all you need to be prepared for both spiritual and physical attacks. And you don’t even have to buy a fancy backpack to hold these things! As long as we pray daily (even for a short time!), go to Sunday Mass and Holy Days, and get to Confession as needed or at least monthly, then you will always have, right in your soul, the grace you need to overcome spiritual attacks, resist sin, grow in virtue, and even get to Heaven in the event of an untimely death. God is so good to us! He doesn’t make it hard. These things don’t cost any money, just a little of our time. So, as you work to get yourself and your family prepared for disasters that may happen at any moment, remember to get your spiritual “Bug Out Bag” in order first. It’s the most important one.

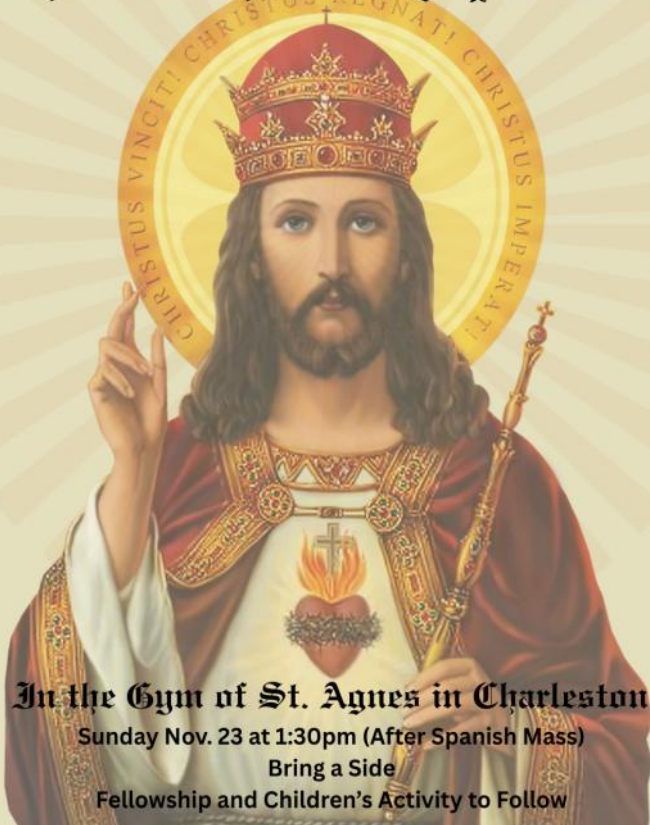

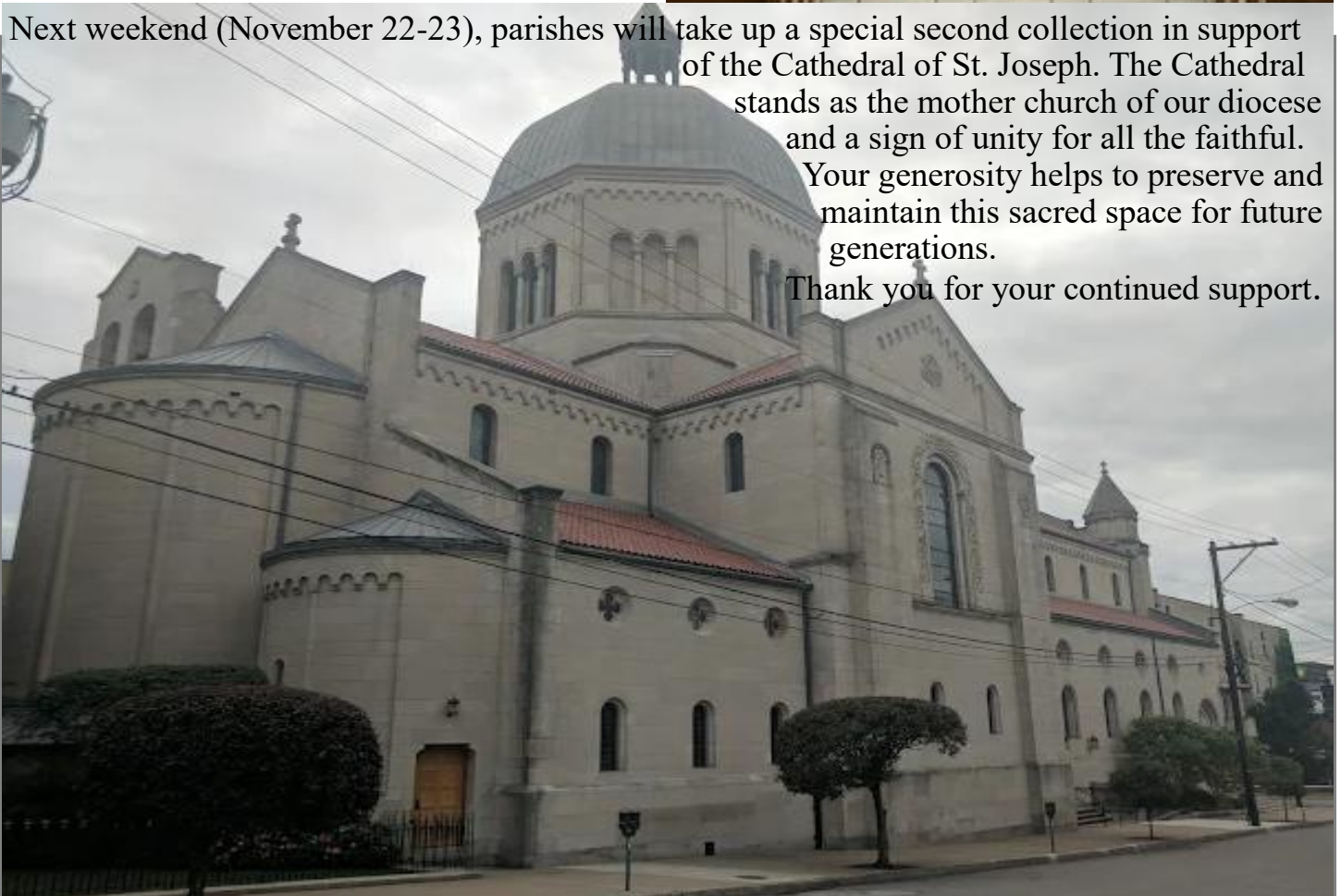

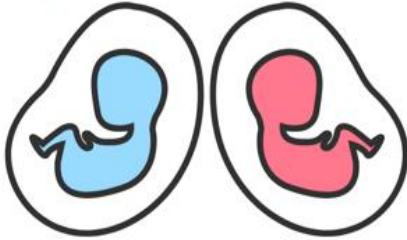

## ST. AGNES TO-DO LIST

*Perhaps you have wondered before, "What can I do to help around the church?" Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can't say that I'll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me (pszabo@dwc.org) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!*

**Bulletin Advertisements:** We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

**Weed Trimming:** If you know how to run a trimmer (or as we call them back home a "weed-wacker") we would love your help with the trimming around the church. We have a generous parishioner who is cutting the lawn each week, but it is just too much for him to also go around the buildings, fences, trees, etc. and trim along the edges of things. Let us know if you can help with this!

**Stick Collection:** Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

**Garden Maintenance:** The gardens around the church, rectory, and office are improving and will be being prepared for the colder weather. If you have some time and would like to help prepare the gardens for the colder weather, let us know.

**Plumbing:** A number of faucets are leaking in one way or another, or doing things really old plumbing does. If you know how to do this sort of thing, let me know! We could use a hand replacing a number of old faucets!

**Painting Stairs by Old Convent:** The metal stairway leading up to the lower entrance into the old convent is in rough shape. You can tell that it was last painted black, but the green, and other colored paints from the past, are showing through. This will take some time to scrape and repaint. Let us know if you can help.

**Shredding Old Common Grounds Files:** Common Grounds is getting rid of its older unneeded files. They contain sensitive personal information and need shredded. If you don't mind repetitive work, come by the office anytime and help us shred these documents.

**Leaf Raking:** It's that time of year again! We had an excellent crew of leaf rakers last year, but we can always use a few more good men, or women! Please send me an email if you would like to be added to our leaf raking crew!

**Phone Call Ministry:** We are looking for a volunteer to organize a phone call ministry to homebound parishioners. This person would help connect interested volunteers with homebound parishioners who would appreciate a phone call on a regular basis. This ministry would also reach out occasionally to people who are listed as our parishioners, but no longer attend Mass to see if they are in need of any help. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry.

**Rides to Mass Ministry:** We are looking for a volunteer to organize a group that is willing to help bring people to and from Mass that are unable to drive themselves, or who do not have a car. At times, these volunteers may also help people get to and from doctors appointments and other places that they cannot usually get to themselves. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry!

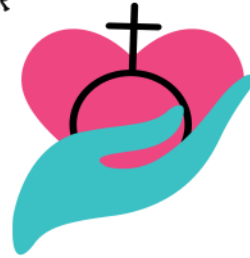

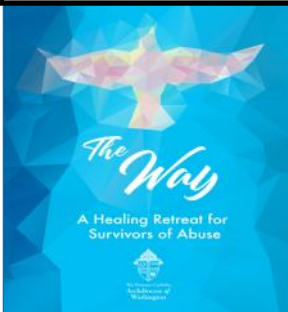
