ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

I listened to a podcast this past week that offered some practical advice on helping our young people break their addiction to smartphone use. It was both encouraging and disheartening. While there are simple and effective ways to help young people learn to live and communicate in the real world again, I fear that few families today are aware of just how dire the situation is because, to be honest, most of us are addicted as well. Even I get lost watching YouTube shorts from time to time!

Here are just a few thoughts from my own experience and from this podcast that I want to share with you in an effort to 1) raise our awareness of this danger and 2) to encourage all of us to help free our young people from this technological oppression.

First of all, things are so bad these days that I don't even need to reference a study or tell a story to help you believe that smart phone use is a problem. Even secular media is talking about this issue, and even the most main-stream science is showing that severe damage is being done to our younger generation's ability to cope with stress, communicate, and develop meaningful relationships as a result.

Some of the theory behind this issue was discussed in the podcast I listened to. They pointed out that growing up is very stressful for everyone. In order for a person to develop good communication and stress management skills, he or she must wrestle for years and years, starting as an infant and leading all the way into adulthood. This constant process of trial and error is what teaches us to communicate confidently and regulate our emotions. However, if you introduce a smartphone into the mix at a young age, this greatly reduces face to face communication, and provides an infinite source of instant gratification that keeps a young person from every having to deal with stress. As a result, the nature process of social and emotional maturation not only stops, but becomes gravely disordered. The effects of this are all too obvious in our world today.

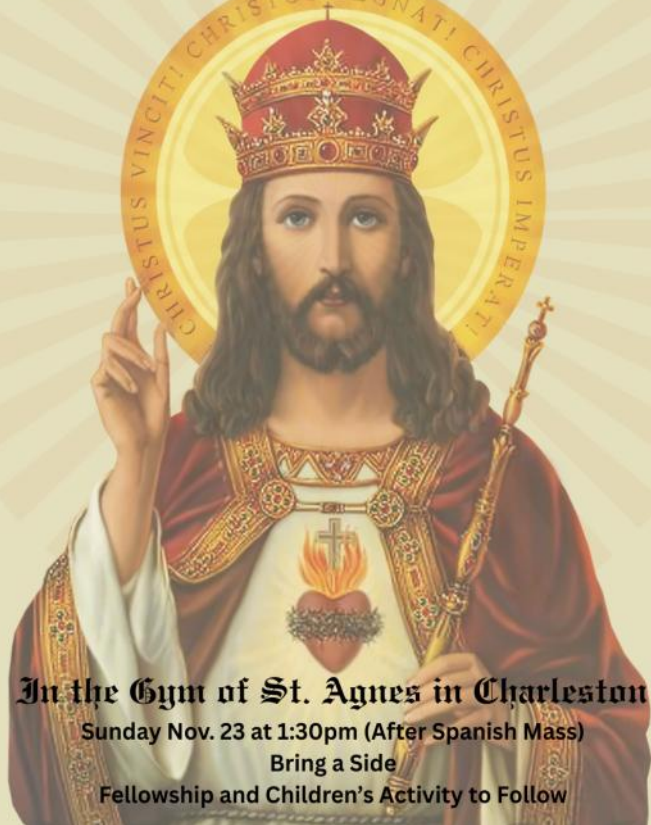
From my own experience, I want to also mention the much darker side of smartphone use. More kids than we can count become addicted to pornography as a result of unrestricted and unsupervised use of smartphones. Many are pressured into sharing inappropriate photos of themselves, and some even become the victims of blackmail scams as a result. This is making it almost impossible for an entire generation of humanity to love themselves, to understand the beauty and mystery of human sexuality, and then to find joy in their respective vocations. If you think that your kids are not doing these things, then you really need to look more into this.

There are so many more problems that come from allowing young people to use smartphones. I can only hope that the little I have shared here, coupled with what we are all seeing around us, will encourage us all to take practical steps to help free our young people from what is nothing less than truly a technological oppression of an entire generation. Take some time to learn more about this if you haven't already. Ironically, it is quite easy to use a smartphone to access videos, articles, and podcasts that discuss this. If you are interested in checking out the podcast I mentioned, it is titled "A Practical Guide to Freeing Kids and Teens from Smartphones" and it can be found on the First Things Podcast wherever you like to listen to podcasts. Please join me in praying for our youth, and may God bless you all!

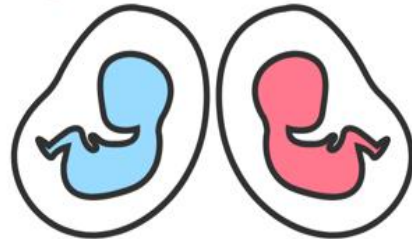

Perhaps you have wondered before, "What can I do to help around the church?" Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can't say that I'll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me (pszabo@dwc.org) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!

Bulletin Advertisements: We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

Weed Trimming: If you know how to run a trimmer (or as we call them back home a "weed-wacker") we would love your help with the trimming around the church. We have a generous parishioner who is cutting the lawn each week, but it is just too much for him to also go around the buildings, fences, trees, etc. and trim along the edges of things. Let us know if you can help with this!

Stick Collection: Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

Garden Maintenance: The gardens around the church, rectory, and office are improving and are being prepared for the colder weather. If you have some time and would like to help prepare the gardens for the colder weather, let us know.

Plumbing: A number of faucets are leaking in one way or another, or doing things really old plumbing does. If you know how to do this sort of thing, let me know! We could use a hand replacing a number of old faucets!

Painting Stairs by Old Convent: The metal stairway leading up to the lower entrance into the old convent is in rough shape. You can tell that it was last painted black, but the green, and other colored paints from the past, are showing through. This will take some time to scrape and repaint. Let us know if you can help.

Leaf Raking: The leaves continue to fall! We have an excellent crew of leaf rakers, but we can always use a few more good men, or women! Please send me an email if you would like to be added to our leaf raking crew!

Phone Call Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a phone call ministry to homebound parishioners. This person would help connect interested volunteers with homebound parishioners who would appreciate a phone call on a regular basis. This ministry would also reach out occasionally to people who are listed as our parishioners, but no longer attend Mass to see if they are in need of any help. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry.

Rides to Mass Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a group that is willing to help bring people to and from Mass that are unable to drive themselves, or who do not have a car. At times, these volunteers may also help people get to and from doctors appointments and other places that they cannot usually get to themselves. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry!

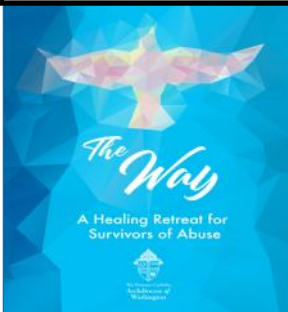
