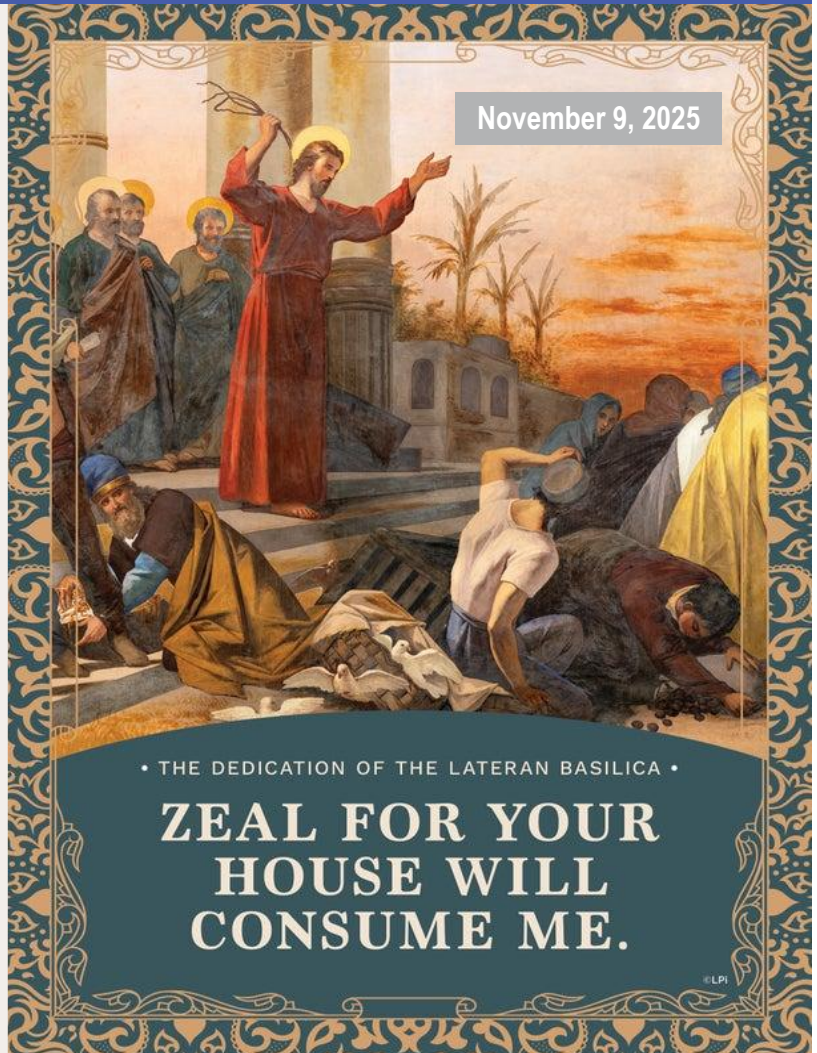

ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

During a recent home visit, I found myself sitting at the family dinner table with two young kids, and a plate with four cookies on it. Take a moment to do the math... three people... four cookies. I knew that this was going to be interesting.

As an adult who has learned to temper my appetites (and who was also tall enough to see that there was a second, larger plate of cookies on the countertop just a short distance away) I had no trouble taking just one of the four cookies. The oldest child also seemed content with just one cookie. The second oldest, however, did limit himself to taking just one cookie, but he nevertheless kept a VERY close eye on the final cookie lying before us.

While I and their oldest were enjoying our cookies, the third member of our cookie-eating crew seemed mesmerized not by the taste of the cookie he was currently eating, but by the one remaining cookie on the plate. Then, after barely a minute had passed, and with a half-eaten cookie still in hand, he suddenly lunged forward and grabbed the fourth cookie as if his life depended on it.

“Why don’t you finish your first cookie before you take another cookie?” I calmly asked, trying to keep myself from laughing and messing up this potential teaching moment. I got no response at all from my companion who was now delightfully dual-wielding cookies. Hearing my remark, dad came quickly to the rescue. He lovingly reiterated my suggestion and then proceeded to remove the more recently acquired fourth cookie from his son’s hand.

Perhaps you have heard before of the super-human strength a person can suddenly obtain when a loved-one’s life is at stake? Like a mother who miraculously lifts a car to save her child? Well, this was one of those times. Despite his tiny size, this child easily repelled his father’s first attempt to reclaim the cookie. However, the child’s powerful cookie lust was finally defeated by his father’s love and, once dad was in possession of the cookie, the child began to shed tears of both sorrow and joy. Although he had lost his second cookie, he was now able to enjoy the first one like never before.

After a long hug, the wounds that this young child sustained during this brief but grueling spiritual battle were healed and he was at last able to return to the table where, together, we all enjoyed the rest of our first cookies. He and his sister were both delighted too when they discovered that the fourth cookie had been carefully broken in half and shared with each of them.

I share this story because, if we are honest, we often act in a similar way as adults. Instead of cookies, though, we do this with our money and material goods, our spouse, other family, and friends, or our prestige. Instead of enjoying, valuing, and being grateful for what we already have, we let our eyes wander to the point that we are no longer capable of enjoying what we currently have. Then we misinterpret our restlessness and dissatisfaction as a sign that we should indeed be looking elsewhere for happiness, and this vicious cycle repeats itself until we either make ourselves step back and examine the absurdity of our actions, or until we hit rock bottom and lose everything.

Take some time this week to think about this. Are you enjoying the wonderful “cookies” that God has given you? Or are you too busy worrying about the next cookie? Let’s all pray for the grace to enjoy what we have instead of always grasping for more! Godspeed! Fr. Szabo

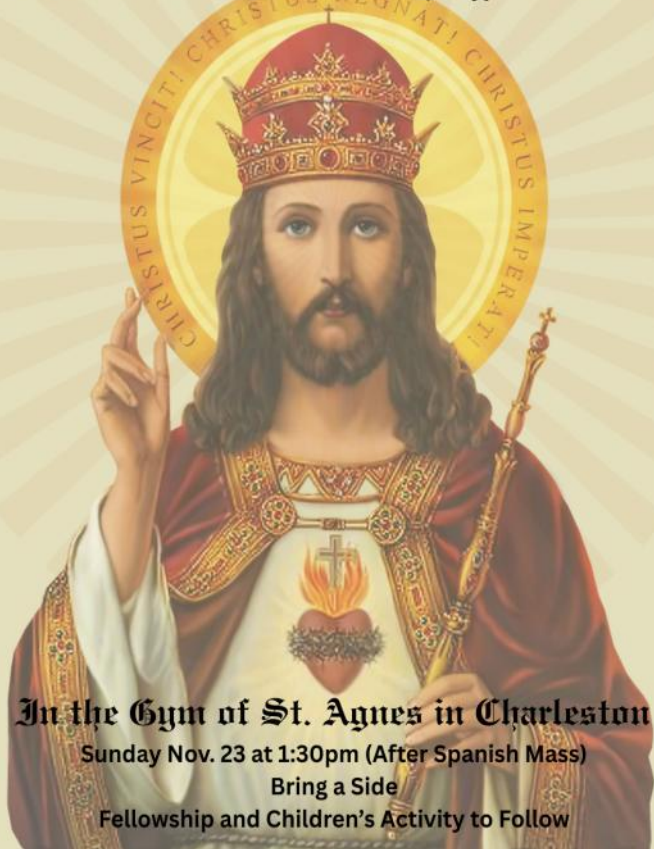

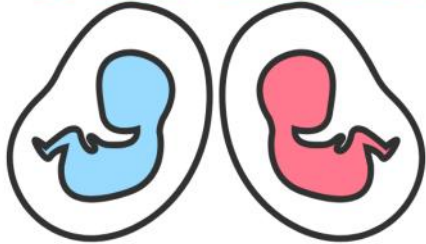

Perhaps you have wondered before, "What can I do to help around the church?" Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can't say that I'll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me (pszabo@dwc.org) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!

Bulletin Advertisements: We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

Weed Trimming: If you know how to run a trimmer (or as we call them back home a "weed-wacker") we would love your help with the trimming around the church. We have a generous parishioner who is cutting the lawn each week, but it is just too much for him to also go around the buildings, fences, trees, etc. and trim along the edges of things. Let us know if you can help with this!

Stick Collection: Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

Garden Maintenance: The gardens around the church, rectory, and office are improving and will be being prepared for the colder weather. If you have some time and would like to help prepare the gardens for the colder weather, let us know.

Plumbing: A number of faucets are leaking in one way or another, or doing things really old plumbing does. If you know how to do this sort of thing, let me know! We could use a hand replacing a number of old faucets!

Painting Stairs by Old Convent: The metal stairway leading up to the lower entrance into the old convent is in rough shape. You can tell that it was last painted black, but the green, and other colored paints from the past, are showing through. This will take some time to scrape and repaint. Let us know if you can help.

Shredding Old Common Grounds Files: Common Grounds is getting rid of its older unneeded files. They contain sensitive personal information and need shredded. If you don't mind repetitive work, come by the office anytime and help us shred these documents.

Leaf Raking: It's that time of year again! We had an excellent crew of leaf rakers last year, but we can always use a few more good men, or women! Please send me an email if you would like to be added to our leaf raking crew!

Phone Call Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a phone call ministry to homebound parishioners. This person would help connect interested volunteers with homebound parishioners who would appreciate a phone call on a regular basis. This ministry would also reach out occasionally to people who are listed as our parishioners, but no longer attend Mass to see if they are in need of any help. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry.

Rides to Mass Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a group that is willing to help bring people to and from Mass that are unable to drive themselves, or who do not have a car. At times, these volunteers may also help people get to and from doctors appointments and other places that they cannot usually get to themselves. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry!
