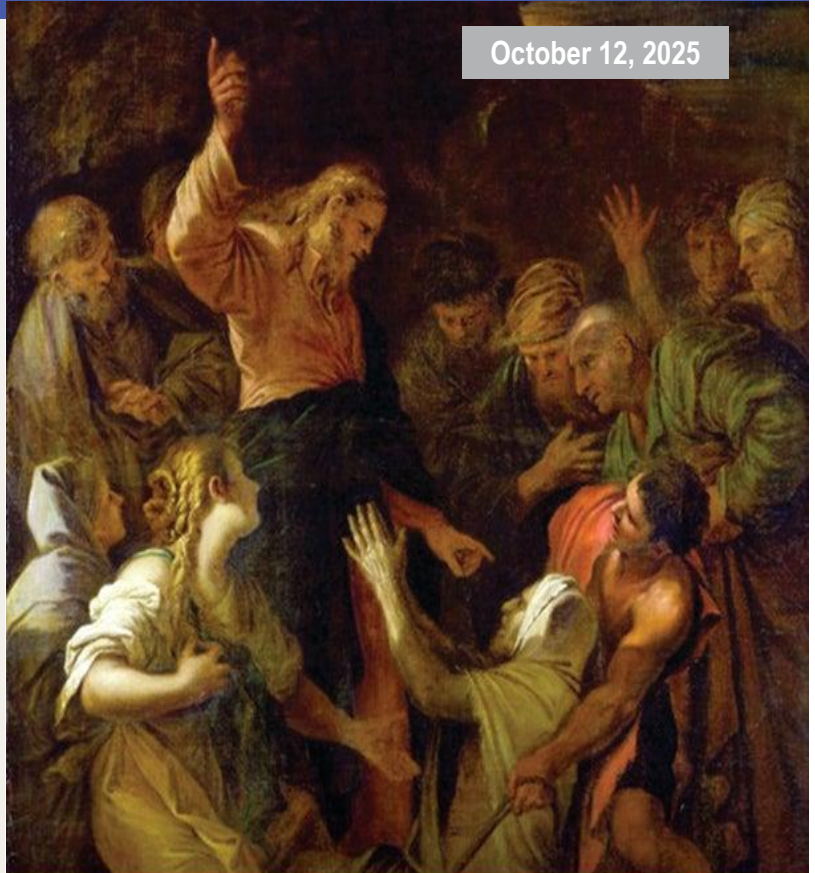

ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes

I missed you all this past weekend! I hope that you had the chance to talk with Fr. Travis Moger who covered all of our Masses, Confessions, and other ministries while I was away serving at a Men's Retreat in Webster Springs, WV. He is a wonderful priest!

Despite all odds, I also made it back to St. Agnes on Sunday in time to join a small group of people for the Life Chain. We stood together along MacCorkle with signs encouraging people to consider Pro-Life options when facing an unexpected or difficult pregnancy, and also to remember that the love of Jesus is far greater than any sin we could ever commit.

I am encouraging things like Life Chains, the March for Life, and other activities that put our faith out in the public eye because this is one of the easiest ways to preach the Gospel, especially for introverts! By participating in formal activities that publicly proclaim our faith, other people will notice and, when they notice, they will think about it and, when they think about it, the Holy Spirit has more opportunity to act in that person's life.

Considering how confused our culture is about the sanctity of human life from conception to natural death, it is more important than ever to publicly proclaim our faith on this matter. Participating in the Life Chain, the March for Life, and other activities that help people see, think, and be inspired about the sanctity of human life is one of the most powerful ways that we can "proclaim the good news to the whole creation" as Jesus calls us to do (Mk 16:15). Standing on the street with a sign or walking in a big group down the streets of our nation's capital may seem silly and pointless, but have you ever really thought about the psychology behind it as I have just described it? Again, when people see, they think, and when they think, the Holy Spirit can act in new ways. For example, there are countless stories of young women who were on their way to get an abortion, but decided to choose life for their unborn children instead because someone was standing outside of the abortion clinic with a sign reminding them that there is support available and that the love of Jesus is available for all of us.

There were just four of us standing out on MacCorkle this past Sunday, but we had more than 50 people that hour who beeped their horns and gave us a big thumbs up. They saw us, agreed with us, and were encouraged! And if that many people saw us and were encouraged, how many more saw us, either did not agree with us or have not yet formed their belief on this subject, and then started thinking about it for the first time in a while, or maybe ever? I wonder too how many of them were consequently inspired by the Holy Spirit to a deeper respect for the sanctity of human life. This is a simple and powerful thing that literally anyone can do to help spread the Gospel.

Please consider being a part of these things in the future, especially the March for Life coming up on Friday, January 3rd. If four of us can have such a big impact on Kanawha City, how much more can tens of thousands of us do from our nation's capital!?

ST. AGNES TO-DO LIST

Perhaps you have wondered before, “What can I do to help around the church?” Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can’t say that I’ll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me (pszabo@dwc.org) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!

Bulletin Advertisements: We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

Weed Trimming: If you know how to run a trimmer (or as we call them back home a “weed-wacker”) we would love your help with the trimming around the church. We have a generous parishioner who is cutting the lawn each week, but it is just too much for him to also go around the buildings, fences, trees, etc. and trim along the edges of things. Let us know if you can help with this!

Stick Collection: Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

Garden Maintenance: The gardens around the church, rectory, and office are improving and will be being prepared for the colder weather. If you have some time and would like to help prepare the gardens for the colder weather, let us know.

Plumbing: A number of faucets are leaking in one way or another, or doing things really old plumbing does. If you know how to do this sort of thing, let me know! We could use a hand replacing a number of old faucets!

Painting Stairs by Old Convent: The metal stairway leading up to the lower entrance into the old convent is in rough shape. You can tell that it was last painted black, but the green, and other colored paints from the past, are showing through. This will take some time to scrape and repaint. Let us know if you can help.

Shredding Old Common Grounds Files: Common Grounds is getting rid of its older unneeded files. They contain sensitive personal information and need shredded. If you don’t mind repetitive work, come by the office anytime and help us shred these documents.

Leaf Raking: It’s that time of year again! We had an excellent crew of leaf rakers last year, but we can always use a few more good more men, or women! Please send me an email if you would like to be added to our leaf raking crew!

Phone Call Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a phone call ministry to homebound parishioners. This person would help connect interested volunteers with homebound parishioners who would appreciate a phone call on a regular basis. This ministry would also reach out occasionally to people who are listed as our parishioners, but no longer attend Mass to see if they are in need of any help. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry.

Rides to Mass Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a group that is willing to help bring people to and from Mass that are unable to drive themselves, or who do not have a car. At times, these volunteers may also help people get to and from doctors appointments and other places that they cannot usually get to themselves. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry!
