ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes,

Have you ever sat down at the end of the weekend or at the end of a day off, and found yourself wondering, “Where did the time go!? I haven’t gotten anything done!” Of course you have. We have all experienced this strange phenomena. Although time seems to drag on forever while we are at work or listening to a homily by Fr. Szabo, it seems to fly by during our free time. What a tragedy, right!? We expect our weekends and holidays to be refreshing, and yet they often end up leaving us more stressed out than we were before.

This week, I want to share with you all a remedy for this problem that I have found to be particularly effective in my own struggle with this. It is also quite simple: Go to Daily Mass, meditate on Scripture, or pray the Rosary on your day off. It’s really that simple.

Think about it. The night before our day off, how do we feel? We often feel excited about the prospect of having an entire day off to do whatever we want. However, the morning of our day off, how do we feel? Even if we catch up on sleep, we often still feel sluggish. “How can this be after all the sleep that I got!?” we wonder to ourselves. Good question!

You see, the fatigue that we feel after a long week is not only a physical fatigue, but also a spiritual fatigue. We (I include myself here) often forget that, as creatures that exist as a union of a physical body and a spiritual soul, we not only need to be physically recharged on a regular basis, but spiritually recharged as well. If we only spend extra time sleeping on our days off without spending extra time in prayer, then we will still experience that unique kind of fatigue where, at one and the same time, we are incapable of falling asleep and also incapable of doing anything useful. This kind of fatigue is what leaves us wondering at the end of a weekend or day off, “Where did the time go!?”

So, give it a shot. Even if this idea still seems strange, you might as well try it out. Maybe today, or at least on your next weekend or day off, spend a significant amount of time in prayer either by going to daily Mass somewhere in town, meditating on Scripture for 10 minutes, or praying the Rosary that day. I promise you that this will change everything. Assuming you pray attentively and with at least a mustard seed of faith, you will find that you have more energy to accomplish other tasks that day because you have not only physically recharged yourself, but now you have also spiritually recharged yourself.

Notice too that I put “Daily Mass” first in my list here. Especially when we are new to this, it is very helpful to gather together with other brothers and sisters in Christ on those days when we have more time to spiritually recharge ourselves. Above all, nothing beats receiving Holy Communion on our day off! And, here at St. Agnes, you can always get a quick Confession before Daily Mass as well! May God bless you!

ST. AGNES TO-DO LIST

Perhaps you have wondered before, "What can I do to help around the church?" Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can't say that I'll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Just email me (pszabo@dwc.org) once you have taken care of something so I can remove it from the list!

Bulletin Advertisements: We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

Weed Trimming: If you know how to run a trimmer (or as we call them back home a "weed-wacker") we would love your help with the trimming around the church. We have a generous parishioner who is cutting the lawn each week, but it is just too much for him to also go around the buildings, fences, trees, etc. and trim along the edges of things. Let us know if you can help with this!

Stick Collection: Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

Garden Maintenance: The gardens around the church, rectory, and office are improving and will be being prepared for the colder weather. If you have some time and would like to help prepare the gardens for the colder weather, let us know.

Plumbing: A number of faucets are leaking in one way or another, or doing things really old plumbing does. If you know how to do this sort of thing, let me know! We could use a hand replacing a number of old faucets!

Painting Stairs by Old Convent: The metal stairway leading up to the lower entrance into the old convent is in rough shape. You can tell that it was last painted black, but the green, and other colored paints from the past, are showing through. This will take some time to scrape and repaint. Let us know if you can help.

Shredding Old Common Grounds Files: Common Grounds is getting rid of its older unneeded files. They contain sensitive personal information and need shredded. If you don't mind repetitive work, come by the office anytime and help us shred these documents.

Leaf Raking: It's that time of year again! We had an excellent crew of leaf rakers last year, but we can always use a few more good more men, or women! Please send me an email if you would like to be added to our leaf raking crew!

Phone Call Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a phone call ministry to homebound parishioners. This person would help connect interested volunteers with homebound parishioners who would appreciate a phone call on a regular basis. This ministry would also reach out occasionally to people who are listed as our parishioners, but no longer attend Mass to see if they are in need of any help. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry.

Rides to Mass Ministry: We are looking for a volunteer to organize a group that is willing to help bring people to and from Mass that are unable to drive themselves, or who do not have a car. At times, these volunteers may also help people get to and from doctors appointments and other places that they cannot usually get to themselves. Let us know if you can help us start this ministry!

Cleaning the Church: We are looking for some more volunteers, either individuals or families, who would be willing to help clean the church one week a month. Contact Donna Michael for more information at (304) 415-5581."

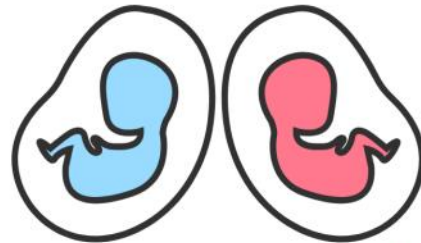

Fostering Gratitude: The ministry is a way for lay people to show gratitude for the spiritual care they receive from their priests.

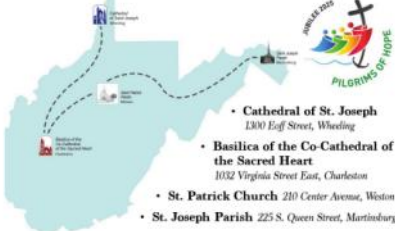
Deepening Devotion: Prayers are offered for the priests' sanctification, health, and their deepening devotion to the Blessed Mother.
