The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

WHAT IS THIS CATECHESIS?

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a method of religious education and spiritual formation built on the two pillars of Sacred Scripture and the Liturgy, and born out of the pedagogy and educational principles of Dr. Maria Montessori.



Begun in Rome in the 1950s - by Sofia Cavaletti, a biblical scholar, and Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori educator - CGS today is embraced by dioceses throughout the U.S., as well as 65+ other countries around the world.

At the heart of CGS is the child, and their relationship with God through Jesus. Our very young children are particularly capable of receiving and enjoying the most essential elements of our faith. In a special room, called the Atrium, and through thoughtfully designed and carefully crafted materials, CGS makes concrete for the child the mystery of God and His great love. WHAT WILL CGS LOOK LIKE AT SAINT AGNES?

We will begin with Level I catechesis, which is shaped to the needs of children 3-6 yrs old. We will spend the rest of this year introducing CGS, and preparing our Atrium, and plan to begin catechesis at the end of January 2025. Children will attend one 2-hr session a week. Depending on the demand, we will offer 1-2 session times.

SAINT AGNES TO DO LIST

Perhaps you have wondered before, “What can I do to help around the church?” Well, take a gander! Here are some chores that need doing. Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can’t say that I’ll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Gardening! Thanks to many of you, much of the garden space around St. Agnes has been reclaimed, but many flower beds are under Mother Nature’s domain. All around the church could use some work & definitely church office beds. Feel free to adopt an area for yourself /family & make it your own!

Furnish and Decorate a New Multi-Purpose Room in the Old Convent: Since I moved my office down to the Parish Office, there’s a large empty room that we can use for other purposes such as Bible Studies, Prayer Groups, Youth Group meetings and more. However, it is in need of some more furniture, decorations & organization. If you have the gift of design & wouldn’t mind perhaps even donating some furniture, let us know!

Repair damaged Handicapped Entrance Ramp: The ramp leading up to the side handicapped church entrance has large cracks, gaps, and a large bump in it. This is far from the inviting appearance that we want our parish to have. If you are good with concrete sidewalk repair, this job is for you!

Resetting Walkway Patio Stones to the Parish Office: The pavers of the walkway from the lower parking to the office have become quite displaced by the beautiful tree right next to it. We can’t really blame it I suppose, since we put the pavers over its roots! Someone patient with some landscaping experience, and a little OCD would be a perfect candidate for this job!

Designing & Installing Catholic Literature Stands: The vestibule of our church is beautiful! However, we are using plastic folding tables to display all of the information we want to be available to our parish community. The vestibule deserves a little more class than that! Plus, flat folding tables are not a very efficient way to display this material. With two, wall-mounted literature boards/stands, we can display everything that is there now, plus way more, in a much more efficient and attractive way. Reach out to me if you want to help us with this project.

Rectory Renovation: I’m almost finished with all the repairs needed done to the original rectory (attached to the church). Now we need to get it looking good. If you want to help make a rectory that is inviting & appealing to visiting priests & guests, please contact me! I’m good at fixing the broken stuff, but not much of a decorator, & definitely can’t pick matching colors & other things like that!

Caring for our Maintenance Equipment: Are you a gearhead or at least a tinkerer? We need someone who can keep up with the regular maintenance on all of the equipment we are blessed to own. We have lawn mowers and leaf blowers, hedge trimmers and edge trimmers, and one massive leave vacuum (that happens to be leaking oil rather significantly I discovered last month). We need up keeping up with their oil changes, air filters, spark plugs, blade sharpening, etc. Let me know if you can help us be good stewards of these great gifts that people have given us!

Decorative Fence around AC Units: One of the gems of Kanawha City is the beautiful park-like area we have down behind the church. Sadly, the massive AC unit beside the church and the smaller unit beside the Old Convent stick out like giant sore thumbs! I would love if someone was willing to help us build a decorative fence around/in front them that would keep that area looking sharp, and maybe even dampen the sound a little.

COMMON GROUNDS OUTREACH THANKSGIVING BOXES

During the Thanksgiving season, we will take time to thank God for the many blessings we have received. We will participate, as a church, in a Thanksgiving Food Drive as a concrete way to pay forward these many blessings. We will collect food to assist Common Grounds Outreach in filling Thanksgiving boxes. The following items are included in the boxes: canned yams/sweet potatoes, boxed stuffing, canned corn, canned green beans, canned cranberry sauce & canned gravy (turkey/chicken).
