ST. AGNES WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear St. Agnes Family,

As we all know by now, our country, and Catholics in particular, are mourning with the families affected by the tragedy that occurred at Annunciation Catholic Church in Minneapolis, Minnesota just three short weeks ago. This, along with countless other similar stories across the country, and the whole world, reminds us of how dire our situation is here on Earth, and how important it is to focus our entire lives on Jesus Christ and the eternity that awaits us all.

Although it is very important to establish protocols that help us protect innocent people from harm when it comes our way, it is even more important for us to attack evil at its root by offering our lives in sacrifice as Jesus taught us through our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

To help us understand something of what I mean, we can refer back to the Gospel reading from this past Tuesday where Jesus selects the 12 Apostles. After naming the first eleven Apostles who all go on to be great Saints, this is how St. Luke describes our Lord's betrayer, "Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor" (Luke 6:16). Notice that he doesn't say, "Judas Iscariot, the traitor," but rather "[he], who became a traitor." It is so important to recognize this fact about those who do evil in this world. No matter how wicked a person is, there was a time in that person's life when he or she was not so wicked.

As much as we all love to hate the bad guys and cheer when they get what's coming to them, the truth is that the "bad guys" are human beings that need our love just as much, if not more than the good guys. Granted, sometimes the most loving thing that we can do for a person is to put an end to the evil he or she is doing, even to the point of using lethal force if necessary, but we still need to keep in mind that the "bad guys" don't wake up one day and just decide to be evil. They "become" evil slowly and over time, and often as a result of a tremendous amount of evil that they suffered starting at a young age, and often continuing throughout their entire life. This is what St. Luke hints at when he says, "Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor." Although Judas is fully responsible for the decisions that made him into a traitor, it is nonetheless true that there was a time when Judas was just another zealous disciple, and potential Saint.

If we want to attack evil at its root, we have to keep this reality in mind when we pray, fast, and give alms. While it is very important to offer these things for those who are suffering, it is even more important to offer them for those who are responsible for the suffering. While Jesus mourns for the souls of those who suffer injustice here on Earth at the hands of wicked people, He mourns even more for the souls of those who commit injustice and, therefore, place themselves at grave risk of suffering grievously not only temporarily on Earth, but eternally in Hell.

If we want to attack evil at its root, then we must pray, fast, and give alms on behalf of both the victims and, as hard as it may be, also the perpetrators. If Satan can get us to simultaneously hate the perpetrators while we pray for the victims, then he can greatly diminish the amount of good our prayers do, if they manage to do any good at all. May God heal the wounds of those who suffer injustice here on Earth, and may He also heal the wounds of those who cause it!

Though I enjoy this kind of work, I can't say that I'll get to all of these things in a reasonable amount of time, so your help would be much appreciated! Bulletin Advertisements: We have a lot of room on the back of our bulletin for more advertisements. If you have a business that already supports the church, let us know so we can put your ad on the bulletin. If you have a business that is not directly supporting the church yet, or if you know of another business owner who would be interested in supporting the church, please let us know!

Weed Trimming: If you know how to run a trimmer (or as we call them back home a "weed-wacker") we would love your help with the trimming around the church. We have a generous parishioner who is cutting the lawn each week, but it is just too much for him to also go around the buildings, fences, trees, etc. and trim along the edges of things. Let us know if you can help with this!

Stick Collection: Despite all of the tree trimming we have done this past year, the trees continue to drop branches all over the yard. There are some large enough to cause trouble for anyone helping mow the lawn. If you have about an hour a week to spare, consider taking a walk around the property here once a week with our wheelbarrow to pick up sticks that are laying in the yard. Let us know and we will tell you how to access the wheelbarrow.

Garden Maintenance: The gardens around the church, rectory, and office are improving with the TLC being received. If you have a green thumb, or can at least distinguish between weeds and flowers, please feel free to come by for any amount of time to help maintain the many gardens that we have around the parish!

Plumbing: A number of faucets are leaking in one way or another, or doing things really old plumbing does. If you know how to do this sort of thing, let me know! We could use a hand replacing a number of old faucets!
