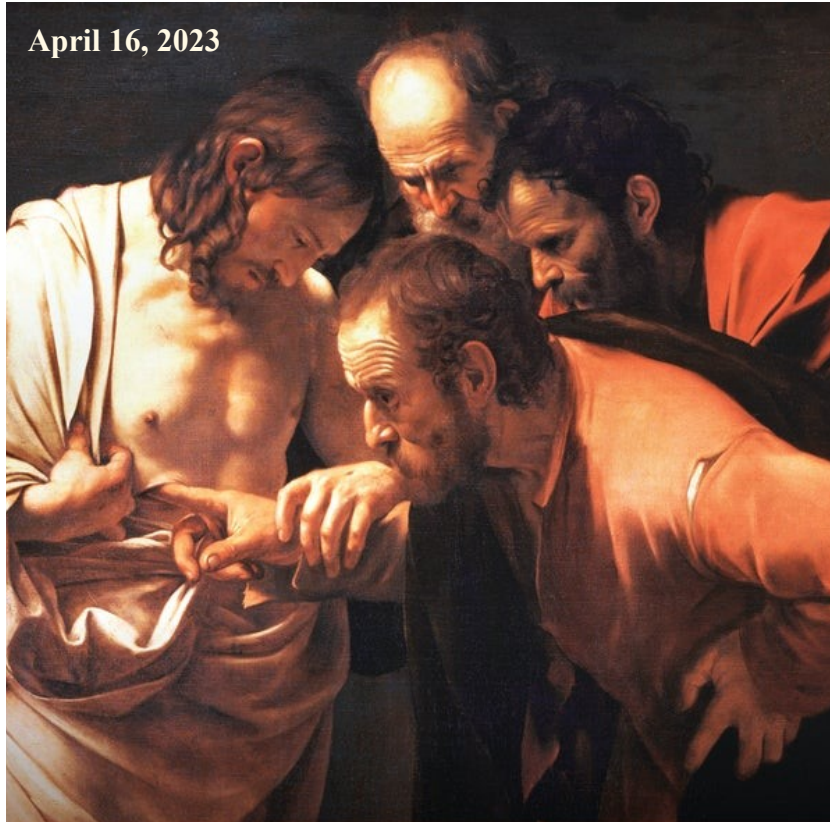

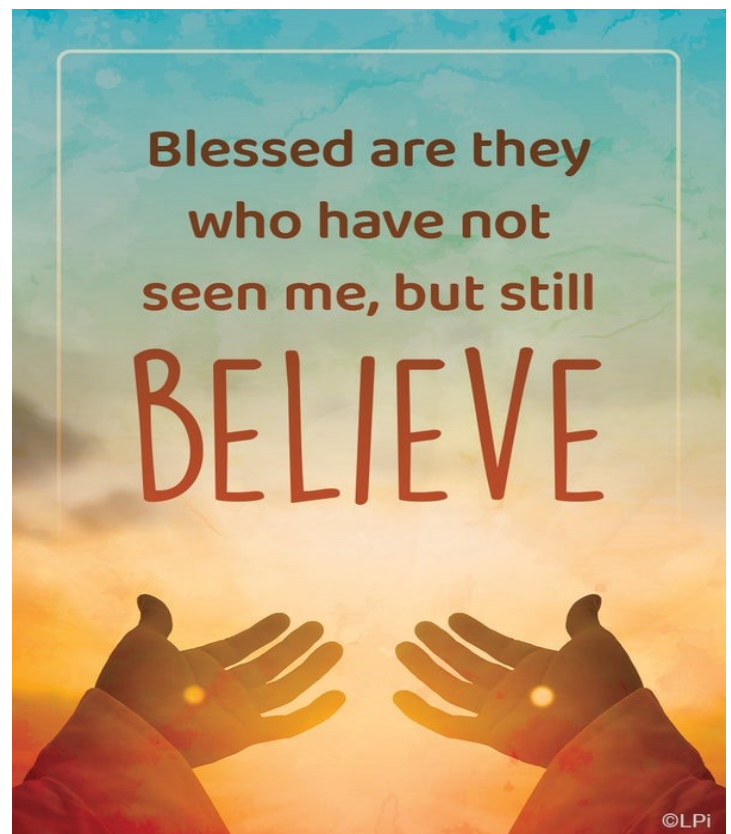

In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun [Maria Faustina Kowalska] began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world. Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come.”

## ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH



### CHAPTER FOUR: THE EUCHARIST AND ECCLESIAL COMMUNION

46. In my Encyclical *Ut Unum Sint* I expressed my own appreciation of these norms, which make it possible to provide for the salvation of souls with proper discernment: “It is a source of joy to note that Catholic ministers are able, in certain particular cases, to administer the sacraments of the Eucharist, Penance and Anointing of the Sick to Christians who are not in full communion with the Catholic Church but who greatly desire to receive these sacraments, freely request them and manifest the faith which the Catholic Church professes with regard to these sacraments. Conversely, in specific cases and in particular circumstances, Catholics too can request these same sacraments from ministers of Churches in which these sacraments are valid”.<sup>97</sup>

These conditions, from which no dispensation can be given, must be carefully respected, even though they deal with specific individual cases, because the denial of one or more truths of the faith regarding these sacraments and, among these, the truth regarding the need of the ministerial priesthood for their validity, renders the person asking improperly disposed to legitimately receiving them. And the opposite is also true: Catholics may not receive communion in those communities which lack a valid sacrament of Orders.<sup>98</sup>

## POPE FRANCIS, URBI ET ORBI, EASTER 2023

Dear brothers and sisters, Christ is risen!

On this day we proclaim that he, the Lord of our life, is “the resurrection and the life” of the world (cf. Jn 11:25). Today is Easter, the Pasch, a word that means “passage,” for in Jesus the decisive passage of humanity has been made: the passage from death to life, from sin to grace, from fear to confidence, from desolation to communion in him. In him, the Lord of time and history, I would like to say to everyone, with heartfelt joy, happy Easter to all!

May this Easter be for each of you, dear brothers and sisters, and in particular for the sick and the poor, the elderly and those experiencing moments of trial and weariness, a passage from affliction to consolation. We are not alone: Jesus, the Living One, is with us, forever. Let the Church and the world rejoice, for today our hopes no longer come up against the wall of death, for the Lord has built us a bridge to life. Yes, brothers and sisters, at Easter the destiny of the world was changed, and on this day, which also coincides with the most probable date of Christ’s resurrection, we can rejoice to celebrate, by pure grace, the most important and beautiful day of history.

“Christ is risen; he is truly risen!” In this traditional proclamation of the Churches of the East: *Christòs anesti!* That word “truly” reminds us that our hope is not an illusion, but the truth! And that, in the wake of Easter, humanity’s journey, now marked by hope, advances all the more readily. The first witnesses of the resurrection show this by their example. The Gospels speak of the haste with which, on the morning of Easter, the women “ran to tell the disciples” (Mt 28:8). Mary Magdalene then “ran and went to Simon Peter” (Jn 20:2), while John and Peter himself then “ran together” (cf. v. 4) to the place where Jesus had been buried. Later, on the evening of Easter, after meeting the risen Lord on the road to Emmaus, two disciples “set out without delay” (cf. Lk 24:33) and traveled several miles, uphill and in the dark, spurred on by the irrepressible joy of Easter that burned in their hearts (cf. v. 32). The same joy that led Peter, on the shore of the Lake of Galilee, after catching sight of the risen Jesus, to leave the boat with the others, to throw himself immediately into the water and to swim quickly towards him (cf. Jn 21:7). At Easter, then, the journey quickens and becomes a race, since humanity now sees the goal of its journey, sees the meaning of its destiny, Jesus Christ, and is called to make haste to meet him, who is the hope of the world.

May we too make haste to progress on a journey of reciprocal trust: trust among individuals, peoples, and nations. May we allow ourselves to experience amazement at the joyful proclamation of Easter, at the light that illumines the darkness and the gloom in which, all too often, our world finds itself enveloped.

## MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Jn 20:19-31

Hoy es la octava de Pascua, fiesta central de todo el año litúrgico. Tenemos cincuenta días hasta Pentecostés, para descubrir y experimentar que Jesús es nuestra paz, que su bondad no se ha ido a pesar de nuestros miedos. Señor, necesitamos tu misericordia en el corazón para descubrirte en los que sufren, en los tristes, en los que viven la guerra y la violencia. La paz que nos prometiste desde tu resurrección no es reconocida y practicada. Tal pareciera que hemos olvidado el compartir, escuchar, y vivir en paz de mutuo acuerdo, por el bien común.

Los apóstoles estaban encerrados por miedo a los judíos. A puerta cerrada, escondidos. Jesús penetra esas puertas y se muestra a ellos brindando su paz. Les dice que no estén angustiados, que ha vencido la muerte, el pecado y que en adelante todo va a ser nuevo. Esa misma paz es la que Jesús nos desea a nosotros ahora. Con la fe, que profesamos desde el bautismo, podemos seguir adelante, sin miedo, con valentía, venciendo los obstáculos de la vida que nos impiden estar cerca de Dios. El Santo Papa Juan Pablo II dijo: "Jesucristo es la respuesta definitiva a la pregunta sobre el sentido de la vida y a los interrogantes fundamentales que asedian hoy a tantos hombres y mujeres" (Ecclesia en América, n. 10). Es la paz de Cristo la que nos ayuda a vivir serenos a pesar de todas las inseguridades. ¡Señor, gracias por tu paz!

## Mensaje de Pascua y Bendición Urbi et Orbi 2023 del Papa Francisco



Queridos hermanos y hermanas:  
¡Cristo ha resucitado!

Hoy proclamamos que Él, el Señor de nuestra vida, es "la resurrección y la vida" del mundo (cf. Jn 11,25). Es Pascua, que significa "paso", porque en Jesús se realizó el paso decisivo de la humanidad: de la muerte a la vida, del pecado a la gracia, del miedo a la confianza, de la desolación a la comunión.

En Él, Señor del tiempo y de la historia, quisiera decirles a todos, con alegría en el corazón: ¡feliz Pascua! Que sea para cada uno de ustedes, queridos hermanos y hermanas -en particular para los enfermos y los pobres, para los ancianos y los que están atravesando momentos de prueba y dificultad-, un paso de la tribulación a la consolación. No estamos solos, Jesús, el Viviente, está con nosotros para siempre.

Que la Iglesia y el mundo se alegren, porque hoy nuestra esperanza ya no se estrella contra el muro de la muerte; el Señor nos ha abierto un puente hacia la vida. Sí, hermanos y hermanas, en Pascua el destino del mundo cambió; y hoy, que coincide además con la fecha más probable de la resurrección de Cristo, podemos alegrarnos de celebrar, por pura gracia, el día más importante y hermoso de la historia.

Cristo ha resucitado, verdaderamente ha resucitado, como se proclama en las Iglesias de Oriente. Ese verdaderamente nos dice que la esperanza no es una ilusión, ¡es verdad! Y que, a partir de la Pascua, el camino de la humanidad, marcado por la esperanza, avanza veloz. Nos lo muestran con su ejemplo los primeros testigos de la Resurrección. Los Evangelios describen la prisa con la que el día de Pascua "las mujeres corrieron a dar la noticia a los discípulos" (Mt 28,8).

Y, después que María Magdalena "corrió al encuentro de Simón Pedro" (Jn 20,2), Juan y el mismo Pedro "corrieron los dos juntos" (cf. v. 4) para llegar al lugar donde Jesús había sido sepultado. Y después, la tarde de Pascua, habiendo encontrado al Resucitado en el camino de Emaús, dos discípulos "partieron sin demora" (cf. Lc 24,33) y se apresuraron para recorrer muchos kilómetros en subida y a oscuras, movidos por la alegría incontenible de la Pascua que ardía en sus corazones (cf. v. 32).

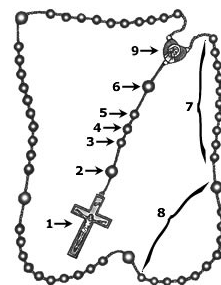
