

## MYSTERIUM FIDEI ENCYCLICAL OF POPE PAUL VI ON THE HOLY EUCHARIST

SEPTEMBER 3, 1965

### ON THE WORSHIP OF LATRIA

62. We are not saying this with any thought of effecting a change in the manner of keeping the Eucharist and of receiving Holy Communion that has been laid down by subsequent ecclesiastical laws still in force; Our intention is that we may rejoice over the faith of the Church which is always one and the same.

*Corpus Christi, Another Instance of Latria*

63. This faith also gave rise to the feast of Corpus Christi, which was first celebrated in the diocese of Liege—especially through the efforts of the servant of God, Blessed Juliana of Mount Cornelius—and Our predecessor, Urban IV, established for the universal Church. It has also given rise to many forms of Eucharistic devotion that have, through the inspiration of God's grace, grown with each passing day. Through them the Catholic Church is eagerly striving to pay honor to Christ and to thank Him for such a great gift and to beg His mercy.

## THE FEAST OF ST. GEORGE

APRIL 23



St. George was a soldier of the Roman army who was tortured and beheaded for his Christian faith in the year 303, in Lydda (in modern day Palestine). He was likely born in Cappadocia, of a Cappadocian father and a Palestinian mother of noble rank. He moved to Palestine where he joined the military and apparently served with some distinction. St. George is usually depicted in Christian art as a soldier on horseback killing a dragon with a lance. This image is a representation of a popular legend of St. George which first appears in 1265 in a romance titled "The Golden Legend," in which he saved a town terrorized by a dragon with one blow of his lance. The image, however, is also, and more significantly, a powerful symbol of the victory of Christian faith over evil. St. George is the patron of soldiers and the patron of many nations, including Palestine; Lebanon; England; Georgia; Malta. He is invoked by sufferers of herpes, skin diseases, skin rashes, syphilis, and snakebites.

### LEAD BY EXAMPLE

During the Easter season, we reflect on being followers of the stone that the builders rejected, the crucified and risen Jesus. Like a shepherd, he leads us by his voice that echoes throughout the centuries and remains real and effective even in our modern world. To be his disciple means to risk rejection in a similar way as he experienced. The shepherd will not lead his lambs into danger, but there is danger all around us regardless. Everyday Stewardship can be something we talk about in the abstract or a way of living we simply wish we could follow. It can be an imperfect reality that at times places us in direct conflict with the world. As we decrease and Jesus increases in us, many will be drawn to the love and compassion that flows through us. However, some will see us for fools and will suggest we are ridiculous. Cultivating our gifts for God's sake and the total surrender of all we possess and have become to God is not wise in some eyes. Either they think we are crazy, or, just maybe at times, the example of our lives causes them to question their own values. If you give a little, you will be admired. If you give a lot, you will be celebrated. If you give it all, you can be rejected. Not everyone will have this negative reaction. Some will see your example and will seek to do the same. They will then join you in following the shepherd. They will become a true sign of Jesus Christ to the world. But their conversion of heart begins with you and your example.

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### FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

#### — Meditation —

Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line. When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby. How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.



### CAPÍTULO IV A MÍ ME LO HICISTEIS

« *Te doy gracias por tantas maravillas: prodigo soy* » (*Sal 139 138, 14*): celebrar el Evangelio de la vida.

84. Celebrar el Evangelio de la vida significa celebrar el Dios de la vida, el Dios que da la vida: « Celebremos ahora la Vida eterna, fuente de toda vida. Desde ella y por ella se extiende a todos los seres que de algún modo participan de la vida, y de modo conveniente a cada uno de ellos. La Vida divina es por sí vivificadora y creadora de la vida. Toda vida y toda moción vital proceden de la Vida, que está sobre toda vida y sobre el principio de ella. De esta Vida les viene a las almas el ser inmortales, y gracias a ella vive todo ser viviente, plantas y animales hasta el grado ínfimo de vida. Además, da a los hombres, a pesar de ser compuestos, una vida similar, en lo posible, a la de los ángeles. Por la abundancia de su bondad, a nosotros, que estamos separados, nos atrae y dirige. Y lo que es todavía más maravilloso: promete que nos trasladará íntegramente, es decir, en alma y cuerpo, a la vida perfecta e inmortal. No basta decir que esta Vida está viviente, que es Principio de vida, Causa y Fundamento único de la vida. Conviene, pues, a toda vida el contemplarla y alabarla: es Vida que vivifica toda vida ».<sup>109</sup>

### V. EL SACRIFICIO SACRAMENTAL: ACCIÓN DE GRACIAS, MEMORIAL, PRESENCIA

1366 La Eucaristía es, pues, un sacrificio porque *representa* (= hace presente) el sacrificio de la cruz, porque es su *memorial* y *aplica* su fruto:

«(Cristo), nuestro Dios y Señor [...] se ofreció a Dios Padre [...] una vez por todas, muriendo como intercesor sobre el altar de la cruz, a fin de realizar para ellos (los hombres) la redención eterna. Sin embargo, como su muerte no debía poner fin a su sacerdocio (*Hb 7,24.27*), en la última Cena, "la noche en que fue entregado" (*1 Co 11,23*), quiso dejar a la Iglesia, su esposa amada, un sacrificio visible (como lo reclama la naturaleza humana) [...] donde se representara el sacrificio sangriento que iba a realizarse una única vez en la cruz, cuya memoria se perpetuara hasta el fin de los siglos (*1 Co 11,23*) y cuya virtud saludable se aplicara a la remisión de los pecados que cometemos cada día (Concilio de Trento: DS 1740).
