



Courage and sacrificial love mark the life of St. Maximilian Kolbe. He became a priest of the Franciscan order. Dedicated with evangelization, he published a magazine to teach the Catholic faith and encourage devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During the Nazi occupation of Poland, Fr. Kolbe was arrested and sent to Auschwitz. One day a prisoner escaped, 10 must die in his place. The guards picked 10 men at random. One began to beg for his life on behalf of his family, and another man stepped forward and offered to take his place. Fr. Kolbe was sentenced, along with the other nine men, to death by starvation. For this "martyr of Auschwitz," a life of devotion culminated in one heroic, Christlike act.

### CONCLUSION

60. At the dawn of this third millennium, we, the children of the Church, are called to undertake with renewed enthusiasm the journey of Christian living. As I wrote in my Apostolic Letter *Novo Millennio Ineunte*, "it is not a matter of inventing a 'new programme'. The programme already exists: it is the plan found in the Gospel and in the living Tradition; it is the same as ever. Ultimately, it has its centre in Christ himself, who is to be known, loved and imitated, so that in him we may live the life of the Trinity, and with him transform history until its fulfilment in the heavenly Jerusalem".<sup>103</sup> The implementation of this programme of a renewed impetus in Christian living passes through the Eucharist.

Every commitment to holiness, every activity aimed at carrying out the Church's mission, every work of pastoral planning, must draw the strength it needs from the Eucharistic mystery and in turn be directed to that mystery as its culmination. In the Eucharist we have Jesus, we have his redemptive sacrifice, we have his resurrection, we have the gift of the Holy Spirit, we have adoration, obedience and love of the Father. Were we to disregard the Eucharist, how could we overcome our own deficiency?

### PUBLIC LIFE

#### Question:

If we have a separation of church and state, how should faith influence the way we act in society, especially for those who have a role in the government?

#### Answer:

No matter who we are, our inner lives affect the way we interact with the world. In the United States, we have freedom of religion. That means there is no official state-sanctioned religion. This does *not* mean that our faith is a private affair with no impact on public life! We have the ability to freely exercise our religious beliefs in accord with our conscience. Not only do we have the option to do so, but we also have the responsibility. We're called to imitate Christ in every area of our life, not compartmentalize our faith. This means acting with respect and honoring the common humanity [in] all we encounter. It means recognizing the person behind the politics. It also means standing up for the truth of human life and dignity, and advocating for just policies that serve the common good. The Vatican has produced a "Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church." It contains more detailed exposition of how our Catholic faith relates to various aspects of public life.

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### 19<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### — Meditation —

A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives. This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.

##### IV. Who can Receive Baptism?

#### The Baptism of adults

The catechumenate, or formation of catechumens, aims at bringing their conversion and faith to maturity, in response to the divine initiative and in union with an ecclesial community. The catechumenate is to be "a formation in the whole Christian life . . . during which the disciples will be joined to Christ their teacher. the catechumens should be properly initiated into the mystery of salvation and the practice of the evangelical virtues, and they should be introduced into the life of faith, liturgy, and charity of the People of God by successive sacred rites."<sup>47</sup>

Catechumens "are already joined to the Church, they are already of the household of Christ, and are quite frequently already living a life of faith, hope, and charity."<sup>48</sup> "With love and solicitude mother Church already embraces them as her own."<sup>49</sup>



### MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mt 14, 22-33

Este pasaje de Mateo nos lleva a reflexionar sobre la importancia de la fe y de cómo la profesamos a lo largo de nuestra vida. Desarrollar la fe es un proceso que da comienzo el día de nuestro bautismo. En ese momento fue plantada la semilla de la fe. Ya de adultos, escuchar la Palabra de Dios nos ayuda a enfrentar las tormentas cotidianas. A veces se tambalea nuestra fe. Pareciera que nada vale la pena y es cuando acudimos al Señor, como Pedro en el Evangelio, y viene el grito de: ¡Sálvame, Señor! de la incertidumbre, del miedo y de la falta de paz en nuestras ciudades, en las familias y en nuestros corazones. A pesar de nuestra poca fe, queremos ser fieles a Jesús y sus enseñanzas. Solo él puede salvarnos.

Aunque vacile a causa de mis debilidades, tómame de tu mano y llévame hacia ti. Porque tú no eres un fantasma, eres el Hijo de Dios. A este propósito, Juan XXIII recordó en la Encíclica *Pacem in terris*: « En la época moderna se considera realizado el bien común cuando se han salvado los derechos y los deberes de la persona humana. De ahí que los deberes fundamentales de los poderes públicos consisten sobre todo en reconocer, respetar, armonizar, tutelar y promover aquellos derechos, y en contribuir por consiguiente a hacer más fácil el cumplimiento de los respectivos deberes. "Tutelar el intangible campo de los derechos de la persona humana y hacer fácil el cumplimiento de sus obligaciones, tal es el deber esencial de los poderes públicos". Por esta razón, aquellos magistrados que no reconozcan los derechos del hombre o los atropellen, no sólo faltan ellos mismos a su deber, sino que carece de obligatoriedad lo que ellos prescriban ».<sup>94</sup>

### III. LA EUCHARISTÍA EN LA ECONOMÍA DE LA SALVACIÓN Los signos del pan y del vino

En la Antigua Alianza, el pan y el vino eran ofrecidos como sacrificio entre las primicias de la tierra en señal de reconocimiento al Creador. Pero reciben también una nueva significación en el contexto del Éxodo: los panes ácimos que Israel come cada año en la Pascua conmemoran la salida apresurada y liberadora de Egipto. El recuerdo del maná del desierto sugerirá siempre a Israel que vive del pan de la Palabra de Dios (*Dt 8,3*). Finalmente, el pan de cada día es el fruto de la Tierra prometida, prenda de la fidelidad de Dios a sus promesas. El "cálice de bendición" (*1 Co 10,16*), al final del banquete pascual de los judíos, añade a la alegría festiva del vino una dimensión escatológica, la de la espera mesiánica del restablecimiento de Jerusalén. Jesús instituyó su Eucaristía dando un sentido nuevo y definitivo a la bendición del pan y del cálice.
