

On Jan. 17, Catholics celebrate the life of St. Anthony of Egypt, the founder of Christian monasticism. Anthony was born around 251, to wealthy parents. [He] would see the Emperor Constantine's establishment of Christianity. One day, he heard Jesus' exhortation to [a] young man in the Biblical: "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." He followed the advice of selling everything he owned. Anthony attempted to live alone in a secluded desert. This period as a hermit lasted between 13 and 15 years. [He] became engaged in spiritual combat. When he was around 33 years old, his patrons found him in serious condition, and took him back to a local church to recover. Anthony emerged from his solitude to provide guidance to the hermits that had become established in his vicinity. His decision to become its spiritual father marked the beginning of monasticism. St. Anthony may have been 105 years old when he died, between 350 and 356.

ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH



CHAPTER THREE: THE APOSTOLICITY OF THE EUCHARIST AND OF THE CHURCH

31. If the Eucharist is the centre and summit of the Church's life, it is likewise the centre and summit of priestly ministry. For this reason, with a heart filled with gratitude to our Lord Jesus Christ, I repeat that the Eucharist "is the principal and central *raison d'être* of the sacrament of priesthood, which effectively came into being at the moment of the institution of the Eucharist".⁶³

Priests are engaged in a wide variety of pastoral activities. If we also consider the social and cultural conditions of the modern world it is easy to understand how priests face the very real risk of losing their focus amid such a great number of different tasks. The Second Vatican Council saw in pastoral charity the bond which gives unity to the priest's life and work. This, the Council adds, "flows mainly from the Eucharistic Sacrifice, which is therefore the centre and root of the whole priestly life".⁶⁴ We can understand, then, how important it is for the spiritual life of the priest, as well as for the good of the Church and the world, that priests follow the Council's recommendation to celebrate the Eucharist daily: "for even if the faithful are unable to be present, it is an act of Christ and the Church".⁶⁵ In this way priests will be able to counteract the daily tensions which lead to a lack of focus and they will find in the Eucharistic Sacrifice – the true centre of their lives and ministry – the spiritual strength needed to deal with their different pastoral responsibilities. Their daily activity will thus become truly Eucharistic.

PLAY THAT ONE AGAIN

How many times have you sung the church song, “Here I Am, Lord”? If you grew up Catholic and are around my age (still 50!), the answer is more than you can count. The song that quotes various verses of Scripture is sung using guitar, piano, or organ, by cantors and choirs, in traditional and modern churches. It is truly a Catholic greatest hit of the modern Church. The question is how many times when singing the refrain have you really taken to heart what you were singing. “Here I am, Lord; is it I, Lord? I have heard you calling in the night.” Like the biblical figure Samuel, we are responding to the call of God by asking for clarification that we are indeed the one being called. We then follow up the question with a profound statement: “I will go if You lead me.” It is profound because we are pledging to our God that we are willing to go wherever He wants. We are accepting the challenge put forth in the U.S. Bishops’ pastoral letter, “Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response,” to become mature disciples who respond to the call of Jesus Christ regardless of the cost. We have sung this pledge repeatedly for many years. We never have any idea what God will call us to do and where to go. Sometimes the request can ask us for quite a lot. Hopefully, we respond like a mature disciple. If not, maybe we should reflect more the next time this song is played. The melody will not allow for the words, “I will see if I am busy and then decide to go if you lead me.” Then again, I don’t want to sing that to God, the source of all life anyway. Do you?

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READING THE BIBLE

Question:

What is unique or different about the way Catholics read and are exposed to the Bible?

Answer:

Catholics are exposed to Scripture primarily through the Sunday readings from a book known as the *Lectionary*. The *Lectionary* is a book of selected passages from the Bible set in the context of a liturgical season, such as Advent, Lent, or ordinary time. There are four readings assigned to any Sunday: the first reading (usually from the Old Testament), the responsorial psalm, the second reading (usually from a New Testament letter), and the Gospel reading. These readings together give them a new context. The selected readings relate to one another in a unique manner that is not present in the Bible text itself. In close proximity to each other, these readings now have the opportunity to converse with each other in a way that would have not been possible before. A homilist pays attention to all four readings, preparing a reflection that speaks of this conversation among the readings, enabling us to zero in on what this unique combination of God’s word has to say to us this particular Sunday. Next time you attend Sunday liturgy, try reading the Scripture ahead of time and see how this new relationship among the readings addresses and challenges you to be a better Christian here and now.

1197 Christ is the true temple of God, "the place where his glory dwells"; by the grace of God, Christians also become the temples of the Holy Spirit, living stones out of which the Church is built.

1198 In its earthly state the Church needs places where the community can gather together. Our visible churches, holy places, are images of the holy city, the heavenly Jerusalem, toward which we are making our way on pilgrimage.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Jn 1, 29-34

Con la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor terminamos el Tiempo de la Navidad. Hoy iniciamos lo que se llama el Tiempo Ordinario. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos explica lo que este tiempo significa: “*El año litúrgico es el desarrollo de los diversos aspectos del único misterio pascual. Esto vale muy particularmente para el ciclo de las fiestas en torno al Misterio de la Encarnación (Anunciación, Navidad, Epifanía) que conmemoran el comienzo de nuestra salvación y nos comunican las primicias del misterio de Pascua*”. El Tiempo Ordinario es el más largo del año, consta de 33 a 34 semanas, se celebra en una primera etapa antes de la Cuaresma, y otra, más larga, después del Tiempo Pascual. Los colores litúrgicos también tienen un papel muy importante en las celebraciones litúrgicas y este tiempo la Iglesia se engalana con el color verde.

Además del entorno que nos rodea dentro de la iglesia, lo más importante de cada domingo es escuchar la Palabra de Dios y descubrir el mensaje de Jesús y ponerlo en práctica en la vida diaria. En el Evangelio, Juan indica el punto a seguir: “*Detrás de mí viene un hombre que ya está delante de mí, porque era antes que yo...Sí, yo lo he visto, y declaro que éste es el Elegido de Dios*” (Juan 1,29.34). Juan es el elegido de Dios, testigo de la divinidad, el que nos muestra al Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo. No es fácil dejar paso a otro que nos quita el lugar y más si tenemos fama y amigos que nos reconocen. Juan ve a Jesús, comprende y le deja libre el camino.

CRECIENDO EN NUESTRA FE CATÓLICA

San Sebastián, Mártir

20 de Enero

Sebastián, hijo de familia militar y noble, era oriundo de Narbona, pero se había educado en Milán. Llegó a ser capitán de la primera corte de la guardia pretoriana. Era respetado por todos y apreciado por el emperador, que desconocía su cualidad de cristiano. [Fue] denunciado al emperador Maximino quien lo obligó a escoger entre ser su soldado o seguir a Jesucristo. El santo escogió la milicia de Cristo; desairado el Emperador, lo amenazó de muerte, pero San Sebastián, convertido en soldado de Cristo por la confirmación, se mantuvo firme en su fe. Enfurecido Maximino, lo condenó a morir asaeteado: los soldados del emperador lo llevaron al estadio, lo desnudaron, lo ataron a un poste y lanzaron sobre él una lluvia de saetas, dándolo por muerto. Sin embargo, sus amigos que estaban al acecho, se acercaron, y al verlo todavía con vida, lo llevaron a casa de una noble cristiana romana, llamada Irene, que lo mantuvo escondido en su casa y le curó las heridas hasta que quedó restablecido. Maximino mandó que lo azotaran hasta morir, y los soldados cumplieron esta vez sin errores la misión y tiraron su cuerpo en un lodazal. Los cristianos lo recogieron y lo enterraron en la Vía Apia, en la célebre catacumba que lleva el nombre de San Sebastián. El culto a San Sebastián es muy antiguo; es invocado contra la peste y contra los enemigos de la religión, y además es llamado además el Apolo cristiano.

Mi embrión tus ojos lo veían » (Sal 139 138, 16): el delito abominable del aborto

La Tradición cristiana —como bien señala la Declaración emitida al respecto por la Congregación para la Doctrina de la Fe⁶¹— es clara y unánime, desde los orígenes hasta nuestros días, en considerar el aborto como desorden moral particularmente grave. Desde que entró en contacto con el mundo greco-romano, en el que estaba difundida la práctica del aborto y del infanticidio, la primera comunidad cristiana se opuso radicalmente, con su doctrina y praxis, a las costumbres difundidas en aquella sociedad, como bien demuestra la ya citada Didaché.⁶² Entre los escritores eclesiásticos del área griega, Atenágoras recuerda que los cristianos consideran como homicidas a las mujeres que recurren a medicinas abortivas, porque los niños, aun estando en el seno de la madre, son ya « objeto, por ende, de la providencia de Dios ».⁶³ Entre los latinos, Tertuliano afirma: « Es un homicidio anticipado impedir el nacimiento; poco importa que se suprima el alma ya nacida o que se la haga desaparecer en el nacimiento. Es ya un hombre aquél que lo será ».⁶⁴

A lo largo de su historia bimilenaria, esta misma doctrina ha sido enseñada constantemente por los Padres de la Iglesia, por sus Pastores y Doctores. Incluso las discusiones de carácter científico y filosófico sobre el momento preciso de la infusión del alma espiritual, nunca han provocado la mínima duda sobre la condena moral del aborto.

CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATÓLICA CAPÍTULO SEGUNDO LOS SACRAMENTOS DE CURACIÓN

ART. 4 EL SACRAMENTO DE LA PENITENCIA Y DE LA RECONCILIACIÓN

X. La celebración del sacramento de la Penitencia

1483 En casos de necesidad grave se puede recurrir a la *celebración comunitaria de la reconciliación con confesión general y absolución general*. Semejante necesidad grave puede presentarse cuando hay un peligro inminente de muerte sin que el sacerdote o los sacerdotes tengan tiempo suficiente para oír la confesión de cada penitente. La necesidad grave puede existir también cuando, teniendo en cuenta el número de penitentes, no hay bastantes confesores para oír debidamente las confesiones individuales en un tiempo razonable, de manera que los penitentes, sin culpa suya, se verían privados durante largo tiempo de la gracia sacramental o de la sagrada comunión. En este caso, los fieles deben tener, para la validez de la absolución, el propósito de confesar individualmente sus pecados graves en su debido tiempo (CIC can 962, §1). Al obispo diocesano corresponde juzgar si existen las condiciones requeridas para la absolución general (CIC can 961, §2). Una gran concurrencia de fieles con ocasión de grandes fiestas o de peregrinaciones no constituyen por su naturaleza ocasión de la referida necesidad grave. (cf CIC can 962, §1, 2)
