

SAINT BONAVENTURE

JULY 15

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It's well known that the Franciscan Order was incredibly influential throughout history. But one of the most challenging times for a new movement is surviving the death of the founder. Bonaventure joined the Franciscan Order almost two decades after the passing of St. Francis. Initially, the young man's theological insights earned him a prime faculty position at the University of Paris. More than his academic skill, however, he was known for his deep devotion to Christ. He was elected the General Minister of the Franciscan Order, right in the thick of controversies. Some friars had conflicting views of how to interpret St. Francis' poverty as the order grew. Others started a new heresy, saying that the Franciscan Order began a new era of the Holy Spirit, replacing the era of Jesus and the authority of the Church. St. Bonaventure weathered these crises with grace, restructuring the order when necessary and offering a more organized perspective on the insights of St. Francis of Assisi.

CHAPTER SIX: AT THE SCHOOL OF MARY, “WOMAN OF THE EUCHARIST”

56. Mary, throughout her life at Christ's side and not only on Calvary, made her own the sacrificial dimension of the Eucharist. When she brought the child Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem “to present him to the Lord” (Lk 2:22), she heard the aged Simeon announce that the child would be a “sign of contradiction” and that a sword would also pierce her own heart (cf. Lk 2:34-35). The tragedy of her Son's crucifixion was thus foretold, and in some sense Mary's Stabat Mater at the foot of the Cross was foreshadowed. In her daily preparation for Calvary, Mary experienced a kind of “anticipated Eucharist” – one might say a “spiritual communion” – of desire and of oblation, which would culminate in her union with her Son in his passion, and then find expression after Easter by her partaking in the Eucharist which the Apostles celebrated as the memorial of that passion.

What must Mary have felt as she heard from the mouth of Peter, John, James and the other Apostles the words spoken at the Last Supper: “This is my body which is given for you” (Lk 22:19)? The body given up for us and made present under sacramental signs was the same body which she had conceived in her womb! For Mary, receiving the Eucharist must have somehow meant welcoming once more into her womb that heart which had beat in unison with hers and reliving what she had experienced at the foot of the Cross.

— MEDITATION —

Do you ever feel restless? I certainly do. Daily tasks and challenges, but also the more basic demand of simply existing — sooner or later, this can all feel crushing and tire us out. Which is why Jesus' words are such stunningly good news: "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). How vastly weird that this man speaks as though he is capable of giving us the deep repose we desire. Is his claim the height of absurd grandiosity? No, because next he immediately proclaims that he is "meek and humble of heart." We here touch a mystery: Jesus is capable of giving us rest because he is the one who forever reposes in the heart of God the Father. He is "yoked" to the Father in his divinity. But he is humbly "yoked" to us, sharing in our humanity. The good news, my fellow tired-out friends: we don't have to despair in our burdens and exhaustion, no matter how heavy they feel. This week, join me in opening our hearts to hear him say to us, "Come! I will give you rest." We come to him in the Church, Eucharist, the Scriptures, prayer, in the poor. There he will give us rest.

COMING BACK TO CHURCH

Question:

I have been away from the Church for a few years and really want to get active again, not so much for me, but for my children. Is this a bad reason to come back to Church?

Answer:

If you are on your way to the supermarket, and you are forced to detour from your usual route because of road work, does the food you buy taste different? Is the meal less filling? Are the vegetables less tasty? Of course not. In our faith journey, there are many detours called sin. Some are greater than others, some are even a bit longer. But God's grace comes to us in ways we understand and recognize and need. Your children leading you back to the Church is not as important as the fact that you are back. This is an opportunity for you to renew, strengthen, and deepen your faith. Regardless of how we get to Church, or what draws us closer to God, the fact is we are there. Do what you need to do to get right with God and the Church. Go to confession, begin good family religious practices, and be involved in the ministries your parish offers. Be more than a lukewarm parishioner. Be the kind of Catholic you want your children to be.

1241 The anointing with sacred chrism, perfumed oil consecrated by the bishop, signifies the gift of the Holy Spirit to the newly baptized, who has become a Christian, that is, one "anointed" by the Holy Spirit, incorporated into Christ who is anointed priest, prophet, and king.⁴¹

1242 In the liturgy of the Eastern Churches, the post-baptismal anointing is the sacrament of Chrismation (Confirmation). In the Roman liturgy the post-baptismal anointing announces a second anointing with sacred chrism to be conferred later by the bishop Confirmation, which will as it were "confirm" and complete the baptismal anointing.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mt 11, 25-30

“Pues mi yugo es suave y mi carga es liviana” (Mateo 11:30). Jesús nos consuela con estas palabras para aligerar las penas de la vida. Seres queridos que se adelantan a nosotros dejando un vacío enorme en el corazón. Violencia que afecta grandemente a nuestras escuelas y vecindarios, pérdida de vidas inocentes, sin sentido. El mundo vacío de amor, y lleno en gran parte de odio y racismo, se debilita cada vez más. ¡Vengan a mí, los cansados, los tristes, los desterrados, que recorren frontera tras frontera para encontrar un mundo mejor! Debemos ir a Jesús para aprender de él, que es manso y humilde de corazón. Es el reto de la Palabra de Dios este domingo.

Con mucha frecuencia, nos dice el papa Francisco: *“El mundo exalta al rico y poderoso, no importa con qué medios, y a veces pisando a la persona humana y su dignidad. Santa Teresa de Jesús de Los Andes

13 de Julio

Teresa de Los Andes, con el lenguaje de su intensa vida, nos confirma que Dios existe, que Dios es amor y alegría, que El es nuestra plenitud. Nació en Santiago de Chile el 13 de julio de 1900. Jovial, alegre, simpática, atractiva, deportista, comunicativa. En los años de su adolescencia alcanzó el perfecto equilibrio súquico y espiritual, fruto de su ascensión y de su oración. La serenidad de su rostro era reflejo de Aquel que en ella vivía. Fue beatificada en Santiago de Chile por [el Papa] Juan Pablo II, el día 3 de abril de 1987. [Y fue] canonizada por el mismo Sumo Pontífice en Roma el 21 de marzo de 1993. Sus restos son venerados en el Santuario de Auco-Rinconada de Los Andes por miles de peregrinos que buscan y encuentran en ella el consuelo, la luz y el camino recto hacia Dios.

« *Hay que obedecer a Dios antes que a los hombres* » (Hch 5, 29): ley civil y ley moral

Es cierto que en la historia ha habido casos en los que se han cometido crímenes en nombre de la « verdad ». Pero crímenes no menos graves y radicales negaciones de la libertad se han cometido y se siguen cometiendo también en nombre del « relativismo ético ». Cuando una mayoría parlamentaria o social decreta la legitimidad de la eliminación de la vida humana aún no nacida, inclusive con ciertas condiciones, ¿acaso no adopta una decisión « tiránica » respecto al ser humano más débil e indefenso? La conciencia universal reacciona justamente ante los crímenes contra la humanidad, de los que nuestro siglo ha tenido tristes experiencias. ¿Acaso estos crímenes dejarían de serlo si, en vez de haber sido cometidos por tiranos sin escrupulo, hubieran estado legitimados por el consenso popular?

En realidad, la democracia no puede mitificarse convirtiéndola en un sustitutivo de la moralidad o en una panacea de la inmoralidad. Fundamentalmente, es un « ordenamiento » y, como tal, un instrumento y no un fin.
