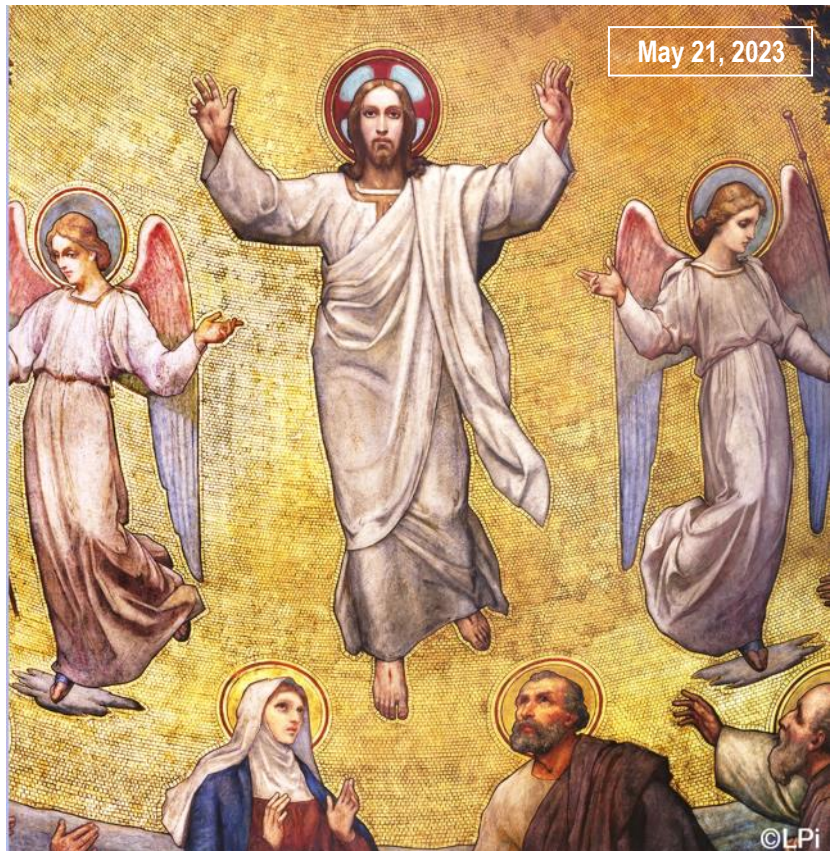

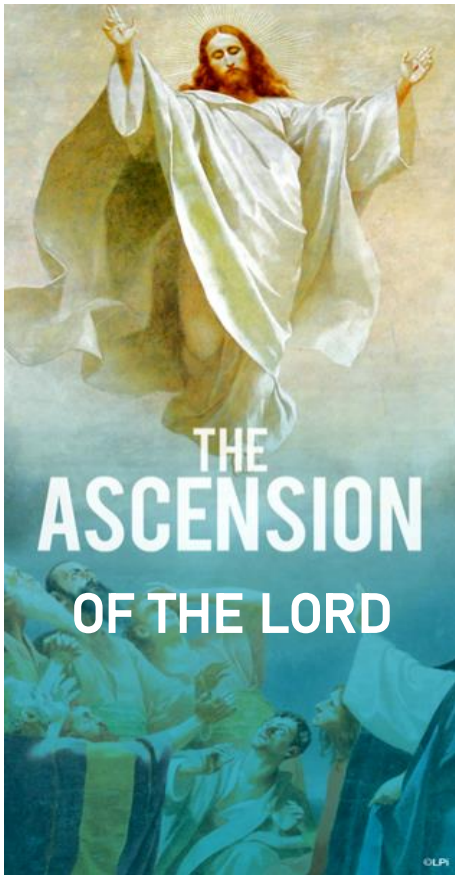

The Feast of the Ascension is the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, which commemorates the Ascension of Christ into heaven, according to Mark 16:19, Luke 24:51, and Acts 1:2. In the Eastern Church this feast was known as *analepsis*, "the taking up", and also as the *episozomene*, the salvation, denoting that by ascending into His glory, Christ completed the work of our redemption. The terms used in the West, *ascensio* and, occasionally, *ascensa*, signify that Christ was raised up by His own powers. Tradition designates Mount Olivet near Bethany as the place where Christ left the earth. The feast falls on Thursday. It is one of the Ecumenical feasts ranking with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter and of Pentecost among the most solemn in the calendar. The feast has a vigil and, since the fifteenth century, an octave which is set apart for a novena of preparation for Pentecost, in accordance with the directions of Leo XIII.

ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH



CHAPTER FIVE: THE DIGNITY OF THE EUCHARISTIC CELEBRATION

It can be said that the Eucharist, while shaping the Church and her spirituality, has also powerfully affected "culture", and the arts in particular.

50. In this effort to adore the mystery grasped in its ritual and aesthetic dimensions, a certain "competition" has taken place between Christians of the West and the East. How could we not give particular thanks to the Lord for the contributions to Christian art made by the great architectural and artistic works of the Greco-Byzantine tradition and of the whole geographical area marked by Slav culture? In the East, sacred art has preserved a remarkably powerful sense of mystery, which leads artists to see their efforts at creating beauty not simply as an expression of their own talents, but also as a genuine service to the faith. Passing well beyond mere technical skill, they have shown themselves docile and open to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

The architectural and mosaic splendours of the Christian East and West are a patrimony belonging to all believers; they contain a hope, and even a pledge, of the desired fullness of communion in faith and in celebration. This would presuppose and demand, as in Rublëv's famous depiction of the Trinity, a profoundly Eucharistic Church in which the presence of the mystery of Christ in the broken bread is as it were immersed in the ineffable unity of the three divine Persons, making of the Church herself an "icon" of the Trinity.

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY

SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION

Article 1 THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

1231 Where infant Baptism has become the form in which this sacrament is usually celebrated, it has become a single act encapsulating the preparatory stages of Christian initiation in a very abridged way. By its very nature infant Baptism requires a post-baptismal catechumenate. Not only is there a need for instruction after Baptism, but also for the necessary flowering of baptismal grace in personal growth. the catechism has its proper place here.

1232 The second Vatican Council restored for the Latin Church "the catechumenate for adults, comprising several distinct steps."³⁴ The rites for these stages are to be found in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).³⁵ The Council also gives permission that: "In mission countries, in addition to what is furnished by the Christian tradition, those elements of initiation rites may be admitted which are already in use among some peoples insofar as they can be adapted to the Christian ritual."³⁶

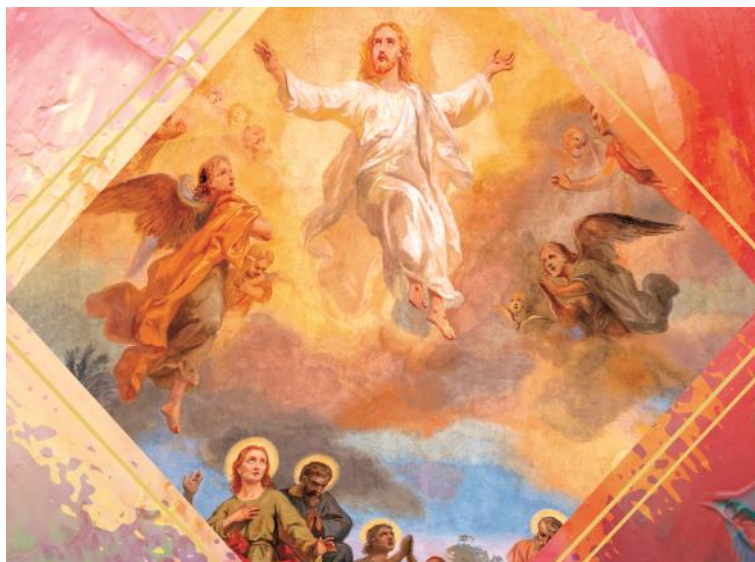

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Jn 17, 1-11

El Evangelio de hoy contiene un mensaje importante para todos nosotros. Jesús pide por el nuevo pueblo santo de Dios. Pide al Padre que nos guarde en su nombre: *“Yo ya no estoy más en el mundo, mientras yo vuelvo a ti. Padre Santo, guárdalos en ese nombre tuyo que a mí me diste, para que sean uno como nosotros”* (Juan 17,11). El Papa Francisco nos dice en su homilía del 16 de agosto del 2014 lo siguiente: *“Es significativo, ante todo, que Jesús pida al Padre que nos consagre y proteja, pero que no nos aparte del mundo. Sabemos que él envía a sus discípulos para que sean fermento de santidad y verdad en el mundo. En esto, los mártires nos muestran el camino”*.

Ahora, también, en la actualidad Jesús, nos sigue invitando a ser testigos de su Evangelio en el ámbito que nos rodea; sea la familia, el trabajo y la sociedad. *“Jesús reza, pide para que la tristeza y el aislamiento no nos gane el corazón. Capítulo III: No Matarás la Ley Santa de Dios « Yo doy la muerte y doy la vida » (Dt 32, 39): el drama de la eutanasia

Esta repugnancia natural a la muerte es iluminada por la fe cristiana y este germen de esperanza en la inmortalidad alcanza su realización por la misma fe, que promete y ofrece la participación en la victoria de Cristo Resucitado: es la victoria de Aquél que, mediante su muerte redentora, ha liberado al hombre de la muerte, « salario del pecado » (Rm 6, 23), y le ha dado el Espíritu, prenda de resurrección y de vida (cf. Rm 8, 11). La certeza de la inmortalidad futura y la esperanza en la resurrección prometida proyectan una nueva luz sobre el misterio del sufrimiento y de la muerte, e infunden en el creyente una fuerza extraordinaria para abandonarse al plan de Dios.

El apóstol Pablo expresó esta novedad como una pertenencia total al Señor que abarca cualquier condición humana: « Ninguno de nosotros vive para sí mismo; como tampoco muere nadie para sí mismo. Si vivimos, para el Señor vivimos; y si morimos, para el Señor morimos. Así que, ya vivamos ya muramos, del Señor somos » (Rm 14, 7-8).
