Mary left Nazareth at the end of March and went south of Jerusalem, to wait upon her cousin Elizabeth. (Lk1:39-57). Feeling the presence of his Divine Savior, John, upon the arrival of Mary, leaped for joy in the womb of [Elizabeth] at that moment he was cleansed from original sin and filled with the grace of God. The earliest evidence of the existence of the feast is its adoption by the Franciscan Chapter in 1263. The feast was assigned to July 2, about the time when Mary returned to Nazareth. Since, during the Schism, many bishops of the opposing obedience would not adopt the new feast, it was confirmed by the Council of Basle, in 1441. Many religious orders -- the Carmelites, Dominicans, Cistercians, Mercedarians, Servites, and others -- as well as Siena, Pisa, Loreto, Vercelli, Cologne, and other dioceses have retained the octave.

ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH



CHAPTER FIVE: THE DIGNITY OF THE EUCHARISTIC CELEBRATION

Within this context of an art aimed at expressing, in all its elements, the meaning of the Eucharist in accordance with the Church's teaching, attention needs to be given to the norms regulating the construction and decor of sacred buildings. As history shows and as I emphasized in my Letter to Artists,¹⁰⁰ the church has always left ample room for the creativity of artists. But sacred art must be outstanding for its ability to express adequately the mystery grasped in the fullness of the Church's faith and in accordance with the pastoral guidelines appropriately laid down by competent Authority. This holds true both for the figurative arts and for sacred music.

51. The development of sacred art and liturgical discipline which took place in lands of ancient Christian heritage is also taking place on continents where Christianity is younger. This was precisely the approach supported by the Second Vatican Council on the need for sound and proper "inculturation". In my numerous Pastoral Visits I have seen, throughout the world, the great vitality which the celebration of the Eucharist can have when marked by the forms, styles and sensibilities of different cultures. By adaptation to the changing conditions of time and place, the Eucharist offers sustenance not only to individuals but to entire peoples, and it shapes cultures inspired by Christianity.

It's just that the gifts from this celebration need to be used or the celebration will be hollow. The gifts are free to us even though they are priceless. It would be poor stewardship to toss them in the garage with all those toys that time forgot.

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Sharing Your Faith

Question:

My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

Answer:

There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns. Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you!

Christian Initiation

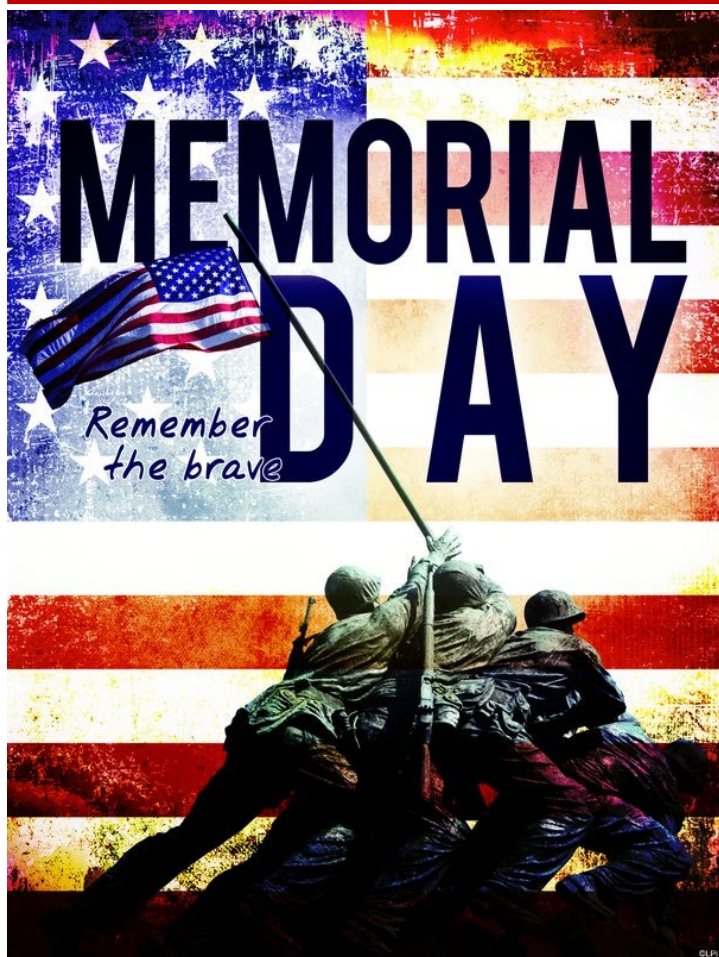
1233 Today in all the rites, Latin and Eastern, the Christian initiation of adults begins with their entry into the catechumenate and reaches its culmination in a single celebration of the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist.³⁷ In the Eastern rites the Christian initiation of infants also begins with Baptism followed immediately by Confirmation and the Eucharist, while in the Roman rite it is followed by years of catechesis before being completed later by Confirmation and the Eucharist, the summit of their Christian initiation.³⁸

The mystagogy of the celebration

1234 The meaning and grace of the sacrament of Baptism are clearly seen in the rites of its celebration. By following the gestures and words of this celebration with attentive participation, the faithful are initiated into the riches this sacrament signifies and actually brings about in each newly baptized person.

Capítulo III: No Matarás la Ley Santa de Dios « Yo doy la muerte y doy la vida » (Dt 32, 39): el drama de la eutanasia

Morir para el Señor significa vivir la propia muerte como acto supremo de obediencia al Padre (cf. Flp 2, 8), aceptando encontrarla en la « hora » querida y escogida por El (cf. Jn 13, 1), que es el único que puede decir cuándo el camino terreno se ha concluido. Vivir para el Señor significa también reconocer que el sufrimiento, aun siendo en sí mismo un mal y una prueba, puede siempre llegar a ser fuente de bien. Llega a serlo si se vive con amor y por amor, participando, por don gratuito de Dios y por libre decisión personal, en el sufrimiento mismo de Cristo crucificado. De este modo, quien vive su sufrimiento en el Señor se configura más plenamente a El (cf. Flp 3, 10; 1 P 2, 21) y se asocia más íntimamente a su obra redentora en favor de la Iglesia y de la humanidad.⁸⁷ Esta es la experiencia del Apóstol, que toda persona que sufre está también llamada a revivir: « Me alegro por los padecimientos que soporto por vosotros, y completo en mi carne lo que falta a las tribulaciones de Cristo, en favor de su Cuerpo, que es la Iglesia » (Col 1, 24).
