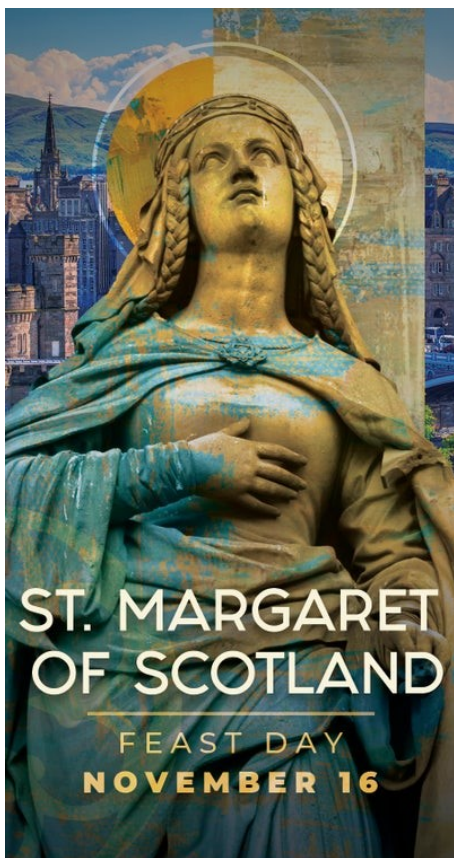

Saint Margaret was born in exile around 1045, in what is now Hungary. She is the daughter of Princess Agatha of Hungary and Edward the Atheling the Anglo-Saxon heir to the throne of England. The family returned to England, but Edward died soon after their arrival. Agatha and her children fled the country. They were shipwrecked off the coast of Scotland. King Malcolm Canmore III took the exiles under his wing, and he fell in love with the beautiful and gracious Margaret. The couple were married in 1070 at castle of Dunfermline. Margaret and Malcolm had eight children. The saint led a life of austerity, aiding Church reform, promoting Easter communion, and founding churches and monasteries and pilgrimage hostels. Saint Margaret, Queen of Scotland, died on November 16, 1093. She was canonized by Pope Innocent IV in 1250 and named patron of Scotland in 1673.

Relying on Revelation, Not Reason

19. Hence the Christian people often follow the lead of St. Thomas and sing the words: "Sight, touch and taste in Thee are each deceived; The ear alone most safely is believed. I believe all the Son of God has spoken; Than truth's own word, there is no truer token."

20. And St. Bonaventure declares: "There is no difficulty over Christ's being present in the sacrament as in a sign; the great difficulty is in the fact that He is really in the sacrament, as He is in heaven. And so believing this is especially meritorious." (7)

21. Moreover, the Holy Gospel alludes to this when it tells of the many disciples of Christ who turned away and left Our Lord, after hearing Him speak of eating His flesh and drinking His blood. "This is strange talk," they said. "Who can be expected to listen to it" Peter, on the contrary, replied to Jesus' question as to whether the twelve wanted to go away too by promptly and firmly expressing his own faith and that of the other Apostles in these marvelous words: "Lord, to whom should we go? Thy words are the words of eternal life." (8)

Chances are you will be reading next week's reflection and nothing too earth changing will have happened. But then, maybe, just maybe, this time is when we all lose that bet.

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32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — Meditation —

Lately I've been enjoying the deep meaning of Eastern icons. I love how they express a tapestry of meaning in a way that can surpass the written or spoken word. Today's parable of the ten virgins from Jesus is a good example. Try googling "wise and foolish virgins icon" and you'll see an image of how our Christ meets our heart's deepest needs if we attend to him with the proper attitude. We notice, too, that the foolish virgins look *exactly* the same as the wise ones in their clothes, hair, and expressions. The only difference is they departed to buy oil and now they are sadly excluded. We often act like consumers in the marketplace to fulfill our need for love and mercy. We'll *always* end up disappointed if we shop around. Jesus sums up the moral of the story this way: "Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour." Watch, remain, don't spiritually shop. It is *always* better to quietly remain close to the Eucharistic community of the Church, even if we feel like our oil has run out. This week let's consider placing the icon of the wise and foolish virgins on our phone lock screen or computer desktop to help us remember to stay close to him, especially when life feels dark.

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CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Article 1 THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM. VII. The Grace of Baptism. Incorporated into the Church, the Body of Christ

1270 "Reborn as sons of God, [the baptized] must profess before men the faith they have received from God through the Church" and participate in the apostolic and missionary activity of the People of God.⁷⁹

The sacramental bond of the unity of Christians

1271 Baptism constitutes the foundation of communion among all Christians, including those who are not yet in full communion with the Catholic Church: "For men who believe in Christ and have been properly baptized are put in some, though imperfect, communion with the Catholic Church. Justified by faith in Baptism, [they] are incorporated into Christ; they therefore have a right to be called Christians, and with good reason are accepted as brothers by the children of the Catholic Church."⁸⁰ "Baptism therefore constitutes the sacramental bond of unity existing among all who through it are reborn."⁸¹

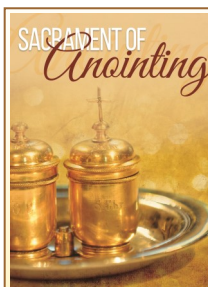

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mt 25, 1-13

« *Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo* »
(Lc 10, 27): « *promueve* » la vida

77. En esta ley nueva se inspira y plasma el mandamiento « no matarás ». Por tanto, para el cristiano implica en definitiva el imperativo de respetar, amar y promover la vida de cada hermano, según las exigencias y las dimensiones del amor de Dios en Jesucristo. « El dio su vida por nosotros. También nosotros debemos dar la vida por los hermanos » (1 Jn 3, 16).

El mandamiento « no matarás », incluso en sus contenidos más positivos de respeto, amor y promoción de la vida humana, obliga a todo hombre. En efecto, resuena en la conciencia moral de cada uno como un eco permanente de la alianza original de Dios creador con el hombre; puede ser conocido por todos a la luz de la razón y puede ser observado gracias a la acción misteriosa del Espíritu que, soplando donde quiere (cf. Jn 3, 8), alcanza y compromete a cada hombre que vive en este mundo.
