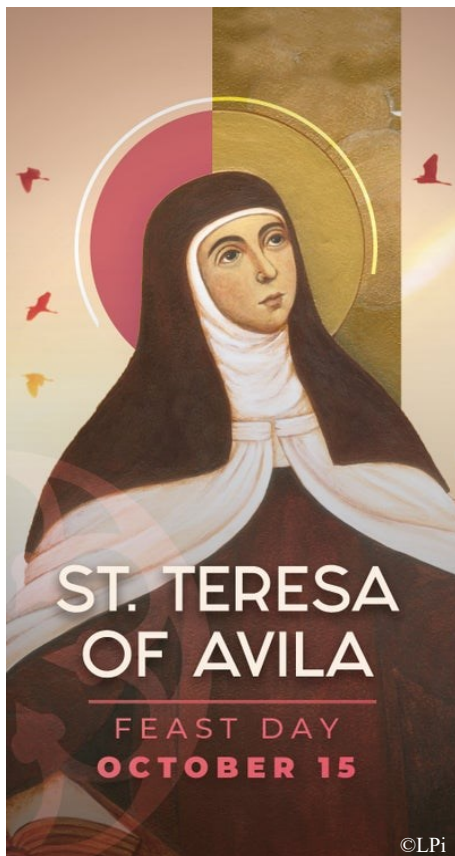

St. Teresa of Ávila (1515-1582) was a Spanish Carmelite nun who lived in the 16th century. She was a mystic and author of spiritual writings. The originator of the Carmelite Reform, she founded numerous convents throughout Spain. She became well known for the mystical experiences, many of which she described in her autobiography. The first of only four women to be named a Doctor of the Church, St. Teresa's ascetic doctrine and Carmelite reforms shaped Roman Catholic contemplative life, and her writings on the Christian soul's journey to God are considered works of art. Her writings, especially the "Way of Perfection" and "The Interior Castle," have helped generations of believers. St. Teresa of Avila died on Oct. 15, 1582. She was canonized on March 22, 1622, along with contemporary: St. Ignatius Loyola.

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MYSTERIUM FIDEI ENCYCLICAL OF POPE PAUL VI ON THE HOLY EUCHARIST



SEPTEMBER 3, 1965

Purpose of the Encyclical

13. And so, with the aim of seeing to it that the hope to which the Council has given rise—that a new wave of Eucharistic devotion will sweep over the Church—not be reduced to nil through the sowing of the seeds of false opinions, We have decided to use Our apostolic authority and speak Our mind to you on this subject, Venerable Brothers.

14. We certainly do not deny that those who are spreading these strange opinions are making a praiseworthy effort to investigate this lofty Mystery and to set forth its inexhaustible riches and to make it more understandable to the men of today; rather, We acknowledge this and We approve of it. But We cannot approve the opinions that they set forth, and We have an obligation to warn you about the grave danger that these opinions involve for true faith.

THE WEDDING GARMENT

I like to think that any self-respecting doomsday prepper would find something to admire in my van's stores of extra clothes, snacks, boredom-busting toys, sunscreen, and seasonal outerwear. You never know when you're going to pass a free splash pad. And you never know when one of the kids is going to find the world's most irresistible mud pile or fall into a river. All this pre-planning for fun and disaster, and still, I usually devote a fraction of that effort to spiritual preparedness. I swap out my traveling first-aid kit every season, imagining hypothetical emergencies — and I push confession off another week. "I haven't committed any mortal sins," I tell myself, "And I'm just so busy." I shrug off the daily examinations of conscience that could help me overcome a persistent sin. I stock my purse with bags of Cheerios to ward off sneaky attacks of kid hunger — and I fall asleep without saying the Rosary, murmuring to myself: "I'm so tired. Mary understands." I am overwhelmed by the here-and-now, consumed by the minutiae of earthly life, that I forget there is only one eventuality I — or any of us — can expect with any certainty. We will all be invited to the feast. Is my van stocked for that? *"The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?'" — Matthew 22:12*

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28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — Meditation —

I confess that I have a soft spot for the scary things Jesus says because they are usually ignored. But there's gold in them thar hills, if we have courage to look. This week Jesus gives us a terrifying warning in his parable about the king who gives a marriage feast for his son and promptly goes berserk when people don't respond. The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. To Jesus, your life matters. The universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that he is inviting us, therefore our lives matter a great deal. There is a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. But how wonderful must the consequences of our 'yes' be?

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CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION

Article 1 THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

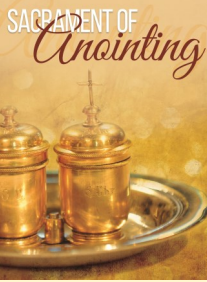
For the forgiveness of sins . . .

1263 By Baptism all sins are forgiven, original sin and all personal sins, as well as all punishment for sin.⁶⁵ In those who have been reborn nothing remains that would impede their entry into the Kingdom of God, neither Adam's sin, nor personal sin, nor the consequences of sin, the gravest of which is separation from God.

1264 Yet certain temporal consequences of sin remain in the baptized, such as suffering, illness, death, and such frailties inherent in life as weaknesses of character, and so on, as well as an inclination to sin that Tradition calls concupiscence, or metaphorically, "the tinder for sin" (fomes peccati); since concupiscence "is left for us to wrestle with, it cannot harm those who do not consent but manfully resist it by the grace of Jesus Christ."⁶⁶ Indeed, "an athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules."⁶⁷

**« Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo » (Lc 10, 27):
« promueve » la vida**

75. Los mandamientos de Dios nos enseñan el camino de la vida. Los preceptos morales negativos, es decir, los que declaran moralmente inaceptable la elección de una determinada acción, tienen un valor absoluto para la libertad humana: obligan siempre y en toda circunstancia, sin excepción. Indican que la elección de determinados comportamientos es radicalmente incompatible con el amor a Dios y la dignidad de la persona, creada a su imagen. Por eso, esta elección no puede justificarse por la bondad de ninguna intención o consecuencia, está en contraste insalvable con la comunión entre las personas, contradice la decisión fundamental de orientar la propia vida a Dios.⁹⁹
