

## ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH

### CHAPTER FOUR: THE EUCHARIST AND ECCLESIAL COMMUNION

The faithful observance of the body of norms established in this area 99 is a manifestation and, at the same time, a guarantee of our love for Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, for our brothers and sisters of different Christian confessions – who have a right to our witness to the truth – and for the cause itself of the promotion of unity.

### CHAPTER FIVE: THE DIGNITY OF THE EUCHARISTIC CELEBRATION

47. Reading the account of the institution of the Eucharist in the Synoptic Gospels, we are struck by the simplicity and the solemnity” with which Jesus, on the evening of the Last Supper, instituted this great sacrament. There is an episode which in some way serves as its prelude: the anointing at Bethany. A woman, whom John identifies as Mary the sister of Lazarus, pours a flask of costly ointment over Jesus' head, which provokes from the disciples – and from Judas in particular (cf. Mt 26:8; Mk 14:4; Jn 12:4) – an indignant response, as if this act, in light of the needs of the poor, represented an intolerable “waste”. But Jesus' own reaction is completely different. While in no way detracting from the duty of charity towards the needy, for whom the disciples must always show special care – “the poor you will always have with you” (Mt 26, 11; Mk 14:7; cf. Jn 12:8) – he looks towards his imminent death and burial, and sees this act of anointing as an anticipation of the honour which his body will continue to merit even after his death, indissolubly bound as it is to the mystery of his person.

ST. CATHERINE  
OF SIENA  
DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

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Born in Siena, on the feast of the Annunciation, March 25, 1347, Catherine was the 23rd of Jacopo and Lapa Benincasa's 25 children. Her twin sister died in infancy. When she was seven years old she had the first of her mystical visions, in which she saw Jesus surrounded by saints and seated in glory. In the same year she vowed to consecrate her virginity to Christ. When, at the age of 16, her parents decided that she should marry, she cut off her hair to make herself less appealing, and her father, realizing that he couldn't contend with her resolve, let her have her way. She joined the Dominican Tertiaries and lived a deep and solitary life of prayer and meditation for the next three years in which she had constant mystical experiences. She began tending to the sick, poor, and marginalized, especially lepers. In 1375, while visiting Pisa, she received the stigmata, even though they never appeared on her body during her lifetime, owing to her request to God. They appeared only on her incorruptible body after her death. She died in Rome on April 29, 1380, at the age of 33.

## CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATION OF THE PASCHAL MYSTERY

### Article 2 LITURGICAL DIVERSITY AND THE UNITY OF THE MYSTERY

#### Liturgical traditions and the catholicity of the Church

**1225** In his Passover Christ opened to all men the fountain of Baptism. He had already spoken of his Passion, which he was about to suffer in Jerusalem, as a "Baptism" with which he had to be baptized.<sup>22</sup> The blood and water that flowed from the pierced side of the crucified Jesus are types of Baptism and the Eucharist, the sacraments of new life.<sup>23</sup> From then on, it is possible "to be born of water and the Spirit"<sup>24</sup> in order to enter the Kingdom of God. See where you are baptized, see where Baptism comes from, if not from the cross of Christ, from his death. There is the whole mystery: he died for you. In him you are redeemed, in him you are saved.<sup>25</sup>



### MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Lc 24, 13-35

Aquellos dos peregrinos iban desilusionados por el camino, mientras escapaban de Jerusalén. Pero, en el camino a casa, se encontraron con Jesús sin reconocerlo. Eso es lo interesante, que aquel hombre parecía no saber nada de la realidad del Viernes Santo, de aquella muerte escandalosa en la cruz. Para sorpresa de los caminantes, el hombre derrochaba bondad, sabiduría en la Escritura y fe. Se les abrieron los ojos al partir el pan y es ahí donde reconocen a Jesús. El diálogo profundo con aquel caminante y su cena con él, los hizo volver con entusiasmo a la comunidad que ya habían decidido abandonar: “¿No sentíamos arde nuestro corazón cuando nos hablaba en el camino y nos explicaba las Escrituras?” (Lucas 24,32). Quédate con nosotros, Señor, te necesitamos como compañero de nuestro camino. Sal a nuestro encuentro en la familia y la sociedad. ¿Conoce a alguien triste y sin esperanza, enfermo o abandonado? Acérquese a esta persona y ofrézcale su amor y su cariño, compártale el pan y la sabiduría que este Evangelio de Emaús nos ofrece. El reto y la invitación en esta Pascua es ser un cristiano comprometido que alegre el camino de los que lo rodean. También se nos invita a leer y meditar la Sagrada Escritura en familia.

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## Mensaje de Pascua y Bendición Urbi et Orbi 2023 del Papa Francisco



Es la misma alegría por la que Pedro, viendo a Jesús resucitado a orillas del lago de Galilea, no pudo quedarse en la barca con los demás, sino que se tiró al agua de inmediato para nadar rápidamente hacia Él (cf. Jn 21,7). En definitiva, en Pascua el andar se acelera y se vuelve una carrera, porque la humanidad ve la meta de su camino, el sentido de su destino, Jesucristo, y está llamada a ir de prisa hacia Él, esperanza del mundo.

Apresurémonos también nosotros a crecer en un camino de confianza recíproca: confianza entre las personas, entre los pueblos y las naciones. Dejémonos sorprender por el gozoso anuncio de la Pascua, por la luz que ilumina las tinieblas y las oscuridades que se ciernen tantas veces sobre el mundo.

Apresurémonos a superar los conflictos y las divisiones, y a abrir nuestros corazones a quien más lo necesita. Apresurémonos a recorrer senderos de paz y de fraternidad. Alegrémonos por los signos concretos de esperanza que nos llegan de tantos países, empezando de aquellos que ofrecen asistencia y acogida a quienes huyen de la guerra y de la pobreza.

Pero a lo largo del camino todavía hay muchas piedras de tropiezo, que hacen arduo y fatigoso nuestro apresurarnos hacia el Resucitado. A Él dirijamos nuestra súplica: ¡ayúdanos a correr hacia Ti! ¡Ayúdanos a abrir nuestros corazones!

Ayuda al amado pueblo ucraniano en el camino hacia la paz e infunde la luz pascual sobre el pueblo ruso. Conforta a los heridos y a cuantos han perdido a sus seres queridos a causa de la guerra, y haz que los prisioneros puedan volver sanos y salvos con sus familias. Abre los corazones de toda la comunidad internacional para que se esfuerce por poner fin a esta guerra y a todos los conflictos que ensangrientan al mundo, comenzando por Siria, que aún espera la paz.

Sostiene a cuantos han sido afectados por el violento terremoto en Turquía y en la misma Siria. Recemos por cuantos han perdido familiares y amigos, y se quedaron sin casa; que puedan recibir consuelo de Dios y ayuda de la familia de las naciones.

Capítulo III: No Matarás la Ley Santa de Dios « *Yo doy la muerte y doy la vida* » (Dt 32, 39): *el drama de la eutanasia*

66. Ahora bien, el suicidio es siempre moralmente inaceptable, al igual que el homicidio. La tradición de la Iglesia siempre lo ha rechazado como decisión gravemente mala. 83 Aunque determinados condicionamientos psicológicos, culturales y sociales puedan llevar a realizar un gesto que contradice tan radicalmente la inclinación innata de cada uno a la vida, atenuando o anulando la responsabilidad subjetiva, el suicidio, bajo el punto de vista objetivo, es un acto gravemente inmoral, porque comporta el rechazo del amor a sí mismo y la renuncia a los deberes de justicia y de caridad para con el prójimo, para con las distintas comunidades de las que se forma parte y para la sociedad en general. 84 En su realidad más profunda, constituye un rechazo de la soberanía absoluta de Dios sobre la vida y sobre la muerte, proclamada así en la oración del antiguo sabio de Israel: « Tú tienes el poder sobre la vida y sobre la muerte, haces bajar a las puertas del Hades y de allí subir » (Sb 16, 13; cf. Tb 13, 2).
