

We pray the World Youth Day in Lisbon will help young people to live and witness the Gospel in their own lives.





CONCLUSION

61. The mystery of the Eucharist – sacrifice, presence, banquet – *does not allow for reduction or exploitation*; it must be experienced and lived in its integrity, both in its celebration and in the intimate converse with Jesus which takes place after receiving communion or in a prayerful moment of Eucharistic adoration apart from Mass. These are times when the Church is firmly built up and it becomes clear what she truly is: one, holy, catholic and apostolic; the people, temple and family of God; the body and bride of Christ, enlivened by the Holy Spirit; the universal sacrament of salvation and a hierarchically structured communion.

The path taken by the Church in these first years of the third millennium is also a *path of renewed ecumenical commitment*. The final decades of the second millennium, culminating in the Great Jubilee, have spurred us along this path and called for all the baptized to respond to the prayer of Jesus “*ut unum sint*” (Jn 17:11). The path itself is long and strewn with obstacles greater than our human resources alone can overcome, yet we have the Eucharist, and in its presence we can hear in the depths of our hearts, as if they were addressed to us, the same words heard by the Prophet Elijah: “Arise and eat, else the journey will be too great for you” (1 Kg 19:7). The treasure of the Eucharist, which the Lord places before us, impels us towards the goal of full sharing with all our brothers and sisters to whom we are joined by our common Baptism. But if this treasure is not to be squandered, we need to respect the demands which derive from its being the sacrament of communion in faith and in apostolic succession.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

The Jubilee Year of Mercy is now in the history books and looking back I wonder if I have been changed at all by the observance. Certainly the focus on mercy wasn't all about God's mercy toward me? Yes, I focused on my sin and the need for God's forgiveness and grace, but hopefully that changed how I live my life and how I offer mercy to others.

The mercy we receive from God is not something we are to keep bottled up or hidden from others. Jesus taught us to treat others the way we would like to be treated and to love everyone, even our enemies. When Jesus healed the Canaanite woman I wonder what she did next. I would hope she in turn offered mercy and healing to others. Of course, I know she was imperfect just like me so I am sure in no time she was back to needing the mercy of Jesus. Her demon was gone, but there is always a new evil around every corner.

However, the fact that we are a broken people always in need of mercy does not lessen the command for us to offer mercy. Mercy is a gift like so many others that God lavishes on us with great generosity. We are called to cultivate this and share it with others as well. If we cannot do that then what was the real effect of God's mercy in our lives? If we do not allow God to change us into more generous stewards ready to offer mercy and love to all, then perhaps we are fooling ourselves that we are true disciples of Jesus at all.

20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

— Meditation —

The suffering of a child symbolizes uniquely terrible evil as well as despair about the future. This week's Gospel gives a "limit" case in which Jesus encounters this evil in the form of a mother with a suffering daughter. What he does is stunning and massively helpful for us if we bravely ponder the details. The Canaanite woman comes to Jesus and begs his mercy. "My daughter is tormented by a demon," she declares to him. Shockingly, he responds first with silence, then with a dismissive comment, and only then finally accedes to her third request. Is this simply a lesson in perseverance in our petitions to God, who is like a genie in a bottle? Does that justify the humiliation and pain this woman suffers? Is the Lord cruel? I don't think so. Notice how the encounter ends. She compares herself to a dog at the table of a master. Jesus responds by praising her great faith and fulfills her deep desire. Somehow this non-Israelite woman intuits that this harrowing situation is not dumb suffering. She senses that the door of God's family is, in Jesus, being opened to her and her loved ones. She trusts she is at the Lord's table, and her desires will be fulfilled and that all her sufferings — and her daughter's, too — will lead a great banquet. In our sufferings this week, the Lord wants us to treat him less like a genie in a bottle and more like the Master who has taken us — lost little dogs that we are — into his home forever. Trust that and keep praying in the face of evil.

The Baptism of infants

Born with a fallen human nature and tainted by original sin, children also have need of the new birth in Baptism to be freed from the power of darkness and brought into the realm of the freedom of the children of God, to which all men are called.⁵⁰ The sheer gratuitousness of the grace of salvation is particularly manifest in infant Baptism. The Church and the parents would deny a child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God were they not to confer Baptism shortly after birth.⁵¹

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mt 15, 21-28

Un domingo más que se nos habla de la fe. Ahora, mostrada en una mujer cananea que suplicaba para que su hija fuera curada. Recordemos que el pueblo cananeo, en tiempos de Jesús, era idólatra y primitivo. De ahí surge la mujer que, con gran insistencia, suplicaba a Jesús por su hija. Esta mujer era valiente, con una fe segura, y fue así que decidida se postra ante Jesús para seguir pidiendo: “*Jesús, ayúdame!*” Jesús le dijo: *No se debe echar a los perros el pan de los hijos.* La mujer contestó: *Es verdad Señor, pero también los perritos comen las migajas que caen de la mesa de sus amos.* Entonces Jesús le dijo: *Mujer, ¡qué grande es tu fe! Que se cumpla tu deseo*” (Mateo 15:25-28).

La mujer fue felicitada por Jesús, y es puesta como ejemplo para sus discípulos entonces, y para nosotros actualmente. *Cristo se mostraba indiferente hacia ella, no por rechazarle la misericordia, sino para inflamar su deseo*” (San Agustín). ¿Qué haces tú cuando estás en una necesidad? Gritas, suplicas de rodillas al Señor para que te escuche. Acuédate que la oración viene según la fe. ¿Cómo mides tu fe? ¿Es débil, es fuerte, es constante? Buscas a Jesús en todo momento o solo en tiempos difíciles. El domingo pasado, Pedro al hundirse en el agua exclamó: “*Señor, sálvame*”. Hoy, la mujer cananea grita: “*Señor, ayúdame*”. El Señor, escucha y atiende al que persevera constantemente con fe y esperanza en la oración. Qué hermoso es escuchar: “*Que se cumpla tu deseo*”.

Carta Encíclica Evangelium Vitae del Sumo Pontífice Juan Pablo II a los Obispos a los Sacerdotes y Diáconos a los Religiosos a los Fieles Laicos y a todas las personas de buena voluntad sobre el valor y el carácter inviolable de la vida humana.

72. En continuidad con toda la tradición de la Iglesia se encuentra también la doctrina sobre la necesaria conformidad de la ley civil con la ley moral, tal y como se recoge, una vez más, en la citada encíclica de Juan XXIII: « La autoridad es postulada por el orden moral y deriva de Dios. Por lo tanto, si las leyes o preceptos de los gobernantes estuvieran en contradicción con aquel orden y, consiguientemente, en contradicción con la voluntad de Dios, no tendrían fuerza para obligar en conciencia...; más aún, en tal caso, la autoridad dejaría de ser tal y degeneraría en abuso ».⁹⁵ Esta es una clara enseñanza de santo Tomás de Aquino, que entre otras cosas escribe: « La ley humana es tal en cuanto está conforme con la recta razón y, por tanto, deriva de la ley eterna. En cambio, cuando una ley está en contraste con la razón, se la denomina ley inicua; sin embargo, en este caso deja de ser ley y se convierte más bien en un acto de violencia ».⁹⁶ Y añade: « Toda ley puesta por los hombres tiene razón de ley en cuanto deriva de la ley natural. Por el contrario, si contradice en cualquier cosa a la ley natural, entonces no será ley sino corrupción de la ley ».⁹⁷
