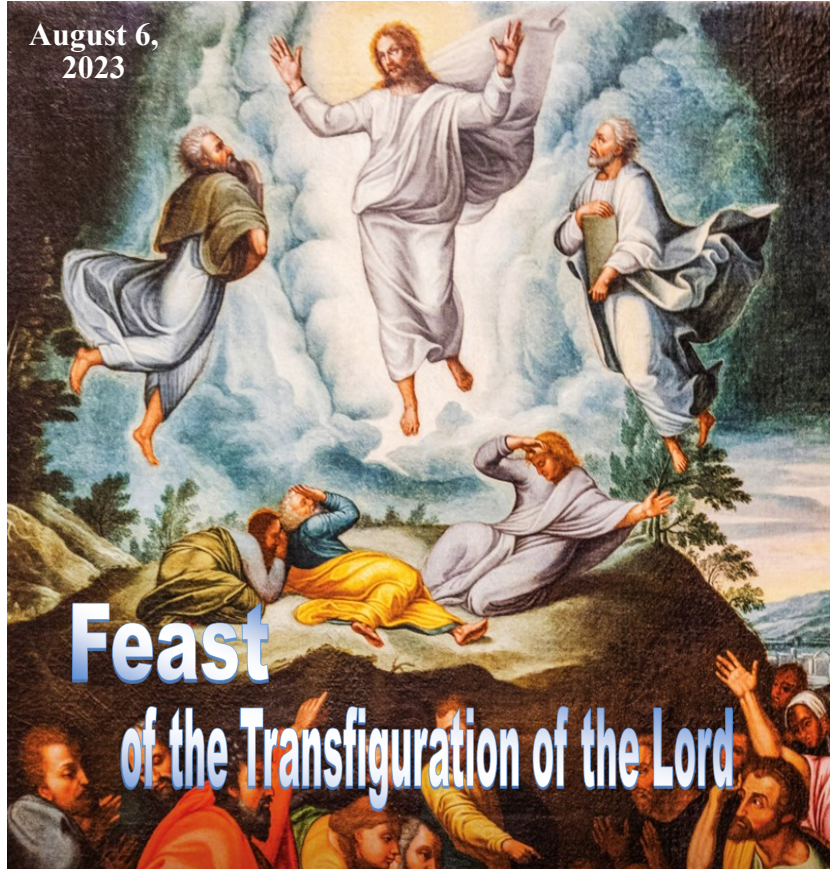

ST. CLARE OF ASSISI

AUGUST 11TH

Saint Clare was born in 1193 in Assisi to a noble family. Before her birth, her mother received a sign that her daughter would be a bright light of God in the world. As a child she was already very strongly drawn to the things of God, praying fervently, devoutly visiting the Blessed Sacrament, and manifesting a tender love towards the poor. When Clare was 22, St. Francis placed her in a small house beside the convent and made her superior, a post she should serve for the next 42 years of her life until her death. The 'Poor Clares' as they came to be known, lived an unusually austere life for women of the time, walking barefoot around the town begging for alms, wearing sackcloth, and living without any possessions, completely dependent for their food on what was given to them. But the emphasis of their lives was, and still is, contemplation. Clare's reputation for holiness was such that the Pope himself came to her deathbed in 1253 to give her absolution, and wanted to canonize her immediately on her death, but was advised by his cardinals to wait. Claire died in absolute tranquility. She was canonized in 1255, two years after her death.

CONCLUSION

Allow me, dear brothers and sisters, to share with deep emotion, as a means of accompanying and strengthening your faith, my own testimony of faith in the Most Holy Eucharist. *Ave verum corpus natum de Maria Virgine, vere passum, immolatum, in cruce pro homine!* Here is the Church's treasure, the heart of the world, the pledge of the fulfilment for which each man and woman, even unconsciously, yearns. A great and transcendent mystery, indeed, and one that taxes our mind's ability to pass beyond appearances. Here our senses fail us: *visus, tactus, gustus in te fallitur*, in the words of the hymn *Adoro Te Devote*; yet faith alone, rooted in the word of Christ handed down to us by the Apostles, is sufficient for us. Allow me, like Peter at the end of the Eucharistic discourse in John's Gospel, to say once more to Christ, in the name of the whole Church and in the name of each of you: "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (Jn 6:68).

WHAT ARE "SPECIAL" MASSES?

Question:

Why do Parishes Offer Special Masses like Thanksgiving and Memorial Day, even though they're not Holy Days of Obligation? Am I obligated to attend?

Answer:

Out of respect for the various civil celebrations that take place during the year, many dioceses and parishes will host special Masses. However, while it always worthwhile to come together to worship as a community, Catholics are not obligated to attend these celebrations. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church notes, the only times that we are obligated to participate in celebrations of the Eucharist are on Sundays and holy days of obligation:

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

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THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

— Meditation —

What is Christianity finally about? These days if you ask almost anyone who doesn't know the Bible you'll probably hear an answer like this: "Being a good person" or "following the golden rule." No offense to the golden rule, but our faith is simply much stranger than that. This week's feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this. Jesus becomes radiantly and overwhelmingly beautiful. The glory of God literally shines forth from his body and even his clothes. Here we see that Christianity is not mainly a moral system, but a relationship with God in Christ, one that finally makes human beings gloriously beautiful.

Now we can see our good and bad deeds in a new and de-centered way. Our morality isn't about a heaven or hell scorecard. It's about lives open (or closed) to transfiguration, lives capable of revealing the glory of God in Christ to the world. Spouses, children, friends, co-workers, priests, consecrated women and men, and so on — we are all called to let the beauty of Jesus make our lives beautiful, little by little. His beauty in us is the center of our faith.

The Baptism of adults

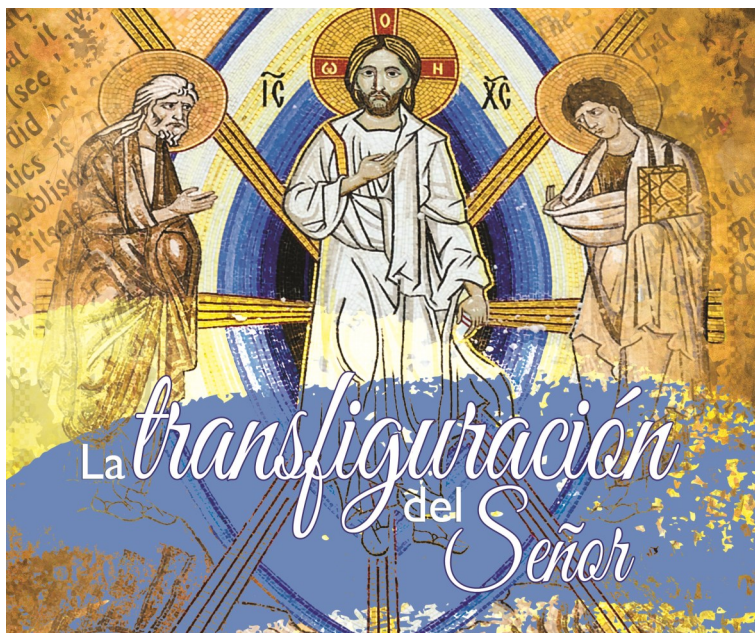

Mt 17, 1-9

Carta Encíclica *Evangelium Vitae* del Sumo Pontífice Juan Pablo II a los Obispos a los Sacerdotes y Diáconos a los Religiosos a los Fieles Laicos y a todas las personas de buena voluntad sobre el valor y el carácter inviolable de la vida humana.

Ciertamente, el cometido de la ley civil es diverso y de ámbito más limitado que el de la ley moral. Sin embargo, « en ningún ámbito de la vida la ley civil puede sustituir a la conciencia ni dictar normas que excedan la propia competencia », ⁹⁰ que es la de asegurar el bien común de las personas, mediante el reconocimiento y la defensa de sus derechos fundamentales, la promoción de la paz y de la moralidad pública. ⁹¹ En efecto, la función de la ley civil consiste en garantizar una ordenada convivencia social en la verdadera justicia, para que todos « podamos vivir una vida tranquila y apacible con toda piedad y dignidad » (1 Tm 2, 2). Precisamente por esto, la ley civil debe asegurar a todos los miembros de la sociedad el respeto de algunos derechos fundamentales, que pertenecen originariamente a la persona y que toda ley positiva debe reconocer y garantizar. Entre ellos el primero y fundamental es el derecho inviolable de cada ser humano inocente a la vida. Si la autoridad pública puede, a veces, renunciar a reprimir aquello que provocaría, de estar prohibido, un daño más grave, ⁹² sin embargo, nunca puede aceptar legitimar, como derecho de los individuos —aunque éstos fueran la mayoría de los miembros de la sociedad—, la ofensa infligida a otras personas mediante la negación de un derecho suyo tan fundamental como el de la vida. La tolerancia legal del aborto o de la eutanasia no puede de ningún modo invocar el respeto de la conciencia de los demás, precisamente porque la sociedad tiene el derecho y el deber de protegerse de los abusos que se pueden dar en nombre de la conciencia y bajo el pretexto de la libertad. ⁹³

Los signos del pan y del vino

Al convertirse misteriosamente en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, los signos del pan y del vino siguen significando también la bondad de la creación. Así, en el ofertorio, damos gracias al Creador por el pan y el vino (cf *Sal* 104,13-15), fruto "del trabajo del hombre", pero antes, "fruto de la tierra" y "de la vid", dones del Creador. La Iglesia ve en el gesto de Melquisedec, rey y sacerdote, que "ofreció pan y vino" (*Gn* 14,18), una prefiguración de su propia ofrenda (cf *Plegaria Eucarística I o Canon Romano*, 95; *Misal Romano*).
