



New Offering of the New Testament

29. Moreover, the Apostle Paul, who faithfully transmitted to us what he had received from the Lord, (17) is clearly speaking of the Eucharistic Sacrifice when he points out that Christians ought not take part in pagan sacrifices, precisely because they have been made partakers of the table of the Lord. "Is not this cup we bless," he says, "a participation in Christ's Blood? Is not the Bread we break a participation in Christ's Body? . . . To drink the Lord's cup, and yet to drink the cup of evil spirits, to share the Lord's feast, and to share the feast of evil spirits, is impossible for you." (18) Foreshadowed by Malachias, (19) this new oblation of the New Testament has always been offered by the Church, in accordance with the teaching of Our Lord and the Apostles, "not only to atone for the sins and punishments and satisfactions of the living faithful and to appeal for their other needs, but also to help those who have died in Christ but have not yet been completely purified." (20)

Born in Holland, St. Peter Canisius (May 1521 – December 1597) was a preacher, teacher, and writer throughout his whole life. At the age of 19, he received a master's degree from the university at Cologne. Soon afterwards, St. Peter met Peter Faber, the first disciple of Ignatius of Loyola, who influenced him so much that he eventually joined the Society of Jesus. St. Peter Canisius founded colleges and seminaries, served as a missionary, cared for the sick or imprisoned, and wrote close to eight volumes of letters — many about St. Cyril of Alexandria and St. Leo the Great. A man blessed with many talents, St. Peter Canisius is a wonderful example of a man who developed his talents to further God's work here on earth.

You might even spend a few less dollars and spend more time with those you love, particularly the one who loves you the most, the Incarnation himself.

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3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT — Meditation —

Why do we believe in Jesus and the Catholic Church? Why should we continue to do so? We've never seen him face-to-face (at least not most of us, I assume). Most of us have never had mystical visions of angels or saints. We live in the same world as our atheist and secularists friends. Why do we believe in Christ if we've never seen him? Early in John's Gospel we hear: "There was a man sent from God, his name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him." The Baptist powerfully announces Jesus. This is a historical fact, and it is also now a *pattern* at work in our lives. John the Baptist stands for the entirety of the old covenant, everything entrusted to the Jewish people. And yet he prophetically opens the door to something entirely new in Jesus, to the revival and fulfillment of God's promises. In every generation, and in every human life, God continues to do this. He has done it through people named Augustine, Francis, Catherine, Theresa, and countless others. In my life, the Baptist's spirit has come through persons named Eric, Paul, Mary, and Ron. I challenge you to name at least three people through whom God has announced the coming of Jesus in your life. Consciously thank God for their testimony. And let's commit ourselves to listening to the spirit of John the Baptist testify again this week so that we might more strongly believe in the light.

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CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION


Article 1 THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM. VII. The Grace of Baptism. IN BRIEF

1279 *The fruit of Baptism, or baptismal grace, is a rich reality that includes forgiveness of original sin and all personal sins, birth into the new life by which man becomes an adoptive son of the Father, a member of Christ and a temple of the Holy Spirit. By this very fact the person baptized is incorporated into the Church, the Body of Christ, and made a sharer in the priesthood of Christ.*

1280 *Baptism imprints on the soul an indelible spiritual sign, the character, which consecrates the baptized person for Christian worship. Because of the character Baptism cannot be repeated (cf. DS 1609 and DS 1624).*

CAPÍTULO IV A MÍ ME LO HICISTEIS POR UNA NUEVA CULTURA DE LA VIDA HUMANA

« *Vosotros sois el pueblo adquirido por Dios para anunciar sus alabanzas* » (cf. 1 P 2, 9): el pueblo de la vida y para la vida.

Somos enviados: estar al servicio de la vida no es para nosotros una vanagloria, sino un deber, que nace de la conciencia de ser el pueblo adquirido por Dios para anunciar sus alabanzas (cf. 1 P 2, 9). En nuestro camino nos guía y sostiene la ley del amor: el amor cuya fuente y modelo es el Hijo de Dios hecho hombre, que « muriendo ha dado la vida al mundo ».102

Somos enviados como pueblo. El compromiso al servicio de la vida obliga a todos y cada uno. Es una responsabilidad propiamente « eclesial », que exige la acción concertada y generosa de todos los miembros y de todas las estructuras de la comunidad cristiana. Sin embargo, la misión comunitaria no elimina ni disminuye la responsabilidad de cada persona, a la cual se dirige el mandato del Señor de « hacerse prójimo » de cada hombre: « Vete y haz tú lo mismo » (Lc 10, 37).

La liturgia de la Palabra comprende "los escritos de los profetas", es decir, el Antiguo Testamento, y "las memorias de los Apóstoles", es decir sus cartas y los Evangelios; después la homilía que exhorta a acoger esta palabra como lo que es verdaderamente, Palabra de Dios (cf 1 Ts 2,13), y a ponerla en práctica; vienen luego las intercesiones por todos los hombres, según la palabra del apóstol: "Ante todo, recomiendo que se hagan plegarias, oraciones, súplicas y acciones de gracias por todos los hombres; por los reyes y por todos los constituidos en autoridad" (1 Tm 2,1-2).
