FEAST OF SAINT AGNES

JANUARY 21

On Jan. 21, the Roman Catholic Church honors the virgin and martyr St. Agnes, who suffered death for her consecration to Christ. Although the details of Agnes' life are mostly unknown, the story of her martyrdom has been passed on with reverence since the fourth century. On the feast day of the young martyr – whose name means “lamb” in Latin – the Pope traditionally blesses lambs, whose wool will be used to make the white pallium worn by archbishops. Born into a wealthy family during the last decade of the third century, Agnes lived in Rome during the last major persecution of the early Church under the Emperor Diocletian. Meanwhile, Agnes had become a young woman of great beauty and charm, drawing the attention of suitors from the first ranks of the Roman aristocracy. But in keeping with the words of Christ and Saint Paul, she had already decided on a life of celibacy for the sake of God's kingdom. To all interested men, she explained that she had already promised herself to a heavenly and unseen spouse. When Agnes refused [to renounce her choice not to marry for the Lord's sake], the judge ordered that she should be sent to a house of prostitution, where the virginity she had offered to God would be violated. Agnes predicted that God would not allow this to occur, and her statement proved true. The executioner gave her one last chance to spare her life, by renouncing her consecration to Christ – but Agnes refused, made a short prayer, and courageously submitted to death. St. Agnes, who died in 304, was venerated as a holy martyr from the fourth century onward. She is mentioned in the Latin Church's most traditional Eucharistic prayer, the Roman Canon.

GIVE UNTIL IT HURTS

One of the characteristics of Everyday Stewardship is to be committed — to persevere daily in a way of life acknowledging that everything belongs to God. I know, I know. Easier said than done. Just ask Zebedee. It's quite an image we get from the Gospel, after all. "So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him." There was Zebedee, about his business, mending nets with his two sons, who were undoubtedly his best workers — they had to have been more dedicated than the hired men, who worked for wages rather than for family. And in an instant off they go, following this strange man. I don't know about you, but if my kids left me on a hot summer day to finish the lawn by myself, I wouldn't be too happy. But Zebedee must have been someone quite special. Perhaps he realized that his sons didn't belong to him — not really. They belonged to God, and from the beginning of time, it had been appointed that they would be among the first disciples of Christ. He passed, he called, they followed, and Zebedee obliged. He simply went back to mending his nets, I imagine. Zebedee already understood what St. Teresa of Calcutta would say millennia later: "Give until it hurts." "You're wasting my time." "I've done so much for her; she owes me this." How often do we think things, and even people and relationships, belong to us? The truth is none of them do. We must be ready, as Zebedee was, to surrender them to God when He comes walking past.

Various Ways in Which Christ is Present

35. All of us realize that there is more than one way in which Christ is present in His Church. We want to go into this very joyful subject, which the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy presented briefly, (30) at somewhat greater length. Christ is present in His Church when she prays, since He is the one who "prays for us and prays in us and to whom we pray: He prays for us as our priest, He prays in us as our head, He is prayed to by us as our God" (31); and He is the one who has promised, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, I am there in the midst of them." (32) He is present in the Church as she performs her works of mercy, not just because whatever good we do to one of His least brethren we do to Christ Himself, (33) but also because Christ is the one who performs these works through the Church and who continually helps men with His divine love. He is present in the Church as she moves along on her pilgrimage with a longing to reach the portals of eternal life, for He is the one who dwells in our hearts through faith, (34) and who instills charity in them through the Holy Spirit whom He gives to us. I. Confirmation in the Economy of Salvation

1287 This fullness of the Spirit was not to remain uniquely the Messiah's, but was to be communicated to the whole messianic people.⁹³ On several occasions Christ promised this outpouring of the Spirit,⁹⁴ a promise which he fulfilled first on Easter Sunday and then more strikingly at Pentecost.⁹⁵ Filled with the Holy Spirit the apostles began to proclaim "the mighty works of God," and Peter declared this outpouring of the Spirit to be the sign of the messianic age.⁹⁶ Those who believed in the apostolic preaching and were baptized received the gift of the Holy Spirit in their turn.⁹⁷



Fiesta de Santa Inés

Virgen y Mártir

21 de Enero, 2024

[Santa Inés] era de la noble familia romana Clodia. Nació cerca del año 290. Recibió muy buena educación cristiana y se consagró a Cristo con voto de virginidad. Volviendo un día del colegio, la niña se encontró con el hijo del alcalde de Roma, el cual se enamoró de ella y le prometió grandes regalos a cambio de la promesa de matrimonio. Ella respondió: "He sido solicitada por otro Amante. Yo amo a Cristo. Seré la esposa de Aquel cuya Madre es Virgen; lo amaré y seguiré siendo casta". El hijo recurre a su padre, el alcalde. Este la hace apresar. La amenazan con las llamas si no reniega de su religión pero no teme a las llamas. Entonces la condenan a morir degollada. Sus padres recogen el cadáver. La sepultan en el sepulcro paterno. Pocos días después su hermana Emerenciana cae martirizada a pedradas por estar rezando junto al sepulcro. "Con mínimas fuerzas superó grandes peligros", dice San Dámaso en su epitafio. Todos los historiadores coinciden en proclamarla mártir de la virginidad. Es patrona de las jóvenes que desean conservar la pureza. Cada año, el 21 de enero, día de Santa Inés, se bendicen los corderos con cuya lana se tejen los "palios", o sea el distintivo de los arzobispos. En este tiempo de materialismo sea ella un modelo de castidad para la juventud. La liturgia la presenta como modelo de los éxitos que logra alcanzar una persona cuando tiene una gran fe. La fe en Dios y en la eternidad lleva al heroísmo.

CAPÍTULO IV A MÍ ME LO HICISTEIS POR UNA NUEVA CULTURA DE LA VIDA HUMANA

¿Con qué palabra, pensamiento o impulso del espíritu se podrá exaltar la sobreabundancia de esta gracia? El hombre sobrepasa su naturaleza: de mortal se hace inmortal, de perecedero imperecedero, de efímero eterno, de hombre se Precisamente el anuncio de Jesús es anuncio de la vida. En efecto, El es « la Palabra de vida » (1 Jn 1, 1). En El « la vida se manifestó » (1 Jn 1, 2); más aún, él mismo es « la vida eterna, que estaba vuelta hacia el Padre y que se nos manifestó » (ivi). Esta misma vida, gracias al don del Espíritu, ha sido comunicada al hombre. La vida terrena de cada uno, ordenada a la vida en plenitud, a la « vida eterna », adquiere también pleno sentido.

Iluminados por este Evangelio de la vida, sentimos la necesidad de proclamarlo y testimoniarlo por la novedad sorprendente que lo caracteriza. Este Evangelio, al identificarse con el mismo Jesús, portador de toda novedad¹⁰³ y vencedor de la « vejez » causada por el pecado y que lleva a la muerte,¹⁰⁴ supera toda expectativa del hombre y descubre la sublime altura a la que, por gracia, es elevada la dignidad de la persona. Así la contempla san Gregorio de Nisa: « El hombre que, entre los seres, no cuenta nada, que es polvo, hierba, vanidad, cuando es adoptado por el Dios del universo como hijo, llega a ser familiar de este Ser, cuya excelencia y grandeza nadie puede ver, escuchar y comprender. hace dios ». ¹⁰⁵
