



On Jan. 21, the Catholic Church honors St. Agnes— whose name means “lamb” in Latin. Born into a wealthy family, Agnes lived in Rome during under the Emperor Diocletian. To all interested men, she explained that she had promised herself to a heavenly and unseen spouse. Some men reported her to the state as a believer in Christ. She was brought before a pagan altar and asked to make an act of worship in accordance with the Roman state religion. When Agnes refused, the judge ordered that she should be sent to a house of prostitution. The first man to approach her was struck blind by a sudden flash of light. One of the men lobbied the judge for her execution. The executioner gave her one last chance to spare her life, but Agnes refused and courageously submitted to death. St. Agnes, who died in 304, was venerated as a holy martyr. She is mentioned in the Latin Church's most traditional Eucharistic prayer, the Roman Canon.

ENCYCICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH



CHAPTER THREE: THE APOSTOLICITY OF THE EUCHARIST AND OF THE CHURCH

The centrality of the Eucharist in the life and ministry of priests is the basis of its centrality in the *pastoral promotion of priestly vocations*. It is in the Eucharist that prayer for vocations is most closely united to the prayer of Christ the Eternal High Priest. At the same time the diligence of priests in carrying out their Eucharistic ministry, together with the conscious, active and fruitful participation of the faithful in the Eucharist, provides young men with a powerful example and incentive for responding generously to God's call. Often it is the example of a priest's fervent pastoral charity which the Lord uses to sow and to bring to fruition in a young man's heart the seed of a priestly calling.

All of this shows how distressing and irregular is the situation of a Christian community which, despite having sufficient numbers and variety of faithful to form a parish, does not have a priest to lead it. Parishes are communities of the baptized who express and affirm their identity above all through the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice. But this requires the presence of a presbyter, who alone is qualified to offer the Eucharist *in persona Christi*. When a community lacks a priest, attempts are rightly made somehow to remedy the situation so that it can continue its Sunday celebrations, and those religious and laity who lead their brothers and sisters in prayer exercise in a praiseworthy way the common priesthood of all the faithful based on the grace of Baptism. But such solutions must be considered merely temporary, while the community awaits a priest.

DROP YOUR NETS AND BE FREE

There are times I wish I had no obligations. It would be great to take my wife's hand, hop in the car, and drive into the sunset. Where we were going would not matter as much as the fact that we would have nowhere we had to be. There would be nothing we had to do. No bills. No commitments. No problems. Freedom! Life doesn't work like that, however. When Jesus came along and asked some fishermen to drop their nets and follow him, they did just that. Wow! In some ways, they experienced true freedom. That is what Jesus offers all of us. Yet, true freedom looks quite different than my dream scenario. In living in the true freedom that Jesus offers, there are things we must do and places we must go. That is because freedom only exists in following God's will, not our own. We are called to be and called to give ourselves completely to God without reservations. We always have the free will to not respond to His call, but we will find that a negative answer may complicate our lives even further. God's path for us calls on us to give freely of what we have been given. Saying no to that call means we carry the weight of those gifts. We were never meant to keep them. The path of God's will may seem long and winding, but it is the one that leads us into that sunset. It is the way to true freedom.

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CHASTISEMENT VS. PUNISHMENT

Question:

What is the difference between a chastisement and a punishment?

Answer:

The distinction between chastisement and punishment is, in many ways, a subtle one, but which is still relevant in our Catholic tradition. First, chastisement is a concept that is grounded in Sacred Scripture. Here, we see chastisement as a response by God to people's actions that is intended to teach a lesson. As St. John Paul II observed, "chastisement appears to be ... a kind of divine pedagogy, in which the last word is reserved to mercy: He scourges and then shows mercy, casts down to the depths of the nether world, and he brings up from the great abyss" (Tobit 13:2). The idea here is that in order to capture our attention or to highlight how we have not lived out our covenant-relationship with God as we should, there are times when God uses events in life to draw us back to the quality of relationship or faith that we should have. The concept of punishment, however, has a different sense. The Catechism of the Church observes that punishment is the consequence of a damaging action that "has the primary aim of redressing the disorder" and to protect the community and the common good from further damage or harm (see no. 2266). Although we always hope that someone who is being punished for a crime or some other harmful action will learn from their actions, punishment isn't necessarily intended to teach a lesson in the same way that a chastisement is. Ultimately, how we make the distinction between chastisement and punishment is a matter of discernment. As with almost everything in life, our experiences can be an opportunity for grace depending on how open we are to recognizing the movement of God's Spirit within them.

Biografía de Santa Inés

Llegado el momento del martirio. Reza. Inclina la cabeza. Hubiera visto temblar el verdugo lleno de miedo, como si fuera él quien estuviera condenado a muerte. Su mano tiembla. Palidece ante el horror que va a ejecutar, en tanto que la jovencita mira sin temor la llegada de su propia muerte. H aquí dos triunfos a un mismo tiempo para una misma niña: la pureza y el martirio". Era de la noble familia romana Clodia. Nació cerca del año 290. Recibió muy buena educación cristiana y se consagró a Cristo con voto de virginidad. Volviendo un día del colegio, la niña se encontró con el hijo del alcalde de Roma, el cual se enamoró de ella y le prometió grandes regalos a cambio de la promesa de matrimonio. Ella respondió: "He sido solicitada por otro Amante. Yo amo a Cristo. Seré la esposa de Aquel cuya Madre es Virgen; lo amaré y seguiré siendo casta". El hijo recurre a su padre, el alcalde. Este la hace apresar. La amenazan con las llamas si no reniega de su religión pero no teme a las llamas. Entonces la condenan a morir degollada. Sus padres recogen el cadáver. La sepultan en el sepulcro paterno. Pocos días después su hermana Emerenciana cae martirizada a pedradas por estar rezando junto al sepulcro. "Con mínimas fuerzas superó grandes peligros", dice San Dámaso en su epitafio. Todos los historiadores coinciden en proclamarla mártir de la virginidad. Es patrona de las jóvenes que desean conservar la pureza. Cada año, el 21 de enero, día de Santa Inés, se bendicen los corderos con cuya lana se tejen los "palios", o sea el distintivo de los arzobispos. En este tiempo de materialismo sea ella un modelo de castidad para la juventud. La liturgia la presenta como modelo de los éxitos que logra alcanzar una persona cuando tiene una gran fe. La fe en Dios y en la eternidad lleva al heroísmo.

[Yendo camino a Damasco, a Saulo] de repente le rodeó una luz venida del cielo; cayó en tierra y oyó una voz que le decía: "Saulo, Saulo, ¿Por qué me persigues?". El respondió: ¿Quién eres tú Señor? Y oyó que le decían: "Yo soy Jesús a quien tú persigues. Pero ahora levántate; entra en la ciudad, y allí se te dirá lo que tendrás que hacer". Había en Damasco un discípulo llamado Ananías. El Señor le dijo "Levántate. Vete a la calle Recta y pregunta en la casa de Judas por uno de Tarso que se llama Saulo; coloca [tus] manos sobre [su] cabeza y devuelvele la vista. Fue Ananías. Entró en la casa. Le colocó sus manos sobre la cabeza y le dijo: "Hermano Saulo: me ha enviado a ti el Señor Jesús, el que se te apareció en el camino por donde venías. Y me ha enviado para que recobres la vista y seas lleno del Espíritu Santo". Al instante se le cayeron de los ojos unas como escamas y recobró la vista. Se levantó y fue bautizado. Tomó alimento y recobró las fuerzas. Saulo se cambió el nombre por el de Pablo. Las Iglesias de Judea no me conocían pero decían: "El que antes nos perseguía, ahora anuncia la buena noticia de la fe, que antes quería destruir". (Gal 1:23).

Capítulo III: No Matarás la Ley Santa de Dios

Mi embrión tus ojos lo veían » (Sal 139 138, 16): el delito abominable del aborto

62. El Magisterio pontificio más reciente ha reafirmado con gran vigor esta doctrina común. En particular, Pío XI en la Encíclica *Casti connubii* rechazó las pretendidas justificaciones del aborto;⁶⁵ Pío XII excluyó todo aborto directo, o sea, todo acto que tienda directamente a destruir la vida humana aún no nacida, « tanto si tal destrucción se entiende como fin o sólo como medio para el fin »;⁶⁶ Juan XXIII reafirmó que la vida humana es sagrada, porque « desde que aflora, ella implica directamente la acción creadora de Dios ».⁶⁷ El Concilio Vaticano II, como ya he recordado, condenó con gran severidad el aborto: « se ha de proteger la vida con el máximo cuidado desde la concepción; tanto el aborto como el infanticidio son crímenes nefastos ».⁶⁸

La disciplina canónica de la Iglesia, desde los primeros siglos, ha castigado con sanciones penales a quienes se manchaban con la culpa del aborto y esta praxis, con penas más o menos graves, ha sido ratificada en los diversos períodos históricos. El Código de Derecho Canónico de 1917 establecía para el aborto la pena de excomunión.⁶⁹ También la nueva legislación canónica se sitúa en esta dirección cuando sanciona que « quien procura el aborto, si éste se produce, incurre en excomunión latae sententiae »,⁷⁰ es decir, automática. La excomunión afecta a todos los que cometen este delito conociendo la pena, incluidos también aquellos cómplices sin cuya cooperación el delito no se hubiera producido:⁷¹ con esta reiterada sanción, la Iglesia señala este delito como uno de los más graves y peligrosos, alejando así a quien lo comete a buscar solícitamente el camino de la conversión. En efecto, en la Iglesia la pena de excomunión tiene como fin hacer plenamente conscientes de la gravedad de un cierto pecado y favorecer, por tanto, una adecuada conversión y penitencia.

CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATÓLICA CAPÍTULO SEGUNDO LOS SACRAMENTOS DE CURACIÓN ART. 4 EL SACRAMENTO DE LA PENITENCIA Y DE LA RECONCILIACIÓN

X. La celebración del sacramento de la Penitencia

1484 "La confesión individual e íntegra y la absolución continúan siendo el único modo ordinario para que los fieles se reconcilien con Dios y la Iglesia, a no ser que una imposibilidad física o moral excuse de este modo de confesión" (*Ritual de la Penitencia*, Prenotandos 31). Y esto se establece así por razones profundas. Cristo actúa en cada uno de los sacramentos. Se dirige personalmente a cada uno de los pecadores: "Hijo, tus pecados están perdonados" (*Mc 2,5*); es el médico que se inclina sobre cada uno de los enfermos que tienen necesidad de él (cf *Mc 2,17*) para curarlos; los restaura y los devuelve a la comunión fraterna. Por tanto, la confesión personal es la forma más significativa de la reconciliación con Dios y con la Iglesia.
