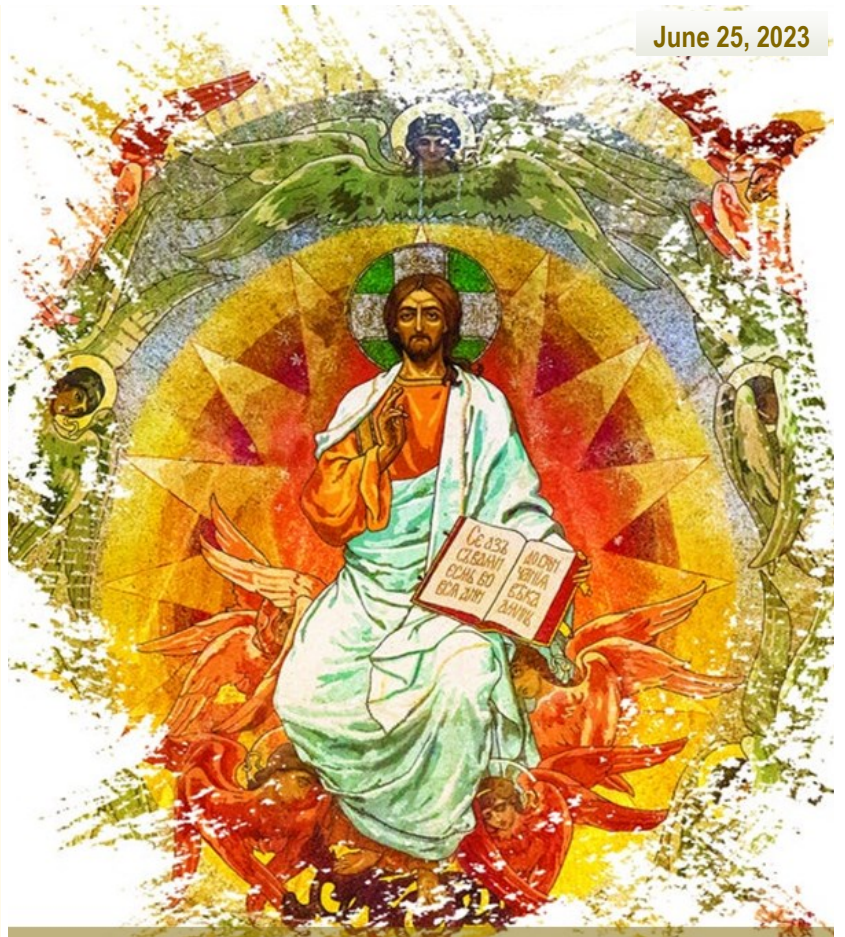

Can you imagine sitting at the feast of the Apostles? St. Irenaeus was born in Asia Minor -- now Turkey -- and was tutored in Christianity by St. Polycarp, himself a disciple of St. John the Evangelist. Irenaeus caught the missionary zeal and became a priest sent to Gaul (modern day France). Following a persecution by the pagan Roman emperor Marcus Aurelius, Irenaeus replaced the martyred bishop in the region. His trials were not over, however. The heretical sect of Gnosticism spread to Gaul. Gnostics proclaimed a secret, spiritual knowledge available only to a few. Irenaeus researched the Gnostic texts and exposed the falsehoods they taught, such as denying the divinity of Christ. His book *Against Heresies* is still being published today, over 1800 years after his death. May St. Irenaeus intercede for our own quests for greater understanding!

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ENCYCLICAL LETTER ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH



CHAPTER SIX: AT THE SCHOOL OF MARY, "WOMAN OF THE EUCHARIST"

54. *Mysterium fidei!* If the Eucharist is a mystery of faith which so greatly transcends our understanding as to call for sheer abandonment to the word of God, then there can be no one like Mary to act as our support and guide in acquiring this disposition. In repeating what Christ did at the Last Supper in obedience to his command: "Do this in memory of me!", we also accept Mary's invitation to obey him without hesitation: "Do whatever he tells you" (Jn 2:5). With the same maternal concern which she showed at the wedding feast of Cana, Mary seems to say to us: "Do not waver; trust in the words of my Son. If he was able to change water into wine, he can also turn bread and wine into his body and blood, and through this mystery bestow on believers the living memorial of his passover, thus becoming the 'bread of life'".

55. In a certain sense Mary lived her Eucharistic faith even before the institution of the Eucharist, by the very fact that she offered her virginal womb for the Incarnation of God's Word. The Eucharist, while commemorating the passion and resurrection, is also in continuity with the incarnation. At the Annunciation Mary conceived the Son of God in the physical reality of his body and blood, thus anticipating within herself what to some degree happens sacramentally in every believer who receives, under the signs of bread and wine, the Lord's body and blood.

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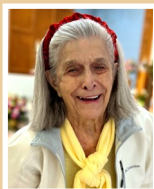

II. EL NOMBRE DE ESTE SACRAMENTO

Banquete del Señor (cf 1 Co 11,20) porque se trata de la Cena que el Señor celebró con sus discípulos la víspera de su pasión y de la anticipación del banquete de bodas del Cordero (cf Ap 19,9) en la Jerusalén celestial.

Fracción del pan porque este rito, propio del banquete judío, fue utilizado por Jesús cuando bendecía y distribuía el pan como cabeza de familia (cf Mt 14,19; 15,36; Mc 8,6.19), sobre todo en la última Cena (cf Mt 26,26; 1 Co 11,24). En este gesto los discípulos lo reconocerán después de su resurrección (Lc 24,13-35), y con esta expresión los primeros cristianos designaron sus asambleas eucarísticas (cf Hch 2,42.46; 20,7.11). Con él se quiere significar que todos los que comen de este único pan, partido, que es Cristo, entran en comunión con él y forman un solo cuerpo en él (cf 1 Co 10,16-17).

« Hay que obedecer a Dios antes que a los hombres »
(Hch 5, 29): ley civil y ley moral

Por consiguiente, se perciben dos tendencias diametralmente opuestas en apariencia. Por un lado, los individuos reivindican para sí la autonomía moral más completa de elección y piden que el Estado no asuma ni imponga ninguna concepción ética, sino que trate de garantizar el espacio más amplio posible para la libertad de cada uno, con el único límite externo de no restringir el espacio de autonomía al que los demás ciudadanos también tienen derecho. Por otro lado, se considera que, en el ejercicio de las funciones públicas y profesionales, el respeto de la libertad de elección de los demás obliga a cada uno a prescindir de sus propias convicciones para ponerse al servicio de cualquier petición de los ciudadanos, que las leyes reconocen y tutelan, aceptando como único criterio moral para el ejercicio de las propias funciones lo establecido por las mismas leyes. De este modo, la responsabilidad de la persona se delega a la ley civil, abdicando de la propia conciencia moral al menos en el ámbito de la acción pública.
