Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany. At court it was easy to be distracted by luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest. Norbert became an itinerant preacher. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament. Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor. Failing in health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he died.

CHAPTER FIVE: THE DIGNITY OF THE EUCHARISTIC CELEBRATION

It is necessary, however, that this important work of adaptation be carried out with a constant awareness of the ineffable mystery against which every generation is called to measure itself. The “treasure” is too important and precious to risk impoverishment or compromise through forms of experimentation or practices introduced without a careful review on the part of the competent ecclesiastical authorities. Furthermore, the centrality of the Eucharistic mystery demands that any such review must be undertaken in close association with the Holy See. As I wrote in my Post- Synodal Apostolic Exhortation *Ecclesia in Asia*, “such cooperation is essential because the Sacred Liturgy expresses and celebrates the one faith professed by all and, being the heritage of the whole Church, cannot be determined by local Churches in isolation from the universal Church”.¹⁰¹

52. All of this makes clear the great responsibility which belongs to priests in particular for the celebration of the Eucharist. It is their responsibility to preside at the Eucharist in persona Christi and to provide a witness to and a service of communion not only for the community directly taking part in the celebration, but also for the universal Church, which is a part of every Eucharist. It must be lamented that, especially in the years following the post-conciliar liturgical reform, as a result of a misguided sense of creativity and adaptation there have been a number of abuses which have been a source of suffering for many. A certain reaction against “formalism” has led some, especially in certain regions, to consider the “forms” chosen by the Church's great liturgical tradition and her Magisterium as non-binding and to introduce unauthorized innovations which are often completely inappropriate.

Article 2 LITURGICAL DIVERSITY AND THE UNITY OF THE MYSTERY

The mystagogy of the celebration

1235 The sign of the cross, on the threshold of the celebration, marks with the imprint of Christ the one who is going to belong to him and signifies the grace of the redemption Christ won for us by his cross.

1236 The proclamation of the Word of God enlightens the candidates and the assembly with the revealed truth and elicits the response of faith, which is inseparable from Baptism. Indeed Baptism is "the sacrament of faith" in a particular way, since it is the sacramental entry into the life of faith.

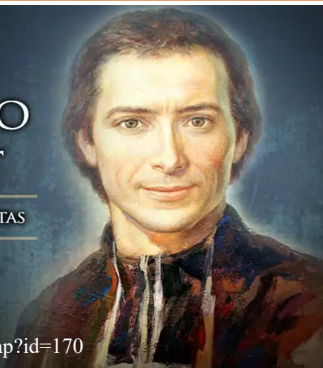

Carta Encíclica *Evangelium Vitae* del Sumo Pontífice Juan Pablo II a los Obispos a los Sacerdotes y Diáconos a los Religiosos a los Fieles Laicos y a todas las personas de buena voluntad sobre el valor y el carácter inviolable de la vida humana.



« *Hay que obedecer a Dios antes que a los hombres* »
(Hch 5, 29): *ley civil y ley moral*

68. Una de las características propias de los atentados actuales contra la vida humana —como ya se ha dicho— consiste en la tendencia a exigir su legitimación jurídica, como si fuesen derechos que el Estado, al menos en ciertas condiciones, debe reconocer a los ciudadanos y, por consiguiente, la tendencia a pretender su realización con la asistencia segura y gratuita de médicos y agentes sanitarios.

No pocas veces se considera que la vida de quien aún no ha nacido o está gravemente debilitado es un bien sólo relativo: según una lógica proporcionalista o de puro cálculo, deberá ser cotejada y sopesada con otros bienes. Y se piensa también que solamente quien se encuentra en esa situación concreta y está personalmente afectado puede hacer una ponderación justa de los bienes en juego; en consecuencia, sólo él podría juzgar la moralidad de su decisión. El Estado, por tanto, en interés de la convivencia civil y de la armonía social, debería respetar esta decisión, llegando incluso a admitir el aborto y la eutanasia.
