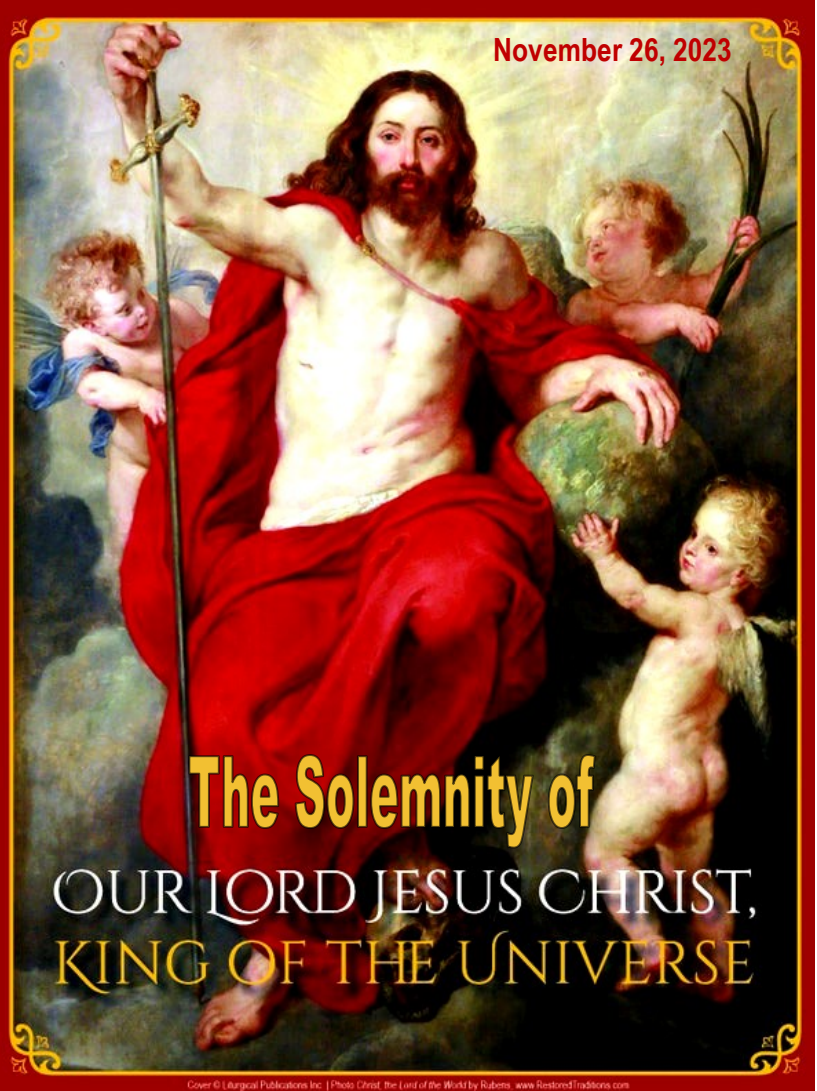

Proper Wording of Great Importance

24. And so the rule of language which the Church has established through the long labor of centuries, with the help of the Holy Spirit, and which she has confirmed with the authority of the Councils, and which has more than once been the watchword and banner of orthodox faith, is to be religiously preserved, and no one may presume to change it at his own pleasure or under the pretext of new knowledge. Who would ever tolerate that the dogmatic formulas used by the ecumenical councils for the mysteries of the Holy Trinity and the Incarnation be judged as no longer appropriate for men of our times, and let others be rashly substituted for them? In the same way, it cannot be tolerated that any individual should on his own authority take something away from the formulas which were used by the Council of Trent to propose the Eucharistic Mystery for our belief. These formulas—like the others that the Church used to propose the dogmas of faith—express concepts that are not tied to a certain specific form of human culture, or to a certain level of scientific progress, or to one or another theological school. Instead they set forth what the human mind grasps of reality through necessary and universal experience and what it expresses in apt and exact words, whether it be in ordinary or more refined language. For this reason, these formulas are adapted to all men of all times and all places.

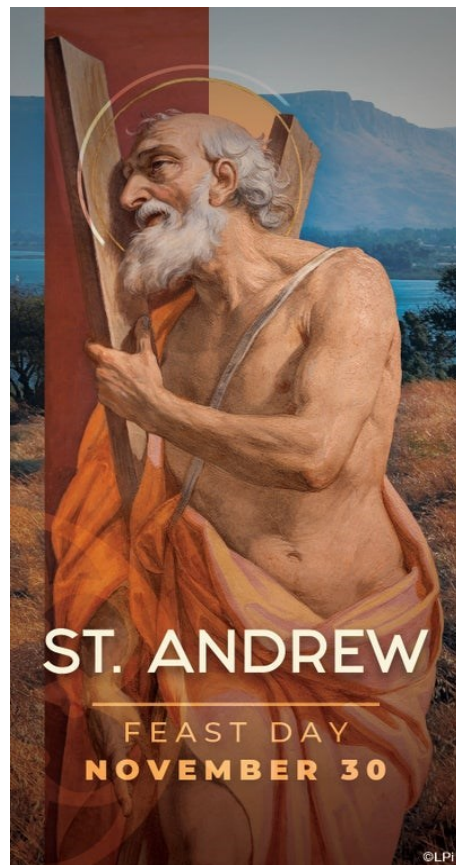

Saint Andrew was a fisherman in Galilee, along with his brother, Peter, when they were called by Jesus to leave their boat and become fishers of men. John's Gospel also places him as a follower of John the Baptist before he came to be one of Jesus' twelve Disciples.

According to Christian tradition Saint Andrew, like many of his fellow Disciples, went out into Greece and Turkey to preach the Good News. A 4th century account of the saint's life tells of his martyrdom by crucifixion in Patras. Medieval accounts describe the cross used as X-shaped because Andrew said he was not worthy to die on the same style of cross as Jesus.

Today relics of St. Andrew which had been held by the Vatican are now at a shrine in Patras.

THE KING COMES HOLDING A MIRROR

Of all the many wonderful, thorough examinations of conscience I have come across, the one I normally utilize is very simple, and perfectly suited to someone like me who is not capable of profound thought at the end of the day. It's just one very short question: Which Christs did I not recognize today? The King always comes in disguise, and I know I miss him in so many ways every single day. I miss him in people ignored or dismissed. I miss him in opportunities avoided and in moments that could have turned into prayer but instead turned into phone-scrolling. I miss him when he is right in front of me, holding up a mirror and calling my name, begging for my conversion of heart. The Christian life calls us to constant self-scrutiny. It's not a comfortable life, always thinking about what you could do better, but the Lord shepherds us rightly. His pastures have nothing to offer those who are perfect and strong. He has gone in search of the lost. He has reclaimed those who have strayed, healed those who were injured, given rest to those who were weary. God's mercy does not dismiss our sins, as if they never existed and were not important. God's mercy absolves our sins. It sets us free from them. But to be truly free, you have to understand the tyranny of what once enslaved you. *"And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats."* — Matthew 25:32

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OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE — Meditation —

In May 2023, for the first time in almost three quarters of a century, a monarch was crowned in England. A few days later a friend of mine scoffed, "What a waste of time and energy! What is the point of a king?" I'm a proud American who wants neither theocracy nor monarchical restoration. I like our democratic republic. But the coronation of King Charles reminded me of something needed in every person and community: confidence in the future. The king's most basic role is to symbolize the unity of the nation. In England, the parliament members handle many of the practical duties of governance. But the king or queen can do what they cannot: embody in a single person the reality and future of a whole nation. Kingship isn't primarily about the power of one person or family. It's about the enduring identity and unity of the whole. To say Christ is our King is to say we exist as a people. We are one in him. We are, and we will be as long as he is. And since he will be our risen king forever, together we have a future filled with hope. Even the best countries will finally fall. But Christ and his Church will endure forever. What good news! It's not a waste of time to crown a king. Let's be sure to crown the right one — the one whose kingdom never ends.

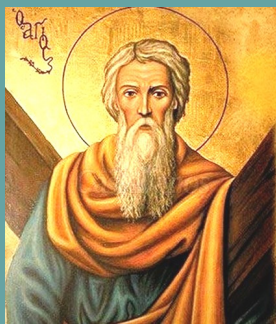
MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mt 25, 31-46

Este domingo, celebramos la Solemnidad de Jesucristo Rey del Universo. Hoy es el último domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, dentro de ocho días daremos comienzo al Tiempo de Adviento que nos prepara para la Navidad. Las lecturas nos hablan del Pastor supremo que es Jesucristo, que reunirá a las ovejas y a los cabritos para el juicio final. Todos, sin excepción, tendremos un examen. Seremos examinados en el amor y [las obras de caridad que hemos hecho] en nuestra vida. Así que, no dudemos en hacer el bien siempre.

El Papa Francisco lo explica de la siguiente manera:
“Seremos juzgados por el amor. El juicio será por el amor. No por el sentimiento, no: por las obras, por la compasión que se hace cercanía y ayuda solícita. ¿Yo me acerco a Jesús presente en la persona de los enfermos, de los pobres, de los que sufren, de los presos, de los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia? ¿Me acerco a Jesús presente allí? Esta es la pregunta de hoy (11-22-2020). Pero, ¿Cómo lograr hacer el bien ante la guerra y violencia [en que vivimos]? ¿Cómo hacerlo en la familia dividida, en las dificultades? [Talvez en] no perdiendo la esperanza y [cooperando] siempre con nuestro granito de arena que, aunque pequeño, será grande si va lleno de caridad y amor. Recordemos que estamos en este mundo para hacer el bien. Hoy se nos dice que Cristo vendrá con gloria para juzgar a vivos y muertos y su reino no tendrá fin. ¡Confíemos [entonces, y no perdamos la] esperanza!

IV LA CELEBRACIÓN LITÚRGICA DE LA EUCARISTÍA

LA MISA DE TODOS LOS SIGLOS

La liturgia de la Eucaristía se desarrolla conforme a una estructura fundamental que se ha conservado a través de los siglos hasta nosotros. Comprende dos grandes momentos que forman una unidad básica:

- la reunión, *la liturgia de la Palabra*, con las lecturas, la homilía y la oración universal;
- *la liturgia eucarística*, con la presentación del pan y del vino, la acción de gracias consecratoria y la comunión.

Liturgia de la Palabra y Liturgia eucarística constituyen juntas "un solo acto de culto" (SC 56); en efecto, la mesa preparada para nosotros en la Eucaristía es a la vez la de la Palabra de Dios y la del Cuerpo del Señor (cf. DV 21).

CAPÍTULO IV

78. La Iglesia ha recibido el Evangelio como anuncio y fuente de gozo y salvación. Lo ha recibido como don de Jesús, enviado del Padre « para anunciar a los pobres la Buena Nueva » (Lc 4, 18). Lo ha recibido a través de los Apóstoles, enviados por El a todo el mundo (cf. Mc 16, 15; Mt 28, 19-20). La Iglesia, nacida de esta acción evangelizadora, siente resonar en sí misma cada día la exclamación del Apóstol: « ¡Ay de mí si no predicara el Evangelio! » (1 Cor 9, 16). En efecto, « evangelizar —como escribía Pablo VI— constituye la dicha y vocación propia de la Iglesia, su identidad más profunda. Ella existe para evangelizar ».¹⁰¹
