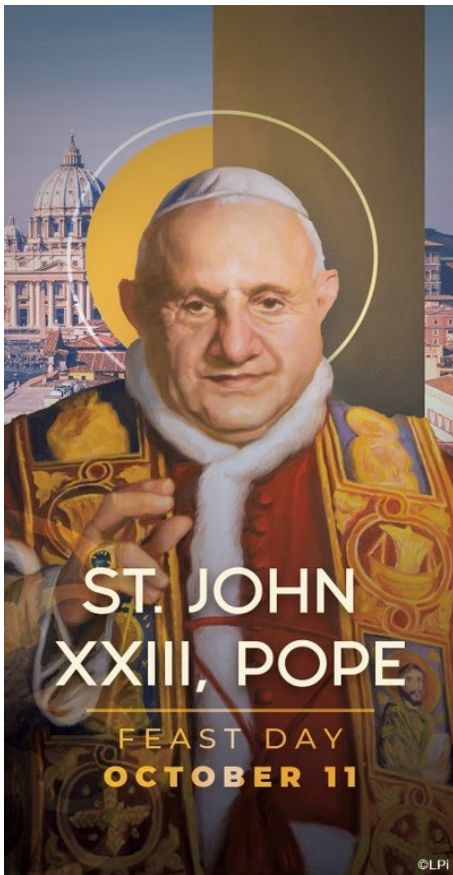

Saint John XXIII was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli on November 25, 1881 in Italy. He was ordained in 1904. During World War I he served as a chaplain for the army. In '25 he served as a Vatican diplomat. From '35 through World War II he saved thousands of Jewish people. In '44 he was named papal nuncio to France. He was named cardinal and appointed patriarch of Venice in '53. Angelo was elected Pope in '58. His papacy was short, but full of action. He transformed the Vatican, calling for openness and the setting aside of politics. He called the Second Vatican Council in '62. His efforts changed the face of the Catholic Church. Saint John XXIII's works of reconciliation and peacemaking made him beloved not only to Catholics but to people around the world. He died on June 3, '63. He was beatified in 2000 by St. John Paul II, and canonized by Pope Francis in 2014.

False and Disturbing Opinions

11. To give an example of what We are talking about, it is not permissible to extol the so-called "community" Mass in such a way as to detract from Masses that are celebrated privately; or to concentrate on the notion of sacramental sign as if the symbolism—which no one will deny is certainly present in the Most Blessed Eucharist—fully expressed and exhausted the manner of Christ's presence in this Sacrament; or to discuss the mystery of transubstantiation without mentioning what the Council of Trent had to say about the marvelous conversion of the whole substance of the bread into the Body and the whole substance of the wine into the Blood of Christ, as if they involve nothing more than "transignification," or "transfinalization" as they call it; or, finally, to propose and act upon the opinion that Christ Our Lord is no longer present in the consecrated Hosts that remain after the celebration of the sacrifice of the Mass has been completed.

12. Everyone can see that the spread of these and similar opinions does great harm to belief in and devotion to the Eucharist.

THE GIFT THAT GIVES BACK

It never ceases to amaze me how often I fall into the trap and end up grumbling about the greatest gifts in my life. A husband, children, a life that is full almost to bursting: these are things for which I once begged God. These are the jewels in the crown of my life. Oh, but the children need care. And a husband, well, that relationship is a lot of work, isn't it? A full life can leave you awfully tired at the end of the day. I would imagine it's the same for everyone, no matter your life circumstances or vocation. Your greatest blessings are also those things that require much of you. The biggest jewels make the crown heavy. But if we had any of these gifts without the effort it takes to maintain them, would they be half as sweet? In this same way, the work of the vineyard is opened to us through baptism; we are given the chance to produce fruit for the kingdom. It's a gift. But just like with any gift worth having, it requires effort. Upkeep. Work. It requires that we give in return. And it's the giving that somehow, mystically, transforms us. It's the giving that turns into the gift itself. "...the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

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27TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — Meditation —

Jesus' parables are much stranger than most people realize. This week is an attention-getting example. He tells the religious leaders a parable about a completely absurd situation. Blood-thirsty and insane tenants violently abuse and kill the servants of their landlord. In explicable, the owner keeps sending them more victims of increasing value — up to and including his own son. Weird. Usually, we hear this parable and assume it's an allegory: Jesus is the murdered son, the servants the prophets, etc. Fair enough. But notice — and here is where the weirdness deepens — Jesus seems to disagree with the Pharisees' interpretation that the landowner should and will punish the inheritance-obsessed murderers. So, is Jesus praising the psychotic and greedy murderers?! You can imagine the furrowed brows and deriding laughter as the scoffing crowd shuffles away. If we stay with this tough parable, perhaps this truth emerges: God wants us to have an over-the-top obsession with an undeserved inheritance. The parable's violence gets our attention because it highlights the crazy goodness of the landowner. Jesus reveals that God is not merely in the business of rewarding the good and punishing the bad. This week let's seek God's kingdom with a passionate confidence in God's desire to give the good things we don't deserve.

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CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION

Article 1 THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

VI. The Necessity of Baptism

1261 As regards children who have died without Baptism, the Church can only entrust them to the mercy of God, as she does in her funeral rites for them. Indeed, the great mercy of God who desires that all men should be saved, and Jesus' tenderness toward children which caused him to say: "Let the children come to me, do not hinder them,"⁶³ allow us to hope that there is a way of salvation for children who have died without Baptism. All the more urgent is the Church's call not to prevent little children coming to Christ through the gift of holy Baptism.

VII. The Grace of Baptism

1262 The different effects of Baptism are signified by the perceptible elements of the sacramental rite. Immersion in water symbolizes not only death and purification, but also regeneration and renewal. Thus the two principal effects are purification from sins and new birth in the Holy Spirit.⁶⁴

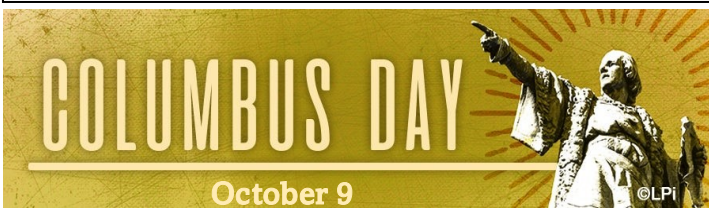

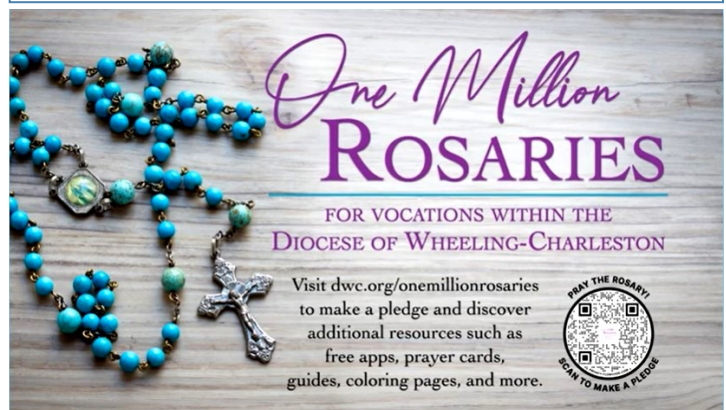

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Mt 21, 33-43

En este domingo, damos gracias a Dios por su fidelidad y paciencia con nosotros. [En el Evangelio de hoy reflexionamos sobre] la viña y los frutos que hemos dado. El profeta Isaías [en la primera lectura le pregunta a su pueblo] “¿Qué más pude hacer por mi viña, que yo no lo hiciera? ¿Por qué cuando yo esperaba que diera uvas buenas, las dio agrias?” [Lo que para nosotros significaría si estamos haciendo el bien o estamos a favor de la injusticia].

Oremos por la Paz en Ucrania

Carta Encíclica Evangelium Vitae del Sumo Pontífice Juan Pablo II a los Obispos, a los Sacerdotes y Diáconos, a los Religiosos, a los Fieles Laicos y a todas las personas de buena voluntad sobre el valor y el carácter inviolable de la vida humana.

El rechazo a participar en la ejecución de una injusticia no sólo es un deber moral, sino también un derecho humano fundamental. Si no fuera así, se obligaría a la persona humana a realizar una acción intrínsecamente incompatible con su dignidad y, de este modo, su misma libertad, cuyo sentido y fin auténticos residen en su orientación a la verdad y al bien, quedaría radicalmente comprometida. Se trata, por tanto, de un derecho esencial que, como tal, debería estar previsto y protegido por la misma ley civil. En este sentido, la posibilidad de rechazar la participación en la fase consultiva, preparatoria y ejecutiva de semejantes actos contra la vida debería asegurarse a los médicos, a los agentes sanitarios y a los responsables de las instituciones hospitalarias, de las clínicas y casas de salud. Quien recurre a la objeción de conciencia debe estar a salvo no sólo de sanciones penales, sino también de cualquier daño en el plano legal, disciplinar, económico y profesional.
